# Penrose Leads Scot Spikers To CCS Victory

SAN MATEO—The SPAL set 10 meet records and won 11 of 16 events to take charge at the Central Coast Section Region I Track and Field Championships at College of San Mateo Saturday.

Carlmont won the unofficial team title with 35 points,

while Sequoia finished second with 31 and Menlo-Atherton captured fourth place, one point away from third with 20.

The top five qualifiers in each event will be entered in the final State Meet qualifying test Saturday at Gonzales High in the Southern-most section of the CCS.

Carlmont got a lift in the second race of the day when high hurdler Jim Miller won the highs with a surprising 14.5 upset victory over a strong field.

His teammates followed in suit as Jim Penrose established himself as the No. 2 discus thrower among high school throwers in the United States this year with a heave of 181-11 and followed with another meet record in the shot put with a toss of

Pole vaulter Eric Reich added another first place ribbon to the Carlmont bundle as he found a new pole to his liking and rocketed to a meet record in that event with a jump of 13-61/2.

Chris Carey added the final first and meet record to the Scots' total by topping an outstanding two-mile field. The lanky junior kept pace with three other runners for seven laps, but broke the race open with a sprint in the last 220 to win with a 9:22.9 clocking.

All the SPAL success didn't belong to the Scots, as Menlo-Atherton's Bill Hatcher won the 100 (9.9) and the 220 (21.9) and anchored the Bears to victory in the 440 relay in meet record time of 43.3.

Sequoia's Darryl White ran his usual superb anchor on the winning mile relay team and won the open 440 with a good time of 49.5. Don Willis, Greg Willis and Gene Currey teamed up with White to win the relay in one of the fastest times in Northern California (3:20.8)

The only other SPAL first came in the 880 where Paly's Bill Respini outclassed the field with a 1:56.8 time to post another meet record.

Another fine performance came in the 180 low hurdles where South San Francisco's Ashland Whitfield got off a tremendous start to chop a second off the meet record with a time of 19.0. Keith Peters of Gunn and Frazier Leslie of Woodside finished in order with 19.4 clockings.

gan of San Mateo.


