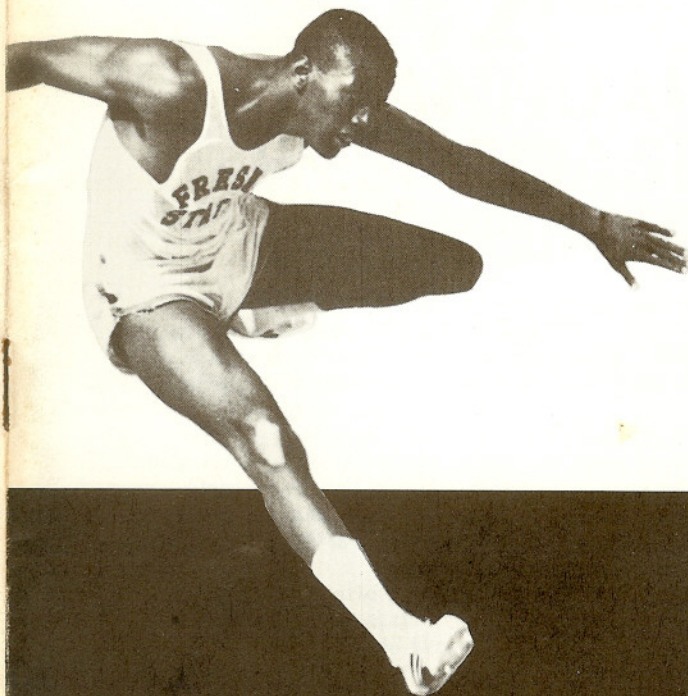

42ND ANNUAL WEST COAST RELAYS

The 42nd running of the West Coast Relays will be held in Ratcliffe Stadium on May 10th and 11th.

This, an Olympic Year, will see the top track and field athletes of the West gather at the WCR for one of the big tests prior to the great international meet.

It is expected that more than 2,000 competitors, the cream of the crop, in the college, university, open, junior college, high school and junior high school classes will invade Ratcliffe Stadium in a meet that should be as exciting and as high in quality of competition as its 41 predecessors.

Thirty six times World records have been set or tied and officially recognized at the West Coast Relays. Some 14 other times listed World records have been equalled or broken and have not been recognized because of excessive wind or other circumstances.

In addition, a dozen American records have been set during the WCR reign.

Among the National Junior College records, 47 have been broken at the WCR, including 10 of the currently listed top JC marks.

Also many American, National Collegiate, Collegiate Freshman, and National Intercollegiate marks have been established at the WCR.

The West Coast Relays' record list is a phenomenal total unequalled by any other meet of its kind in the country and well deserves the slogan of "Where World Records Are Broken."

Originally established to develop track and field in the San Joaquin Valley, the WCR has been the starting point of top competition for many of the World's greatest track and field stars.

Meet director Cornelius "Dutch" Warmerdam and his assistant Red Estes are already grooming the lightning fast Ratcliffe Stadium track for this year's great meet.

The WCR's Games Committee, Fresno State College and the city of Fresno extends to you an invitation to attend and participate in the 42nd running of the West Coast Relays, "Where World Records Are Broken."

INTERCOLLEGIATE AND OPEN CLASSES

The Games Committee has declared the intercollegiate class open to all unattached athletes with the exception of the relay events which will be open to intercollegiate competition only. Because this is an Olympic Year, three relays for Club Teams (440 yard, two mile and mile) have been added to the Saturday Program.

JUNIOR COLLEGE CLASS

Competition in the Junior College Division will begin with the pole vault, discus and long jump at 11:00 a.m., Saturday and on the track with the 440 yard relay at 12:30 p.m.

The Junior College Division (enrollment under 2000) distance medley relay (440-880-1320-mile) will be run on Friday at 3:26 p.m.

Entries in the Junior College Division individual events will be limited to JC athletes achieving or bettering the following minimum standards, set up by the JC coaches:

100 yard dash—9.7, 120 yard high hurdles—14.8, two mile run—9:40.0, high jump—6' 5", pole vault—14' 4", triple jump—46' 0", shot put—50' 0", discus—150' 0", long jump—23' 2", javelin—top six men over 180', 440 yard intermediate hurdles—12 best times.

HIGH SCHOOL CLASS

High school competition will begin with the discus, long jump, pole vault and the heats in the 120 yard high hurdles at 4:00 p.m. Friday.

The following standards set up by the HS coaches of the CIF-Central Section will govern the entries into competition:

distance medley relay—10:50.0, mile relay—3:30.0 and not more than 24 teams, two mile relay—8:20.0, 100 yard dash—10.0 (3 heats, 9 in each, 27 total entries), 120 yard high hurdles—15.0 (3 heats, 9 in each, 27 total entries), shot put—52' 0", discus—150' 0", high jump—6' 1", long jump—22' 3", pole vault—13' 0", two mile run—10:0.0, 440 yard relay class A—44.0 (top 24 teams in 4 sections), 440 yard relay class B—46.0 (top 12 teams), 440 yard relay class C—47.0 (top 6 teams)

JUNIOR HIGH SCHOOLS OF FRESNO

All junior high schools of Fresno will compete Friday at 3:14 p.m. in the finals of the 440-yard relay.

FRESNO COUNTY ELEMENTARY SCHOOLS

Fresno County Elementary Schools (Enrollment under 500) 440 yard relay will be held Friday at 3:00 p.m. and Fresno County Elementary Schools (Enrollment over 500) will be held at 3:06 p.m.

INTERCOLLEGIATE AND OPEN CLASSES

Intercollegiate and Open competition will start with the discus and javelin at 1:00 p.m. Saturday.

RULES OF COMPETITION

The WCR will be conducted under the rules of the National Collegiate Athletic Association and the California Interscholastic Federation.

All teams and/or individuals will be timed in any races run in sections.

Scoring — relays will be scored 12 - 8 - 6 - 4 - 2, individual events will be scored 6 - 4 - 3 - 2 - 1. Open division clubs, non-collegiate individuals and freshmen will not be scored.

CALIFORNIA INTERSCHOLASTIC FEDERATION

The California Interscholastic Federation has officially sanctioned the high school division. The high school division is sponsored by Edison High School.

AWARDS

Attractive watches will be awarded to the competing members of winning relay teams and to the winners of first places in all special intercollegiate, open and open junior college events.

Tie clasps will be awarded to the competitors placing second and third in all special intercollegiate and open junior college events.

Tie clasps will also be awarded to the competing members of the first, second and third place relay teams in the junior college division (enrollment under 2000) and in the interscholastic division and to the first three places in the interscholastic division special events.

Team trophies will be awarded to the first three team places at the 42nd West Coast Relays.

CERTIFICATION OF IMPLEMENTS

All implements for the Friday events must be checked by the inspector before 3:30 p.m. at the Ratcliffe Stadium, May 10, 1968. This check will relieve congestion and delay.

The implements used in the Saturday afternoon competition must be checked by the inspector at the Ratcliffe Stadium starting at 10 a.m.

Anyone using illegal equipment will be disqualified and their amateur standing will be jeopardized.

FILING OF ENTRIES

Entries will be closed April 27th at midnight. A fee of \$1.50 must accompany each entry filed before that time. A fee of \$2.50 must accompany each entry filed after the closing date. Make all checks for entry fees payable to West Coast Relays. All entrants must be eligible under the conference rules governing the competing institution which they represent or of the California Interscholastic Federation if they are high school entrants.

TIME SCHEDULE

All events will be run at the time scheduled. It is the responsibility of all competitors to be at the starting

line ready for competition five minutes before the scheduled time of the event. Your cooperation is solicited to insure the proper conduct of the meet according to the time schedule.

SLOGAN

"Where World Records Are Broken." is the official slogan of the West Coast Relays based on the fact that thirty-seven World records have been broken and six tied during the 41 years the carnival has been held.

ELIGIBILITY

Eligibility forms must accompany the entry blanks which are to be mailed to Edward M. Piston, Director of Publicity, Fresno State College, Fresno, California, Zip Code 93726, by April 26, 1968. Entry blanks will be mailed from Fresno on or before April 12, 1968.

HOTEL ACCOMMODATIONS

Visiting teams are expected to make their own hotel reservations and are urged to arrange for them at the earliest possible date, in order to assure proper accommodations. Information on hotels may be obtained by addressing Harold Beatty, Fresno State College.

DRAWINGS

The Games Committee will arrange the heats and draw lanes for the Intercollegiate and Open competition. The respective committees will arrange the draws in the high school and junior college competition.

PUBLICITY

Widespread publicity will be given competitors and institutions entered in the West Coast Relays. To accomplish this your cooperation is essential. Information on all athletes, news and feature stories and pictures will help your institution as well as the Relays.

Photographs are desired for newspapers, magazines and the official program. Photos of relay teams are particularly desirable.
