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RECORD BREAKING JC TRACK SEASON ARRIVES

Two national JC records have been bettered and many more are in danger as the junior college track season gets into full swing.

First statewide meeting of California JC athletes this season, the Santa Barbara Easter Relays March 23, should give an even better indication of the shape of things to come. The pole vault, distance medley relay, and two mile are some of the events to watch at Santa Barbara.

California's stranglehold on all the national JC records appears at an end with athletes from Mesa, Ariz., bettering two marks to date.

Mesa sophomore Mike Fray ran 20.5 for the 220 as part of a double sprint victory (9.5) in a March 2 home triangular meet. That's by far the fastest furlong around a turn ever run by a JC athlete and current reports indicate the mark was not wind-aided. But there was no wind gauge in use.

Ronnie Ray Smith's wind-aided 20.8 last year is the fastest JC mark on record entering the season. Smith last season officially tied the record of 21.0 set by Lee Evans while at San Jose CC in 1966 and was credited with an unrecognized 20.9.

Mark Murro, the national high school javelin record holder (252-8), is at Mesa. He has been reported to have an official throw of 260-0 for a new JC record, but no additional information has been received as yet. Verified marks are a 241-8½ on Feb. 24 and 243-4½ on March 2.

Larry Stuart set the record of 256-2 for Santa Ana at the West Coast Relays in 1962.

Neill Duggan's two mile record of 8:54.0 for Hancock in 1966 appears in danger with Pete Brang of Mt. San Antonio ripping off an 8:59.6 last week.

Brang ran unpushed after the first 1320 to break Ron Larrieu's 1957 school record of 9:16.8. Brang's splits were 65.5, 69.0, 70.0, 68.0, 68.6, 68.5, 67.0, and 63.0. Watch out when he hooks up with Modesto's Duwayne Ray, the 880 and mile leader (1:52.6, 4:14.3). Ray is now second on the current U.S. JC two mile list at 9:11.0.

Fullerton sophomore Dave Murphy is in a class by himself in the weights so far with tosses of 58-11½ and 169-3. He was the U.S. JC leader in the shot last season at 57-¾ and appears a threat to Steve Fite's JC record of 60-8½ in 1965 for Chaffey.

However Bakersfield's Steve Wilson, who hit 169-10½ last season, is back too, with a 164-2 discus toss to date. Fresno CC's Mike Wood is within a half inch of his 53-7 best of last season in the shot while Laney's T.C. Jones already has a life best of 53-1 this year.

All of last season's top high jumpers are back, including Laney's Fred Jackson—who went 7-0 last year. San Diego CC's Harold Greenwood and Ray McGill of Bakersfield share the current JC leadership at 6-10.

San Jose CC boasts a well rounded team with enough strengths to threaten taking the state title away from Hancock this season and keeping the crown in the Northern California region. Earl Harris is a good example of what the Jaguars have to offer.

In the Golden Gate Conference Relays, Harris figured in seven victories worth 55 points and five meet records. With Harris running anchor, SJCC posted the best U.S. JC marks to date in the 440 (41.1) and 880 (1:26.9) relays and the top California mark in the mile relay at 3:17.7 after a 48.6 third leg by Harris. The SJCC soph also won the open 100 in 9.8.

Harris long jumped 23-10½, as did Contra Costa's Marion Anderson, for an individual meet record and was the individual leader over Anderson on the basis of second best jump (23-5½ to 23-4½).

Harris' jump produced a team victory and record for San Jose too with a three man total of 68-10 $\frac{1}{2}$. He had to settle for the third best triple jump of the day, 44-7 $\frac{1}{2}$, but teammate Jerry Jackson was the leader there at 46-5 as the Jags took that event too (135-1)--but the team finally missed a meet record. Jackson was the U.S. JC leader last season in the 3-jump at 50-3 $\frac{1}{2}$.

SJCC also has hurdler-vaulter Sam Caruthers back for another season. The brother of national JC high jump record holder Ed Caruthers (7-1 $\frac{1}{2}$), Sam won the open highs (14.9) and had the best vault (15-0) in the GGC Relays. He did 14.6 and 15- $\frac{1}{4}$ last year.

ARIZONA MESA TOP NON-CALIFORNIA TEAM

Mesa, Ariz., has probably the top JC team ever assembled by a non-California junior college with the current U.S. JC leaders in the 100, 220, and 440, plus the 440 intermediates and javelin.

Mike Fray of course leads the sprints at 9.5, 20.5. Sophomore Neville Myton has the best JC mark in the 440 (47.9) and is second in the 880 (1:53.9). He's also done a 4:19.9 mile.

Expect the Hokoms to make some noises in the mile relay this season with Elmo Dees at 49.0 and Cal White at 49.3 already. They've run 3:20.5 in the four lapper so far but look like they could knock about ten seconds off that and threaten Pierce's 3:10.1 record.

Mesa's Bob Bagliani has the third best JC mark of the season in the two mile at 9:12.8. Lenard Gaskill leads the 440 intermediate hurdle list at 53.3 with teammate Don Kellar fourth at 54.9.

Larry Reed is fourth in the long jump list at 23-10 $\frac{1}{2}$ for Mesa.

The Hokoms have the fifth man in the discus in Gene Waddell at 160-7 $\frac{1}{2}$. Joe Wright ranks second in the javelin at 201-0 behind teammate Mark Murro.

Note regarding results of meet at bottom of page 8--Orange Coast engaged in a double dual with Mesa (Ariz.) and Santa Ana but we received four different results of this meet--ALL overlooking the fact that Mike Fray of Mesa bettered the national JC record for the 220 with a 20.6 clocking. Santa Ana's report of the meet has Ed Steward winning the 220 in 21.9 without any mention of Fray. Orange Coast's report lists Ralph Kelly of OCC as second in 21.9 without any mention of the winner (Fray). A Los Angeles Times report of the meet lists only the Santa Ana - Orange Coast score with no 220 mark listed. Finally an OCC press release resolved some of the situation. The release lists only the winning marks for each event, but carries all place names. This is the way the 220 finished: 1. Fray (Mesa) 20.6; 2. Steward (SA), 3. Kelly (OCC). We can't resolve another conflict, however. The summary lists the discus winner as Boubelik (Mesa) 155-1, followed by Johnson (SA). However the card from Santa Ana lists Mike Johnson of SA as the discus winner at 162-1. We would like to make one point here regarding reporting of results: Please list ALL marks from a meet which meet our qualifying standards--regardless of whether a competitor is from your school or not. Too often a home team will report only its own results and the visitor nothing.
