SAN MATEO - Carlmont High's track team won seven of thirteen first places, scoring heavily in the field and distance relays, and walked away with the Carlmont District Relays held at the College of San Mateo, Saturday. The Scots scored 761/2 points to second place M-A's 421/2.

The meet was originally scheduled for last Saturday at Carlmont with the top teams in Northern California entered, but the rainy weather forced cancelation and coach Loren Lansberry invited the Sequoia District teams to compete for the medals supplied by the Belmont Rotary and the Carlmont Athletic Department.

Another top race was the 440 relay. Menlo-Atherton proved why it is one of the top teams around when it blazed to a 44.0 clocking. Anchor man Bull Hatcher nipped Ravenswood's Tom Marlowe at the tape.

The 880 relay looked as though it was going to be a photo-finish between Ravenswood and M-A. With 300 yards left, Bear anchor Steve Mitchell aggravated a muscle pull and had to drop from the race and the Trojans had no other competition.
