

# Rain Won't Dampen Mt. Sac Relays

Chilling rain marred first day competition Friday in the ninth annual Mt. San Antonio Relays, but meet director Hilmer Lodge insisted that today's open competition will be held rain or shine.

"It rained both days in our first meet back in 1959 and we didn't call it off," Lodge said. "We won't call this one off, either. With our all-weather track absorbing the water, conditions will be fine Saturday."

Today's featured mile relay, which was to have matched San Jose State's

Another prep, Westminster's Mike Solomon, turned in an amazing performance during the heaviest downpour. He was timed in a 4:18.5 mile anchoring the Lions' winning distance medley team. It eclipsed the 10:24 set two years ago by a Westminster team anchored by Carl Trentadue.

Tommie Smith and the 49er Track Club's Jim Kemp on the anchor lap, was dimmed by the suspension Friday of the entire 49er Track Club.

Individual 49er TC members will compete as unattached competitors today, however, but may not run on relay teams or even as unattached runners.

"There is no such thing as an unattached relay team," ruled Jan Rus, chairman of the Southern Pacific AAU registration committee, who announced the suspension.

Smith and his Spartan teammates, including National AAU 440-yard champion Lee Evans, will still be in the 440, 880 and mile relays. Their chief competition will come from Arizona State, and the University of Arizona.

Friday's meet was turned into a fiasco by the steady rains which puddled the track and made hurdle races hazardous due to the slippery footing.

A number of coaches took their teams home during the two-hour downpour late in the afternoon, leaving fields rather skimpy for the evening program. In races where 9 or 10 teams were entered, only 3 or 4 actually ran.

The rain and cold which dipped into the high 40s, proved another frustrating evening in Jerry Proctor's ceaseless pursuit of the National Intercollegiate long jump record. The Muir senior leaped 24 feet 4 inches into a soggy pit and barely fouled on a jump around 25'5". Jerry did get a meet record, however.

The long jump was contested in such wet condi-

# Greek 'T

The "Tommie Smith" show was upstaged by a Greek tragedy at the Mt. San Antonio Relays Saturday.

The 10,000 fans who came to see Tommie didn't get much of a show, but it was through no fault of his.

When the 49er Track Club was banned Friday, it eliminated any competition for Tommie-jet and his Spartan teammates, so the 880 and mile relays became virtual "walkovers" for San Jose State.

Lee Evans gave Smith an eight-yard lead in the 880 and a 25-yard advantage in the mile. Evans was clocked in 46.3 and Smith in 46.7 as they soloed quarter-mile laps in the 3:09.0 mile relay.

### Close Call

The nearest thing to excitement in an otherwise dull day came in the pole vault when Chris Papanicolaou sailed over 17 feet, apparently becoming the seventh ever over that magic height. However, an eager vault attendant grabbed Papanicolaou's pole as it teetered under the bar, thus nullifying the vault.

It became truly a Greek tragedy when Chris, a 25-year-old transfer student from Greece, was told his vault did not count—and the official who told him was Pete Clentzos, himself a former Greek national pole vault record holder in the 1930s.

Papanicolaou's official height of 16-8 is a new Greek record and earned him field athlete of the meet honors.

### Whitney Honored

Former Occidental star Ron Whitney was voted track athlete of the meet for running the fastest 440-yard intermediate hurdles in the world this year, a 50.7 victory and then returning to anchor a Striders' sprint medley relay team with a 1:50.6 half mile.

Whitney actually was running on the Striders "second team" in the sprint medley. He took the baton 20 yards behind the leader, Harris Williams of

the No. 1 Striders' team, but at the finish he had caught the field and had won going away.

It was only the second intermediate hurdles race this year for Whitney, now a schoolteacher in Boulder, Colo. The 50.7 clocking was bettered last year by only two Americans.

Crisp 15 m.p.h. hour breezes prevented several fine performances from being accepted as meet records.

## Anderson Upsets

Menzies Campbell, Stanford graduate student from England, upset George Anderson, former Southern U. sprint great, in a 10.2 100 meters. Then, Jerry Bright of Arizona State came back to nip Campbell in a 21.7 220, with Jim Kemp a fading third.

Two excellent wind-blown hurdles times were 13.6 by Blaine Lindgren, the Olympic silver medalist starting a comeback, and a 14.0 over the prep barriers by Muir's Jerry Proctor.

World record holder Ralph Boston, who hoped to break his own mark here, not only failed in that but was also upset by gangling (6-2½, 157 pounds) Bob Beamon, an ineligible sophomore at University of Texas at El Paso. The 20-year-old Beamon leaped 26-2¾ to Boston's 25-11.

## Richards Doubles

An unusual double by Bob Richards produced an 8:56.1 victory in the 3,000 meter steeplechase and a fifth in the mile. The NCAA steeplechase champion from Brigham Young won a head-to-head duel with Kerry Pearce, an Australian at UTEP.

Although the 49er Track Club was banned from competition as a team, all of its athletes were on hand as unattached performers. Most of them wore their 49er uniforms but with the jerseys turned inside out.

Meet records were set in both the 5,000 and 10,000 meters as Tracy Smith ran 13:51.8 in the shorter race and Ron Larrieu 29:22.4 in the longer one. Tom Laris, who finished second to Larrieu in the 10,000, recently finished second in the Boston Marathon.

Other meet records went to Ed Caruthers with a 7-0¼ high jump and Don DeNoon with a 13:32.8 2-mile walk.
