Fresno is proud to host the outstanding athletes that participate in the Relays, and we know the spectators will enjoy this far-famed track and field spectacle.

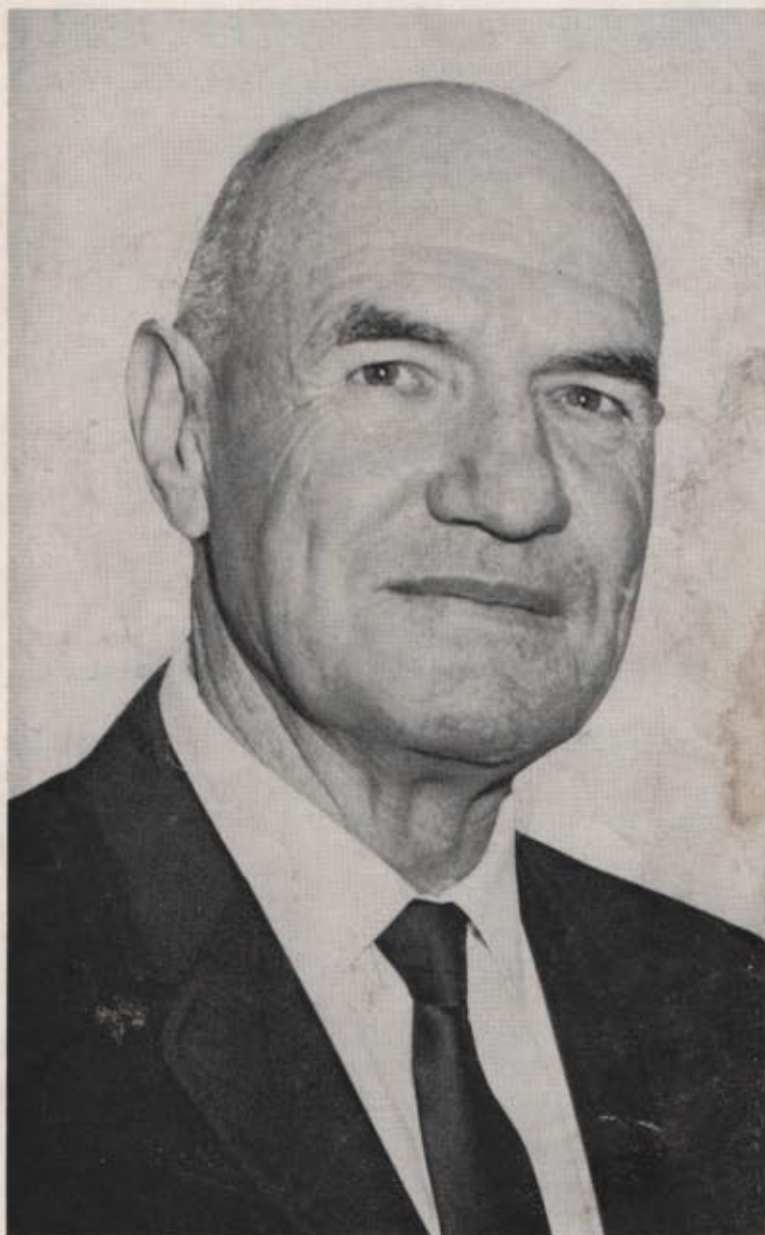

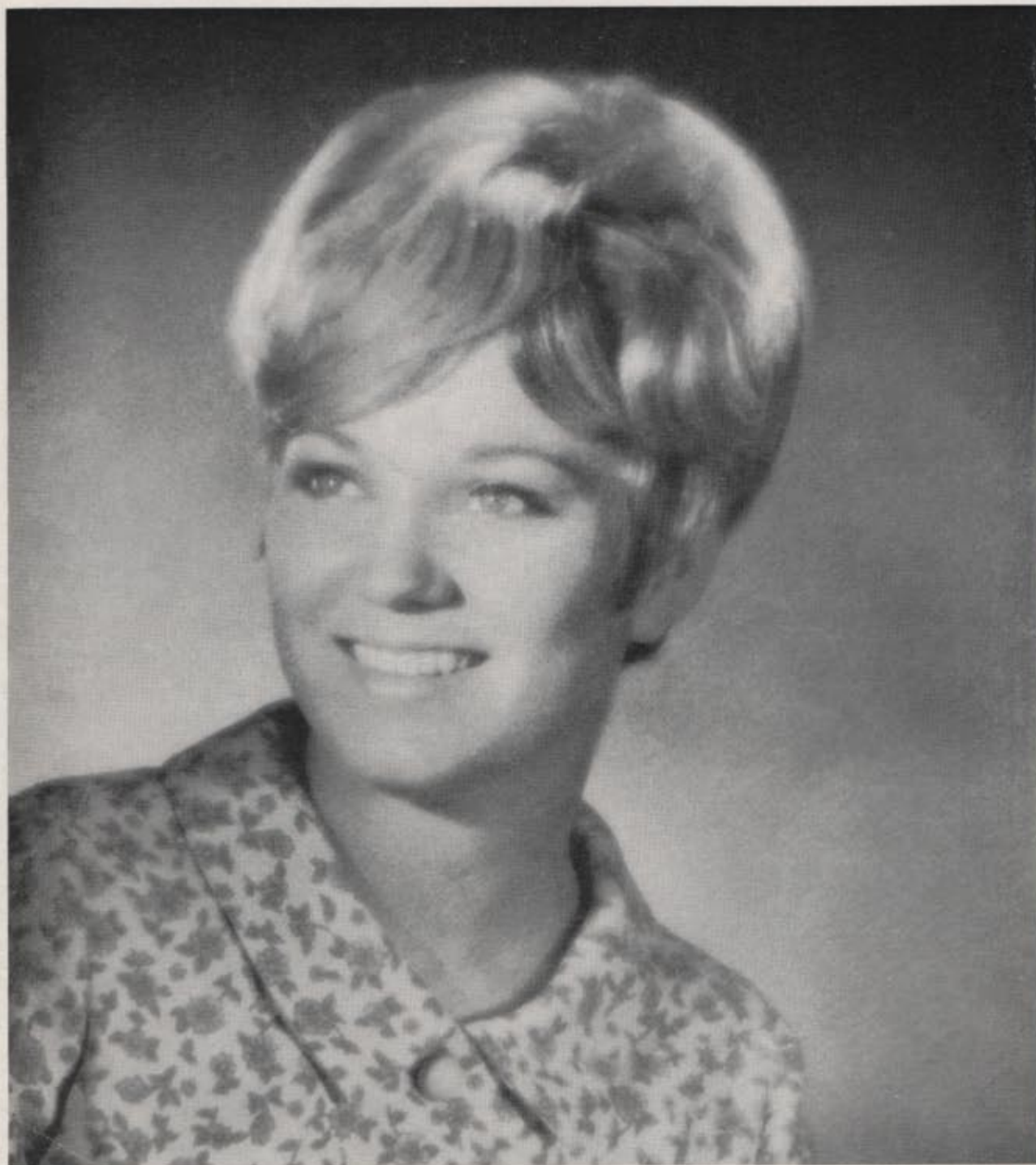

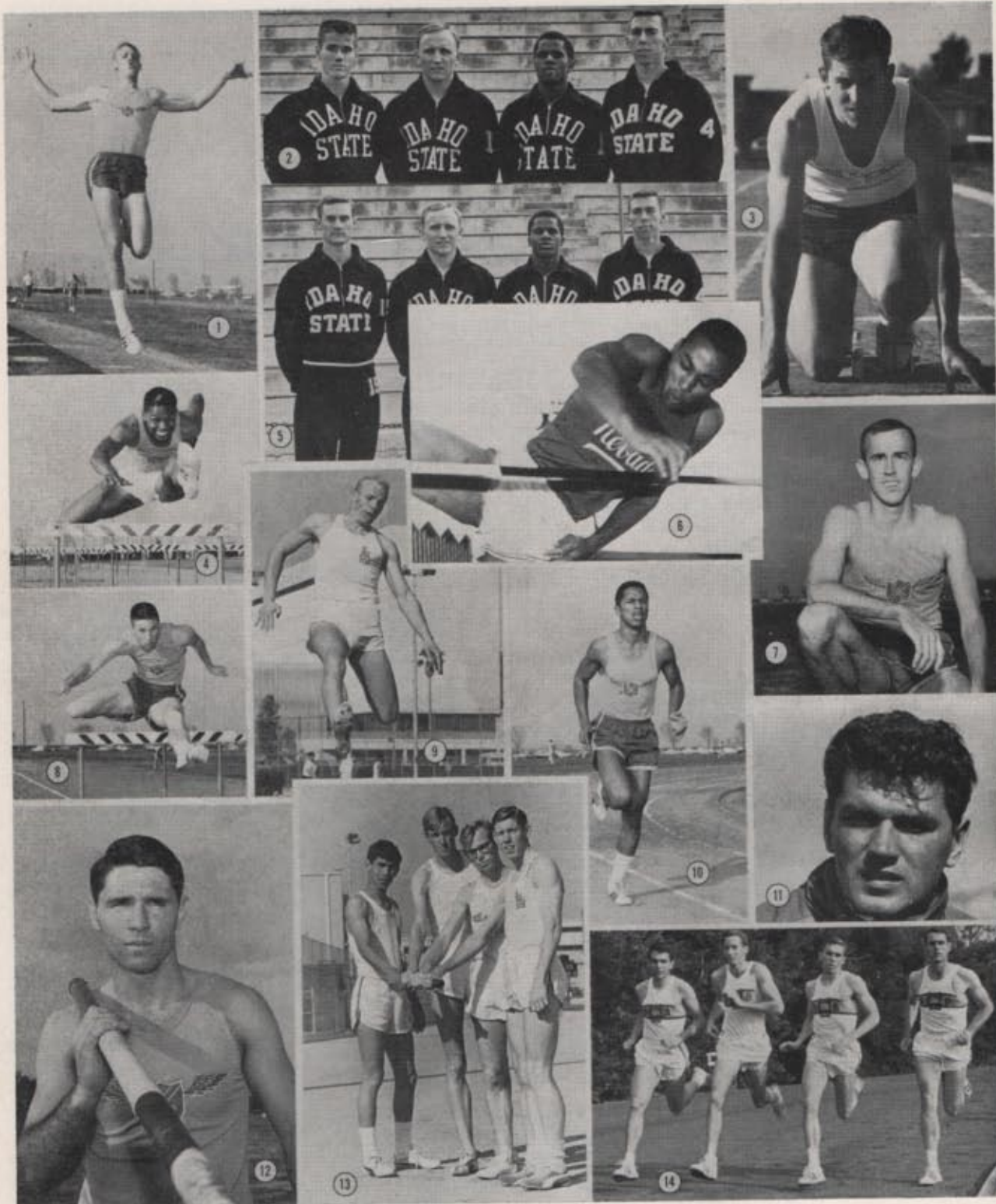
