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FULLERTON JC WINS ALL-TIME CALIFORNIA DUAL MEET CHAMPIONSHIP

(Editor's note: With the end of April also signifying the close of the JC dual meet season, we thought the following story would be of interest to JC fans at this time of year. Don Nash is the compiler of the original all-time California JC track and field best lists.)

Fullerton JC would nip Pasadena CC, $70\frac{1}{2}$ - $65\frac{1}{2}$, for the mythical all-time California JC dual meet championship. This was determined by matching the junior colleges of the state against each other in dual meet competition, using the best all-time marks by the three top men in each event from each college (through the 1967 season).

MIKE FRAY TOPS JC 220 LISTS

Mike Fray, the Mesa (Ariz.) sophomore from Jamaica, now has the top all-time JC marks for both the 220 around a turn and on a straightaway, according to latest reports out of Arizona.

Fray ran 20.2 in a dual meet with Glendale (Ariz.) at Mesa on March 23 to better the straightaway mark of 20.3 set in 1962 by Dave Morris of Pasadena CC. Wind gauge reading was 0 miles per hour so mark will be submitted as a national JC record.

However Fray could still be deprived of the mark since it is no longer "legal" to run the 220 on a straightaway.

His earlier marks of 20.6 and 20.5 were run around a turn without the presence of a wind gauge so those marks cannot be submitted as bettering the listed 21.0 record by Lee Evans of San Jose CC in 1966 and Ronnie Ray Smith of Los Angeles CC last year.

According to Orange Coast coach Jim McIlwain, there was some aiding wind when Fray ran 20.6 at OCC and it was impossible to determine without a wind gauge if the wind was over the allowable limit.

Apparently Fray had another fast 220 in an April 6 meet with New Mexico Military and Taft since NMMI's Danny Houston ran 20.6 for second in the race, as reported by NMMI. Taft reported a 21.9 fifth place by Don Hall but neither school bothered to mention the winning time! No report from Mesa has been received.

The fine 1961 Fullerton team was the big point-getter for the Hornets, amassing $26\frac{1}{2}$ of the $70\frac{1}{2}$ points. The Eastern Conference powerhouse rolled up first places in seven of the 14 individual events and tied for another. Fullerton took the mile relay while Pasadena won the sprint relay.

Leroy Neal of the 1961 Fullerton team was the top individual scorer by winning the 880, finishing second in the mile, and running a leg on the mile relay team.

For the competition, events now on the state meet schedule were used with marks being adjusted where possible, i.e. 220 straightaway into 220 turn marks, etc.

In order to make it to the finals, Pasadena and Fullerton both surpassed all other schools with fine track and field histories, such as Mt. San Antonio, Santa Ana, Compton, Foothill, Los Angeles Pierce, Fresno CC, Hancock, Bakersfield, Long Beach CC, and San Diego CC.

We have just received information that Fray ran 20.4 to win the aforementioned race, with an aiding wind.

Fray is also closing in on the JC 100 record of 9.3 held by Contra Costa's Travis Williams (1964) and Santa Ana's Fred Kuller (1965). Fray ran 9.4 with just 2.0 mph assisting wind in the Glendale meet and had another 9.4 the following week against Phoenix.

He's getting some argument in the century from Clifford Branch of Wharton (Texas), who has also run 9.4 this season.

Dallas Baptist took the season long national JC 440 relay lead away from San Jose CC (41.1) last week with a 41.0 clocking and reportedly wants to come to California to race San Jose for the national JC record of 40.7 set last year by Hancock.

That brings up another point. The West Coast Relays at Fresno is always the top JC relay meet in the country, although just California teams are involved. We wouldn't want to propose knocking out any of the 18 top California teams that are allowed in each event but what about adding another section of teams to some of the top events so outstanding non-California teams could also take part.

We'd like to see such teams as Mesa and Glendale of Arizona and Odessa and Dallas Baptist of Texas compete against California's best.

Ed Conly of Citrus College also has a proposal for a post season meet (the week after the state meet) involving top JC athletes shooting for national records, but hasn't been able to get State Athletic Committee approval as yet for such a meet.

In last week's Southern California JC Relays at Cerritos, three Arizona teams competed, one in each of the three divisions.

Glendale (Ariz.) won the small (division I) and Mesa (Ariz.) the medium (division II) titles while Phoenix finished fourth in the large (division III) battle won by Fullerton JC.

We'll have a complete relay issue out next week, prior to the Mt. San Antonio and Northern California JC Relays.

Dallas Baptist will be competing in a meet with the Mexican National track team in Mexico City Saturday.
