INTERVIEW WITH DON SHY

He was amazed at his time. He figured he had run a 7.2 or 7.3. He wishes he could break the habit of "running through" the hurdles. It's a hangover from football. He hit four of the five barriers, clearing only one. He feels that 7-flat or 6.9 is his tops in view of his less than perfect start. He is pointing now for the National Indoors in March.

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TONIGHT'S ATTENDANCE is 11,781----the largest indoor track crowd on the Pacific Coast This season. The meet was a complete sell out at 7:05 --25 minutes before the first event. More than 2000 fans were turned away, some already in ticket lines and others as they came into the parking lot.

INTERVIEW WITH NEAL STEINHILAUER

He felt a letdown after last week's performance in Albuquerque. At this time of season he is not in shape to compete two weeks in a row. He had a 3 week rest before his record breaking performance in Albuquerque of 67-10. He also thinks he can compete now with Matson on a consistent basis.

INTERVIEW WITH RANDY MATSON

I had just about given up prior to that last throw. I usually don't throw well late in a series. I sure feel fortunate to have won tonight. My tosses have not been going well. Even on the last one tonight, I felt it slip off my hand. I think that Steinhauer is going to be tough to beat from now on.

INTERVIEW WITH TOMMY SMITH

I was skeptical about the race from the very start. My strategy was to take the lead and go all the way. I got a bad start and at the break, I was third, I had to pour it on for 10 yards and pull up behind Frey. Then it just came down to a question of conditioning. I had to pour it on again in the last 100 yards to pull away. Frey is a strong runner the opening 150 yards and that had me worried. I also got scared on the final lap when I had to lean away from the inside of the track because my shoulder almost hit the placards (he pointed to the name and distance signs near the end of the broad jump pit).

INTERVIEW WITH JOHN R. MBO

He scratched from the high jump. He did not make any of his practice jumps. He passed until 6-8. ~~XXX~~ Then he tried once at 6-8, missed and then went to an official asking to be scratched. He gave no further explanation.

JIM GRELE

I was a little embarrassed over the slow time. I like to run a race to win, but I wish this one would have been faster. I ran quite a risk by running it that slow because to many of the runners had a shot at winning. I feel that I can run with any of them, but if it is that slow, they have a good chance. I plan to keep running, just playing it one week at a time. I think I will run more in the two and three mile category because it will give me some new faces and new competition. If I keep running miles at this pace I may be able to spread my energy until I'm 40. Don't get me wrong though, I still think I am capable of running 3:55, maybe even 3:54 or 3:53.

#### INTERVIEW WITH CHRIS PAPANIKOLAOU

This was his best effort indoors, but he says it is "just momentarily" his best. He credited his effort to the use of a new and heavier pole, a 175. He can get more height with a heavier pole. This is the first time he's used this pole in competition. He was happy with his win over Seagren and he thinks he can go as high as Seagren did to set the record. His coach, Ed Winter, says he has all the equipment to break the record.

#### INTERVIEW WITH BOB SEAGREN

He hurt his back in the warmup. It was the same injury he had last week at Albuquerque. Because of the injury in the warmup, he was afraid to bend his back in the actual competition. He felt embarrassed because he didn't do anything right tonight. His approach was faster than normal. "I had to move my approach back two feet, but I still couldn't push the pole in the box properly.

INTERVIEW WITH LARRY DUNN

This ties his best performance. He has run 5-flat five or six times. Each time he runs 6-flat it seems relatively easier. First time he accomplished it, it took everything out of him. Tonight he felt he had some thing left.

He also said he was a little nervous tonight because of conditioning. It is not what he wanted it to be. This is the second race he's won indoors this season. He won at Los Angeles two weeks ago. He feels he can do a little better. He felt he had the race won 10 yards from the finish--just sensed it.

SAN DIEGO, CALIF. (UPI)--TOM VON RUDEN SET A NEW U.S. RECORD FOR THE 1,000 RUN, RANDY MATSON REASSERTED HIS SUPREMACY IN THE SHOT PUT AND BOB SEAGREN WAS UPSET IN THE POLE VAULT SATURDAY NIGHT AT THE FIRST SAN DIEGO INDOOR GAMES.

A SELLOUT SPORTS ARENA CROWD OF 11,781, LARGEST ON THE WEST COAST FOR A TRACK EVENT THIS SEASON, ALSO SAW THE MESA COLLEGE MILE RELAY TEAM LOWER THE NATION'S INDOOR RECORD TO 3:22.5 THE PREVIOUS RECORD WAS SET BY THE SAME SAN DIEGO TEAM LAST WEEK AT LOS ANGELES.

VON RUDEN, OF THE 49ER TRACK CLUB, RAN THE 1,000 YARDS IN 2:06.8, EIGHT SECONDS SHORT OF THE WORLD MARK SET BY PETER SNELL OF NEW ZEALAND IN 1962.

MATSON, OF TEXAS A&M, WHO WAS BEATEN LAST WEEK FOR THE FIRST TIME SINCE 1964 BY NEAL STEINHAUER, AVENGED THAT DEFEAT WITH A TOSS OF 66-FEET-10 1/4 ON HIS FINAL TRY. STEINHAUER OF THE UNIVERSITY OF OREGON, WHO SET THE WORLD INDOOR MARK OF 67-10 LAST WEEK, PLACED SECOND WITH A THROW OF 66-2 1/4.

SEAGREN OF THE UNIVERSITY OF SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA WAS DEFEATED FOR THE FIRST TIME THIS SEASON IN THE POLE VAULT BY CHRIS PAPANIKOLAOU OF GREECE AND SAN JOSE STATE. BOTH CLEARED 16-FEET-6 BUT PAPANIKOLAOU HAD THE FEWEST MISSES.

DON SHY, THE SAN DIEGO STATE COLLEGE ATHLETE WHO FAILED TO WIN ANY PREVIOUS MEETS THIS SEASON, RACED TO VICTORY IN THE 60 YARD HIGH HURDLES IN 7.1 SECONDS, SHOWING THE FORM THAT MADE HIM THE BEST U.S. HURDLER LAST YEAR. LARRY DUNN OF THE LOS ANGELES STRIDERS WON THE 60 YARD DASH IN 6.0 SECONDS, ONE-TENTH OF A SECOND OFF THE WORLD INDOOR MARK.

JIM GRELE OF MULTNOMAH ATHLETIC CLUB WON THE MILE IN THE SLOW TIME OF 4:08.4 GEORGE SCOTT, AN AUSTRALIAN WHO ATTENDS THE UNIVERSITY OF NEW MEXICO, PLACED FIRST IN THE TWO MILE RUN IN 9:05.2.

TOMMIE SMITH OF SAN JOSE STATE WON THE 440 YARD RUN IN 48.2, THE FASTEST TIME OF THE INDOOR SEASON. ANOTHER SAN JOSE STATE STAR, LEE EVANS, CAPTURED THE 600 YARD RUN IN 1:12.2.

IN A FIELD OF OUTSTANDING HIGH JUMPERS, OTIS BURRELL OF THE 49ERS T.C. TOOK HONORS WITH A LEAP OF 7 FEET. JOHN THOMAS OF THE BOSTON ATHLETIC ASSN. PLACED SECOND AT 6-10.

RALPH BOSTON OF THE STRIDERS WON THE LONG JUMP AT 25-FEET-10. ART WALKER, ALSO OF THE STRIDERS, HOLDER OF THE WORLD INDOOR RECORD IN THE TRIPLE JUMP, PLACED FIRST IN HIS SPECIALTY WITH A MARK OF 56-FEET-6 3/4.
