Los Altos wins SCV

It took more than five hours and come-through performances by everyone, but Los Altos High School retained its Santa Clara Valley Athletic League track and field championship.

Todd Peterson finally wrapped up the win for the Knights when he cleared 13-9 in the pole vault a little after midnight at Fremont High

School.

The 10 first-place points brought the Los Altos total to 111 and put the Knights out of reach of hard-charging

Homestead of Sunnyvale.

The Mustangs finished second with 105 points.

In addition to the torrid battle for team honors, the meet produced a flock of fine marks

Three records were broken and another tied. Peterson accounted for one mark with his pole vault. It took a record for Peterson to defeat Steve Peterson of Cupertino who cleared 13-6. It was the first time in four tries this season that Todd beat his namesake from Cupertino.

The other records came in the 440-yard dash where Roger Seamans of Buchser outran Frank Hughes of Cupertino to win in 48.4, and the relay where Los Altos clicked off a fine 1;28.7 clocking.

Tom Phillips, a junior from Homestead, tied a meet record when he upset Bob Connolly of Fremont in the low hurdles with a time of 19.2.

Coach Dave Maggard of Los Altos expected the meet to go down to the last event.

"I told our kids that we had to beat Homestead in the relay. I didn't want them to get disqualified so I told them to stand in their lanes on the baton passes.

"I couldn't believe how far ahead we were after the first

two legs."

The relay runners for Los Altos were Kip Jackson, Gary and Wes Hinter, and Brad Lyman. Jackson was filling in for Jim Skidmore who couldn't run because of a foot injury.

Lyman, in addition to anchoring the relay team, won the 100 and 200-yard dashes. He beat Dave Blanchard of

Sunnyvale in each. His times were 9.8 and 21.6.

Jackson got some unexpected points for Los Altos when he took third in the low hurdles at 19.7 and was fourth in the highs.

The biggest lump of points for Los Altos came in the discus where Steve Davis and Randy Beck went 1-2 to beat out Steve Wilhelm of Fremont. Davis won with a throw of 179-1½ and Beck was second at 170-2½.

Other important point winners for Los Altos were Bill Fernandez who did his alltime best of six feet to place in the high jump, Bob Bergamn with a best of life 45-10 to take fourth in the triple jump, and Dave Hingston with a sixth in the 880.

The 880 was one of the best races of the night. Jerry Tompsett of Cupertino won in 1:54.9 and fifth place John Bronson of Buchser had an excellent time of 1:58.5.

Homestead scored heavily in the jumping events with Grady Rogers leading a 1-2-3 sweep in the broad jump, Jim McGinnity taking second and Phillips fourth in the high jump, and Alan Meridith taking third in the triple jump.

Homestead won the Class B title with 98 points, Fremont was second with 77, and Santa Clara third with 70.

Sunnyvale won the D title with 96 points. Homestead was second with 76, one more than third-place Fremont.

The top six finishers in each event advance to the Central Coast qualifying meet next week at Westmont High School in Campbell.
