FROM: VIC KELLEY, UCLA ATHLETIC NEWS BUREAU RELEASE: Upon Receipt (Mailed: 4/10/67) LOS ANGELES, CALIF. -- A coach and a team that is highly respected in track and field, Payton Jordan and his Stanford Indians, invade UCLA this Saturday (Apr. 15) to challenge Jim Bush's unbeaten Bruins in an important AAWU dual meet, the 32nd renewal of this traditional rivalry dating back to 1934. For the convenience of the fans, the meet will be held in the morning starting at 10 o'clock on Westwood's Trotter Track. This will give the track buffs a chance to go cross town to the Coliseum to take in the Washington-USC meet there beginning at 1:30 p.m. UCLA's frosh cindermen also go against Reedly JC Saturday in a meet to be run off simultaneously with the varsity competition. Plus, a special mile or two mile run for the seniors (40 years of age and over) starts off the program at 10 a.m. In cold and windy weather at Pullman last Saturday, the Bruins scored a 100-45 conference victory over Washington State to run their dual meet win string to 12 in a row, eight last year and four this UCLA co-captain Ron Copeland again demonstrated that he's one of the country's foremost hurdlers and speedsters by winning three events-the highs in 14.2, 100 in 9.6, and 220 in 21.2-and also running an impressive leg on the victorious 440-relay team (41.6).

He wasn't pushed in the highs or furlong but barely edged teammate Don Domansky in the century. This, incidentally, was the first 100 he has ever run as a Bruin. "He's truly a super athlete," Bush enthused about his NCAA high hurdles champion.

Pole vaulter Dick Railsback also impressed as he posted a new lifetime best of $16-6\frac{1}{2}$ and barely missed on two tries at 17-1. He and Stanford's great Jim Eshelman, who has already gone over $16-11\frac{1}{4}$ this spring, may push each other over 17 feet in one of Saturday's top events.

Rick Sloan, the Bruins' superb pole vaulter and high jumper, also indicated he's recovered from a recent ankle injury by barely missing on two tries at $16-6\frac{1}{2}$ after clearing $15-10\frac{1}{2}$ and by winning the HJ with a 6-7 3/4 leap. Sloan and teammates Larry Fischer and Mike Weinreich will be going against another outstanding performer, Peter Boyce, who has already set a new Stanford HJ record of 6-11 this season.

The Bruins' triple jump pair of Gerald Lee and Doug Ford also starred with 50-0 and 48-11 leaps, respectively at Pullman. This was only one-half inch off of Lee's lifetime best and was Ford's career best for the third straight meet. He started off this season with a best of $47-0\frac{1}{2}$ and has improved to $48-0\frac{1}{2}$, $48-6\frac{1}{2}$ and now 48-11 at Pullman.

For the first time in history, UCLA had three shotputters over 55 feet in one meet last Saturday, with Jack Hale winning at $56-6\frac{1}{2}$, Kirk Wassell second at 56-0 3/4, and Steve Marcus third at $55-1\frac{1}{4}$. And they have all gone farther this year, with Marcus doing 58-1, Wassell 57-9, and Hale 56-9, all lifetime bests. Bush believes they all have the potential to reach 60 feet--and soon.

Wassell, the talented newcomer from Fullerton JC, made his Bruin debut a successful one by also winning the discus with a $171-0\frac{1}{2}$ (corrected from $171-1\frac{1}{2}$) throw. His lifetime best is 173-6.

Harold Busby, the speedy soph sprinter, didn't make the trip to Pullman because of illness but is expected to be ready to run this Saturday.

A new UCLA frosh record was set last Friday by newcomer Zenon Andrusyshyn (6-2, 212) from Canada in the discus throw. He got off a winning toss of 159-5 as the Brubabes lost a close 73-70 meet to the Occidental yearlings. This broke the old record of $156-8\frac{1}{2}$ by Mike Hogan in 1961.

However, Andrusyshyn's best event is the javelin throw. He's the holder of the Canadian national record of $242-1\frac{1}{2}$ set last year and has an unofficial best of 262-8 also posted last year. He'll be making his JT debut as a Brubabe Saturday.
