

Watsonville Dominates

MBL Meet Doesn't Surprise

There were few surprises here Saturday as the 1967 Monterey Bay League Track and Field Championships were held at Alisal High School.

Defending champion Watsonville, the pre-meet favorite in both the varsity and lightweight divisions, romped to victory as

expected. And, most of the favored athletes won their individual events.

Watsonville picked up 82 points in the varsity meet to beat second place Seaside, 39 for Santa Cruz and 23 for Alisal.

In lightweight competition the Wilkussions had things all their way, scoring 42 points to 20½ for second place Salinas and 11

for Alisal and Seaside, who tied for third.

Alisal two miler Billy Bell and the Seaside 800-relay team came up with minor surprises in the varsity division. Bell regained his early season form to win the two mile in the good time of 9:49.4.

Watsonville's Bob Banks was favored to win the eight-lapper

but Bell stayed close through seven laps and literally ran away from his adversary in the final 400. Banks was timed in 7:33.4.

Seaside's 800-relay team routed the bad mile in 1:21.8. Santa Cruz, the relay favorite, finished third in 1:32.4.

Double winners in the meet were Santa Cruz's Byron Wil-

son and Monterey's Mark Baderoni. Wilson took the 100 in 16.6 and the 200 in 33.5. Baderoni set an MBL record in the 180-low hurdles with a victory in 19.2 clocking and won the tape in 14.5.

Alisal's Bob Miller and he were the only Salinas area athletes to win an event. Miller took the broad jump with a leap of 22-7½.

Jones was second in the high hurdles with a good 14.3 clocking and finished fifth in the low at 28.8. Scott collected third place in the mile when he ran 4:47.5.

In lightweight competition Alisal's Danny Day and Bob Hursh plus Salinas' Jeff Ogawa took individual titles. Day won the broad jump with a leap of 21-½. Hursh captured the 800 in 2:33.7 and Ogawa led the shot put field with a heave of 88.4.

North Salinas' 400-meter Dennis Erickson, Salinas hurdler Dennis Mab and discus thrower Joe Baxter led the Salinas relay team took second place in the meet.

equaling the standing mark. White has run a 10.4 this year.

Seaside's 880-yard lightweight relay team set a record in winning that event with a 1:34.7 timing. The old record was 1:35.5, set last year by Watsonville.

Watsonville's Eddie Silva set a new two-mile mark with a 10:08.6 clocking. The old mark, set by Gary Newell, Watsonville, was 10:38.2.

Soquel's Frank Adkinson tied a school record in the lightweight 70-yard high hurdles, turning in a time of 9.8 as he won that event.

White, besides winning the 100-yard dash, also took the

lightweight 180-yard low hurdles, establishing a new school record of 21.2. He held the old mark, 21.4, set earlier this year.

Harry Nervino set another lightweight mark for Soquel, finishing fourth in the 880-yard run in 2:05.1. Santa Cruz' Jim Ceey finished fifth in that event, although he had the same time, and in so doing, established a Santa Cruz school record.

George Hightower finished second in the lightweight two-mile run, setting a new Santa Cruz record of 10:12.6.

Santa Cruz coach Mel Fish-

burn had praise for freshman miler Rick McCullah, who finished sixth in the lightweight mile in a time of 4:53.2.

Santa Cruz firsts in varsity competition were recorded by Byron Wilson, 10 flat in the 100 and 21.9 in the 220.

Bayard Smith set a new Cardinal mark in the varsity 440 finishing one-tenth of a second out of first place with a time of :50.3.

Don Lowery, in finishing second in the varsity 180-yard low hurdles, established a new Santa Cruz record of :19.8. Lowery set another school mark in the 120-yard high hurdles, finishing fourth in :15.1.
