

District Prep Spikefest Tonight 5-6

Sequoia District High School track and field athletes will be running and jumping for gold medals in the 12th annual District Track and Field Championships — Centennial version — beginning tonight at 7 o'clock at Terremere Field on the campus of Sequoia High School.

Each athlete that finishes first will receive a gold medal with the Redwood City Centennial inscription on it.

The first running event of the night will be the Class C two-mile at 7:30 followed by the Class B two-mile. The first varsity event is scheduled for 8 o'clock.

Carlmont, which is the defending champion, will bank on its strong distance runners, fine pole vaulters and weightmen in shooting for its ninth straight varsity title.

San Carlos, the Class C dual meet champions are a good bet to take the C title while Menlo-Atherton should carry the B team championship back to Atherton.

There are two defending champions back and several meet records that could be changed before the night's over. Ron Sledge of Ravenswood set a meet record of 21-10 inches in the long jump and Woodside's Ben Welch put his name in the

record books with a discus heave of 174-6 in last year's meet. Both of these records should be broken and it may not be by Sledge or Welch.

One of the best battles will be in the long jump. Charlie Johnson, Sequoia High's Mr. Clutch, was the leading qualifier Friday with a jump of 22-1, seven and half inches off his best for the year.

The discus and the shot put will be a dual battle between Welch and Carlmont's Jim Penrose. Penrose has beaten Welch once this year in their three discus meetings and has a throw of 174-1 to his credit. Welch's best toss in the discus is 164-9½. In

the shot put, Welch is the favorite with his 55-3¼ throw as evidence.

Carlmont's team title hopes can be seriously challenged by Sequoia. The Cherokees and Scots will lock horns in the two-mile with Mike Dailey and Rich Terriberry of the Tribe and Chris Carey, Bob Kennedy and Mike O'Malley for the Highlanders, chasing after the meet record of 9:54.9 set by Bill Bradfield of Carlmont in 1966.

The Sequoia District Track Meet, which has been bouncing around on the schedule like a rubber ball, will cost the district some overtime wages if it is held on Saturday, as it is now scheduled.

It was originally scheduled for Friday, then the Board of Managers moved it back to Saturday on the recommendation of coaches' representatives, who wanted the extra day to make up rained out meets.

The Sequoia people, who put the meet on and foot the bill for preparations, protested the change because of the increased cost of Saturday work.

At their seeding meeting Monday night, the coaches agreed to move the meet back to Friday, but Woodside principal Willard Bradley wouldn't buy it. His position is that the Wildcats' two make-up meets Monday and Tuesday plus the District trials Thursday and finals Friday are too much of a burden on the athletes in a week.

Bears Best B's:

Lightweights Provide the Thrills

Several upsets, a trio of meet records and a bundle of season's best efforts marked the District track and field lightweight championships.

As expected, dual meet leader

Menlo-Atherton won the B division with a 71 point output while San Carlos (8-0 in the dual meet season) easily triumphed in the C meet.

Jim Lane of Sequoia started the meet off with a big upset over San Carlos' Blair Morris in the 70-yd. high hurdles. Lane was clocked in 9.6, the best this year in the SPAL.

Tom Heartsner of Carlmont brought the enthusiastic crowd to its feet in a thrilling mile battle with Woodside's Ed Wells. With 110 yards to go, Heartsner lost his lead but fought back to nip Wells at the tape.

Mickey Scott of Ravenswood set another meet record in outclassing the field in the 180 low hurdles. Scott's time of 21.2 is 0.6 seconds faster than the existing record.

Roy Diedrichsen of M-A raised the pole vault record barrier with a leap of 12.2. Besides being a meet record, the jump was two inches better than any mark in class B thus far this season.

In the C clash, the Dons took five of 12 gold medals back to San Carlos. Jim Luttrell's crew scored heavily in the weights and distances to easily outscore the rest of the competition.

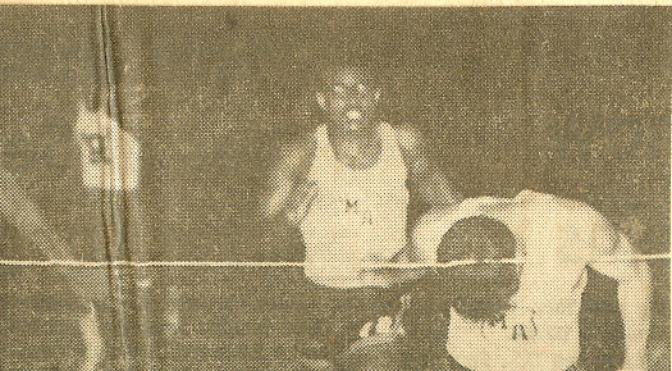

Carey, Johnson Honored:

Scots Win District Spike Title

What the Yankees were to baseball, the Celtics to basketball and the Packers to NFL football, the Carlmont Scots' seem to be to the Sequoia District Track and Field Championships. The Scots won their ninth straight title in the 12th running before an estimated 1,000 fans on a beautiful Saturday evening at Terremere Field.

The Scots scored 84 points to second-place Ravenswood's 52.

The outstanding track and field awards went to the only two record breakers in the meet. The Scots' sophomore sensation, Chris Carey, blazed to an amazing 9:35.6 two-mile record to earn the top track performer award and Sequoia's Charlie Johnson was awarded the No. 1

field contestant with his 22-5 $\frac{1}{4}$ long jump.

The biggest surprise of the evening was the close team battle for second between Ravenswood and Sequoia. The Trojans, who finished second with 52 points, were without their best all-around cinderman, Oscar Jones, who was excused from the meet for disciplinary reasons after being scratched from the 100-yd. dash after two false starts.

Ray (Williams) Pipkins of Menlo-Atherton was an upset winner in the 100 with a clocking of 10.2. He outleaned teammate Bill Hatcher at the tape for a one-two Bear finish. Hatcher was outstretched in the 220 by Ravenswood's Harold Malone.

In the field events, Jim Penrose of Carlmont, Joe White of Carlmont and Ben Welch of Woodside were considered by

the judges for the top field award.

White was impressive in capturing a gold medal in the pole vault with a leap of 13-0 $\frac{1}{4}$. That event, along with the distances and a come-through performance by Doug Rolly in the hurdles (15.2 in the high's and 20.2 in the low's) were enough for the Loren Lansberry-coached outfit to take No. 9.

Welch and Penrose split weightmen's honors. Welch, who was the defending champ in the discus, lost to Penrose, who threw 169-5 to Welch's 163-9.

Welch bounced back in the shot put, nabbing his first place award for the second straight year. His put of 54-7 $\frac{1}{2}$ was two feet farther than Penrose's best.

Although Menlo-Atherton finished in fourth place with 39 points, head coach Plato Yan-

icks was happy with his team's performance. Steve Mitchell, one of the league's top all-around competitors and hurdler Jim Cooke sat out the meet with injuries. Yanicks got one pleasant surprise in the 880 where Steve Gavazza came from far behind to nab a second place behind Carlmont's Pat Carey. Carey became the District's first sub-two minute runner this season with a 1:59.2 showing.

Teams will be making up the rest of their dual meets this week and wind up the season Saturday evening in the SPAL championships at Sequoia.

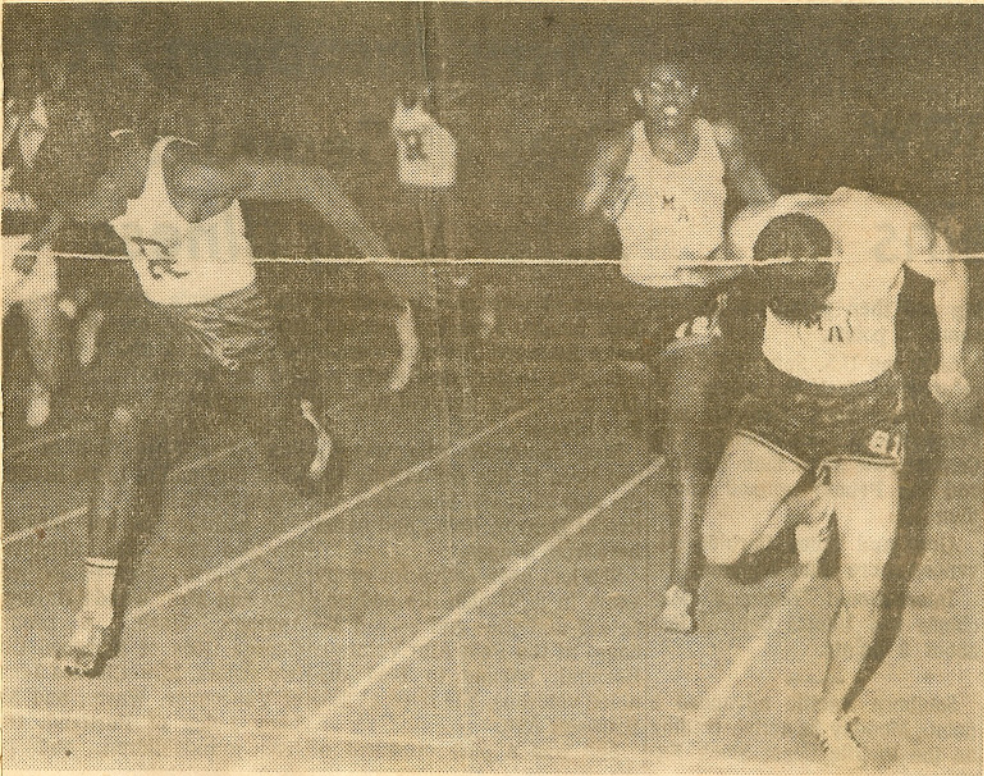

District Prep Track Finals At Sequoia

The 12th annual Sequoia Union High School District Track and Field Championship trials will be held Friday starting at 2 p.m. at Sequoia High's Terremere Field. The finals, which were previously scheduled for that day, have been moved to Saturday evening beginning at 7:30.

The cindermen from Carmont, San Carlos, Sequoia, Ravenswood, Menlo-Atherton and Woodside will attempt to qualify the most men for Saturday's finals.

This year the top eight will qualify for the finals in the field events, seven in the hurdles, eight in the 100, 220 and 440 and 16 in the 880. There will be no trials for the mile and two-mile in all divisions and in the lightweights, the 880 will not have a preliminary run.

Lightweight Results:

Warden, Bianco Top Performers

The best race of the night, a flock of seasonal best marks, the Outstanding Track Performer of the meet, and an upset for a team championship were provided in the lightweight divisions of the Sequoia District Track Championships Friday night.

Late arrivals at Terremere Field missed the most exciting race, the class B 880, where Sequoia's Dennis Bianco came from 30 yards behind in the final 220 to win a blanket finish in 2:03.6.

Second place Pat Carey of Carlmont and third place Gene Curry of Sequoia both were timed in 2:03.7 and fourth place Steve Gavazza of M-A in 2:04.7—all under the previous best time of the SPAL season.

Sophomore Chan Warden of Woodside was voted the meet's Outstanding Track Performer award over varsity contestants for winning the 220 and 440 and anchoring the winning relay to spark Woodside's C's to an upset victory over Sequoia, 55½ to 44½. He also won the long jump, accounting for 32 points for the Wildcats.

Warden's 440 time of 52.9 and the relay clocking of 1:39.3 were seasonal bests by wide margins.

Sequoia, as expected, won the B championship, running away from second place Menlo-Atherton 93-64.

Meet records were established in all lightweight track events except the B high hurdles as the B and C divisions have been converted to varsity distances this year.

Field event meet records were set in the B discus, where Sequoia freshman Barr Curry erased an eight-year-old record with a throw of 134.2 in the Trials; and the C high jump, where Blair Morris of San Carlos leaped 5-7.

Class B seasonal bests for the SPAL included Bill Hatcher's 23.5 in the 220 and Dan Britts' 4:37.6 in the mile for M-A. Curry's 48-5½ in the shot and Rich Terriberry's 10:05.5 in the two mile for Sequoia, and David

Cartwright's 20-4 in the long jump for Ravenswood.

Other season best C marks were 2:10.7 by Jim Lewis of Woodside in the 880, 4:48.7 by Stan Nichols of Carlmont in the mile, and 46-0½ by Ralph Giacomini of San Carlos in the shot.

Menlo-Atherton track coach Plato Yanicks calls Sequoia's B's "one of the strongest and best balanced B squads in the history of the District Meet. They scored 93 points, a record I think, and scored in all 14 events.

"I thought we were doing well by scoring in 10 events and getting a total of 64 points — 68 won it last year — but Sequoia ran away from us," he added.

Yanicks, never hesitant about crawling out on a limb, names four M-A freshmen as outstanding future prospects and labels one, Jim Stamper, as "maybe the next Tommy Smith."

Stamper has run 23.9 in the 220 and 54-flat in the quarter and, Yanicks notes, is "built similar to Smith — tall and long-legged."

The other Bears to watch, the coach advises, are 6-2, 225-pound shot and discus thrower Dennis McKenzie, versatile John Swinford (a 5-5½ high jump tops his marks), half-miler Gary Ochoa and weightman Jack Nevin.

Carlmont Wins Meet Tenth Time

If the U.S. Justice Department ever begins an investigation into monopolistic practices in high school sports, the first place to start is with the Carlmont track team.

The Scots, who have dominated the Sequoia District High School meet since its inception, maintained their competitive "trust" Saturday night by winning the meet for the tenth time in the same number of attempts.

The junior-laden Scots won seven of 14 events en route to 84 points and an unexpectedly easy team triumph. Biggest team battle in the varsity division turned out to be the race for second, in which Ravenswood edged Sequoia, 52-51.

Carlmont's next competition will come in another meet the Scots have won many times, the South Peninsula Athletic League championships. Trials are slated for 2 p.m. Friday with finals scheduled at Sequoia Saturday night.

Underclassmen stole the show for the Scots in the district meet, as they have all season long in dual competition. "Super-Soph" Chris Carey posted a 9:35.6 clocking for the two-mile, thereby clipping 19.3 seconds off the old meet record while Jim Penrose, a junior, won the discus and placed second in the shotput. Doug Rolly, who came off the Scots' injured list a week earlier, won both hurdle events.

Tom Wilson and Tom Hencemann of San Carlos went one-two in the high jump enabling the Dons to take fifth place away from Woodside.

Ravenswood's Mike Malone, along with Rolly, was the meet's only double winner. Malone upset Dennis Bianco of Sequoia in the 440 and M-A's Bill Hatcher in the 220.

Pat Carey, another Carlmont junior, ran the 880 in a fast time of 1:59.6 while teammate Bruce Eaton won the mile at 4:28 flat and Joe White, hampered by having to use a new pole, soared 13-0½ to win the pole vault.

Chris Carey's record-breaking performance in the two-mile enabled him to win the meet's most outstanding runner's trophy over Rolly and Malone.

All-American basketball player Charlie Johnson of Sequoia won the long jump with a record leap of 22-5¼ and placed fifth in the high jump as the cage star cleared only 5-6. His up and down performance surprisingly edged Penrose for the outstanding field performer's trophy. Ben Welch of Woodside, who won the field trophy in 1966, was third this year.

M-A's Class B team raced to victory with 67 points. Woodside had 52, Ravenswood was a close third with 50 while Carlmont and Sequoia tied with 37.

However, it was a powerful Class C team from San Carlos that accrued 91 points for the meet's biggest team total and largest margin of victory.
