Centennial Takes Relay and Title

Centennial High of Compton got a new lease on life Tuesday, and as a result, it won the CIF Southern Section track and field championships Friday night at Mt. San Antonio College.

When a protest on the disqualification of its 880 relay team in the CIF semifinals was upheld, little did Centennial coach Bill Gill realize that it would mean the fourth Southern Section crown for him in his 14 years at Centennial.

As expected, Centennial waged a torrid dogfight with Muir High for team honors. Going into the final event of the evening, Gill's Apaches held a 25-23 lead over Walter Opp's Foothill League champions.

Muir Favorite

Muir was the favorite in the relay, having the best time in Southern California this year with a 1:26.2. Centennial figured to take a comfortable second and the meet appeared as if it would end in a 29-29 tie.

But the Coast League runners-up had other ideas, romping away with the relay by an astounding 10 yards. The time was 1:26 flat, best in the state this year and a CIF Southern Section record. Muir was second in 1:27.2 and the final point totals were Centennial 31, Muir 27.

Had Centennial not had its relay team reinstated, the outcome would have turned around and Opp would have had his second straight Southern Section crown by a 29-25 score.

Protest Pays Off

The team originally was disqualified when sprinter Nathan Spann allegedly took a baton pass while standing outside a restraining line. But Gill protested on a CIF rule which states that it is legal for the runner to be beyond the line as long as the baton is within the zone.

On this technicality, Centennial's relay men were reinstated and subsequently ran away to the CIF crown.

Centennial's team effort overshadowed a brilliant performance by Muir's Jerry Proctor, who won three events and almost pulled Muir even in his leg of the relay.

Proctor, who is the national interscholastic long jump record holder at 25-7, easily won his specialty at 25-1 $\frac{3}{4}$, then coasted home in the high hurdles (14.0) and the lows (18.7).

The crowd of 8,500 gave the gritty young performer a rousing ovation after he scored his third victory with ease.

The top five finishers in each event qualified for the State track, meet next Friday and Saturday at San Diego's Balboa Stadium.
