Aztec Trackmen Fall, 120-25, To Powerful UCLA Bruins



AZTEC DISCUS THROWER — Dave Colgrove cuts loose during dual meet Saturday with UCLA at Westwood. The Aztec trackmen met one of their worst defeats in UCLA-SDS dual meets.

UCLA, one of the two strongest track teams in the country, soundly defeated its SDS counterpart, 120-25, in a dual meet on the Bruins' Trotter Field Saturday.

Despite the lopsided Bruin win, there were some very bright spots on the Aztec side, mostly in the middle and longer distances.

Colson Wins Mile

Miler John Colson started an unprecedented record-breaking parade by winning that event with a strong finishing kick in meet-record time, 4:07.3. This time puts Colson in the top ten in the country.

Sophomore Tom Ecklund also turned in an excellent early-season mark of 1:53.6 in the half-mile (880), in probably the most exciting race of the day. Only seven yards separated first and

third places.

Cross country All-American and team captain Greg Bagby ran a fine 9:12.6 two-mile for second place. This came after several weeks of injuries, and an unscheduled two-week "vacation" in Chicago to testify at the trial of Earle T. Cook, who was convicted of planting a bomb on the plane the NCAA Champion Aztec cross country team was returning on.

Bruins Take 16 of 17

The victory, which saw the Bruins win 16 of the 17 events, score five first-second-third place sweeps, and go one-two in four others, and turn in eight lifetime-best performances, as well as setting five meet records and tying another, was a costly one for the Uclans.

Pole vaulter Dick Railsback, a

member of the exclusive "17-foot Club," suffered a broken metacarpal bone leading to the little finger of his left hand. The shock from his shattering pole fractured the bone, and, he said, will sideline him for 3-4 weeks.

Among the excellent Bruin performances were: Johnny Johnson's double win in the 100, where he edged Harold Busby to win in 9.6, and long jump, 24-7½; Steve Marcus, who won the shot put with a 62-2¼ toss; Busby's 21.4 time in the 220; Don Domansky's win in the 440 with a 46.6 time; and George Hasaruk's 9:09.5 time in the two-mile.

In Frosh-JV competition, the Aztec Papooses scored 22 points to finish well behind the UCLA Brubabes' total of 51, and Fresno City College's 81.
