Tommie Upset S.D. Meet

SAN DIEGO — San Jose American two-mile record in State's Lee Evans came through one of the afternoon's features, and Tommie Smith of the Santa Young, a Casa Grande, Ariz.,

And Tommie Smith of the Santa Clara Youth Village didn't in Saturday's Champions T r a c k and Field Meet.

Evans captured the 440 in 45.8, but Smith was upset while finishing a close second behind Jim Hines of the Houston Striders in the 220, with both runners being timed in 20.3.

In the 220 event, Smith protested the race because he thought he had won. He refused to appear on the victory stand, saying he wanted to look at the television picture of the race.

Smith holds the world record for 220 yards at 20 seconds flat.

Hurdler Earl McCullouch and sprinter Charlie Greene scored easy victories but were well off their world record times.

McCullouch, of the University of Southern California, won the 120 high hurdles in 13.6, four tenths slower than the world mark. Ron Copeland of the Southern California Striders upset Willie Davenport to finish second at 13.8. Davenport was timed in 13.9.

Greene, University of Nebraska gradute student, sped to a 9.3 victory in the century, defeating arch rival Hines by about two feet. Hines also was timed in 9.3, with the U.S. Army's Mel Pender third in

Randy Matson of the Houston Striders won the shot put with a toss of 68-7½, well short of his world mark of 71-5½.

Evans won the 440 by edging Arizona State's Ron Freeman, 45.9, and Vince Mathews of Johnson C. Smith University, 45 9
