1. the 880R record was the oldest, it was <sup>ACC</sup> originally set around 3 turns and when <sup>1961</sup> equaled a runner <sup>4 turns</sup> for ACC bumped into another after handling off but the record stood because the lanes weren't minimum <sup>42"</sup> width <sup>Texas Relay</sup>
2. Shockelford ran his first ever 220 from the blocks, his first ever for 55 or an 880. If Giffen + Bamberg hadn't been injured and had run they may not have gotten the record. Shockelford + Talmadge set up the record
3. Tommie's 19.4 is the fastest ever, Lee's 44.2 is the fastest 440 but Tommie has run 43.8 for 400m
4. Tommie now <sup>currently</sup> holds the following 7 world records (200s, 220s, 200e, 220e, 1600R, 800R, 880R)
5. Shockelford was quoted in school papers saying they'll get mile R at Compton, what about Modesto? They might have gotten it at Fresno if Smith had more recovery because the 1st 3 ran their bests but they have more stamina than Tommie has. Also had passes involving Evans in both efforts. A good pass might have meant at time in the low 1:21 area
