Matthews Speeds to 44.4 in 400

SOUTH LAKE TAHOE (UPI)-Vince Matthews of Johnson C. Smith College ran the world's fastest 400 meters, 44.4 seconds Saturday, only minutes after Lee Evans cracked the world 600-meter record in a final high altitude tuneup meet among U.S. Olympic hopefuls.

Matthews eclipsed Tommie Smith's world mark of 44.5 set at San Jose, May 20. 1967, in 100-degree heat at the Olympic train-

ing site:

"I didn't think I was going as fast as I was, but everything went perfect; I had a perfect start," said Matthews following his record - shattering performance in the final intrasquad meet of candidates for the U.S. Olympic men's track and field team at 7.377-foot Echo Summit.

Evans, who ran the best 1968 American time of 44.9

in the 400 meters two weeks ago at South Lake Tahoe, chose the 600-meter race Saturday. He ran 1:14.3 to better the world mark of 1:16.5 set by Army Cpl. Tom Farrell a month ago at the same track.

Both Matthews and Evans were wearing a new type of track shoe with shorter spikes. Evans said the shoe made a difference in his performance but Matthews said he noticed no appreciable

change.

Jim Ryun made his first start at this high altitude training base and beat Roscoe Divine of the University of Oregon by 10 yards in 3:43 in the 1,500meter run.

Both Ryun, the world record holder at 3:33.1, and Divine, though, became so exhausted from the run they were sick on the sidelines for almost a half hour.

John Carlos lost in a photo to Mel Pender in the 100 with both clocking 10 seconds flat. Then Carlos won the 200 in 20.1, only a tenth of a second off the world mark also held by Tommie Smith. Clyde Glosson of Trinity (Tex.) University matched Carlos' 200 time.

Ron Whitney and Geoff Vanderstock turned in the best time in the world this year in the 400 intermediate hurdles — 49.5 seconds. The victory was given to Whitney after a check of the photos.

Russ Rogers nipped high schooler Bob Bornkessel in another heat of the 400 hurdles. Rogers was timed in 49.6 and Bornkessel in 49.8. Bornkessel's time was the best ever for a high school competitor.
