

The "Tommie Smith" show was upstaged by a Greek tragedy at the Mt. San Antonio Relays Saturday.

The 10,000 fans who came to see Tommie didn't get much of a show, but it was through no fault of his.

When the 49er Track Club was banned Friday, it eliminated any competition for Tommie-jet and his Spartan teammates, so the 880 and mile relays became virtual "walkovers" for San Jose State.

Lee Evans gave Smith an eight-yard lead in the 880 and a 25-yard advantage in the mile. Evans was clocked in 46.3 and Smith in 46.7 as they soloed quarter-mile laps in the 3:09.0 mile relay.

Close Call

The nearest thing to excitement in an otherwise dull day came in the pole vault when Chris Papanicolaou sailed over 17 feet, apparently becoming the seventh ever over that magic height. However, an eager vault attendant grabbed Papanicolaou's pole as it teetered under the bar, thus nullifying the vault.

It became truly a Greek tragedy when Chris, a 25-year-old transfer student from Greece, was told his vault did not count—and the official who told him was Pete Clentzos, himself a former Greek national pole vault record holder in the 1930s.

Papanicolaou's official height of 16-8 is a new Greek record and earned him field athlete of the meet honors.

Whitney Honored

Former Occidental star Ron Whitney was voted track athlete of the meet for running the fastest 440-yard intermediate hurdles in the world this year, a 50.7 victory and then returning to anchor a Striders' sprint medley relay team with a 1:50.6 half mile.

Whitney actually was running on the Striders "second team" in the sprint medley. He took the baton 20 yards behind the leader, Harris Williams of

the No. 1 Striders' team, but at the finish he had caught the field and had won going away.

It was only the second intermediate hurdles race this year for Whitney, now a schoolteacher in now a schoolteacher in Boulder, Colo. The 50.7 clocking was bettered last year by only two Ameri-

Crisp 15 m.p.h. hour breezes prevented several fine performances from being accepted as meet records.

Anderson Upsets

Menzies Campbell, Stanford graduate student from England, upset George Anderson, former George Anderson, former Southern U. sprint great, in a 10.2 100 meters. Then, Jerry Bright of Arizona State came back to nip Campbell in a 21.7 220, with Jim Kemp a fading third

Two excellent windblown hurdles times were 13.6 by Blaine Lindgren, the Olympic silver medalist starting a comeback, and a 14.0 over the prep barriers by Muir's Jerry

World record holder Ralph Boston, who hoped to break his own mark here, not only failed in that but was also upset by gangling (6-2½, 157 pounds) Bob Beamon, an ineligible sophomore at University of Texas at El Paso. The 20-year-old Beamon leaped 26-234 to Boston's 25-11.

Richards Doubles

An unusual double by Bob Richards produced an 8:56.1 victory in the 3,000 meter steeplechase and a fifth in the mile. The NCAA steeplechase cham-pion from Brigham Young won a head-to-head duel with Kerry Pearce, an Australian at UTEP.

Although the 49er Track Club was banned from competition as a team, all of its athletes were on hand as unattached performers. Most of them wore their 49er uniforms but with the jersies turned inside out.

Meet records were set in both the 5,000 and 10,000 meters as Tracy Smith ran 13:51.8 in the shorter race and Ron Larrieu 29:22.4 in the longer one. Tom Laris, who finished second to Larrieu in the 10,000, recently finished second in the Boston Marathon.

Other meet records went to Ed Caruthers with a 7-0½ high jump and Don DeNoon with a 13:32.8 2mile walk.
