MEMORANDUM

Subject: Scratches and Coach's Meeting

There will be a scratch and seeding meeting in the West Madrone Room on the 4th floor of the Student Union at 7:30 p.m. on Thursday, May 16 for finalizing entries and drawing of heats. In chasing back through the action of the Conference, the qualifying standards for the current year are as follows:

100 - :09.8
220 - :21.7
440 - :48.2
880 - 1:53
Mile - 4:12
3 Mile - 9:15 for 2 or 14:20 for 3
Steeplechase - 9:25
High Hurdles - 14:6
Intermediate Hurdles - 53.5
440 Relay open to all teams
Mile Relay open to all teams
Triple Jump - 47'
Long Jump - 23'
High Jump - 6'4"
Shot Put - 64'
Discus - 160'
Javelin - 210'
Pole Vault - 15'

Each team is limited to a maximum of 24 entries and must have a minimum of 12. Every team is allowed to enter one man in an event whether they have met the qualifying standards or not. If there is more than one entry, each entry must have met the standard.

I have spoken with Tom Hamilton in the Conference office and the powers that be in the Conference have set up a meeting time for the track coaches from 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 noon on Sunday at the Sir Francis Drake Hotel in San Francisco. They then have made arrangements for the track coaches to have lunch with the Athletic Directors and Faculty Representatives on Sunday to meet with the Council immediately thereafter. In the past the track coaches have decided to meet on Friday evening after the trials to conduct their business and let one or two representatives attend the council meeting.

If this is your pleasure, I would like to hear from you immediately so I can make the necessary arrangements for a meeting room on Friday night.

I will tentatively set a meeting for 7:30 Friday evening and if you would rather meet Sunday, we can always cancel it. The meeting Friday evening will be on the 4th floor of Eshleman Hall, which is on Bancroft Way between Telegraph and Dana, just West of the Student Union building. If you decide to delay until Sunday morning, we can meet in San Francisco in the Sir Francis Drake Hotel.

In speaking with Tom Hamilton, he suggested the following items for our agenda of discussion and they are as follows:

- 1- Should we consider a Conference Indoor Championship?
- 2- How can we secure more publicity and spotlight our Conference Outdoor Championship?
- 3- Should we consider expanding our dual meet schedules to the point where we would meet six teams instead of five and crown a Conference Dual Meet Champion as well as a champion in the Championship Meet. The thought behind this is that there might be more interest from the public if league standings were kept and a dual meet would then be meaningful toward the Championship.
- 4- What about Cross Country Championships? He feels that if we can come in with a documented proposal of the importance of that championship to our track progress that we can still sell it to the Directors even though they have turned it down up to now.

In addition to the items mentioned above which Tom mentioned, I would personally like to see us discuss two more.

- 1- The frosh eligibility situation under NCAA rules and the action our Conference has taken. Then we can at least know where all of the track coaches stand in this regard and will be able to present our views to the Athletic Directors and Faculty Representatives.

2- The other point that I would like to bring up is combining the Freshman and Varsity meets. I personally am opposed to running the 2 meets together due to the fact that it is impossible to stay on a time schedule as listed in the rule book. I also personally feel that it makes it harder for the fan to concentrate on the Varsity competition and as a result, the interest for our Varsity meets has decreased. I know there are conflicting opinions on this but it is something I would like to discuss.

If any of you have anything to add to this agenda, please feel free to send it in to me and I will list it on the agenda items.

Would you please return the enclosed postal card with your preference of meeting time, either Friday or Sunday and also add any items you think should go on the agenda for discussion.
