





## HONORARY REFEREES

On April 3, 1915, in Fresno, California, the first annual California State Track and Field Championships were held.

Among those contesting for the coveted honor of being State Champions were the men we honor today. Many athletes over the past fifty meets have strived to become State Champions. The men who were able to achieve this goal are with us today to celebrate this Golden Anniversary Championship Meet.

The games committee was able to contact the following three 1915 State Champions.

Mr. Gerald Blankenship, competing

for Visalia High School, won the 880 yard run in 1:59.8 and repeated that same day with a victory in the mile run with a time of 4:30.0. Mr. Blankenship still resides in Visalia.

Mr. Lincoln Hall, competing for Santa Paula High School, was the first pole vault champion with a fine leap of 11' 6". He repeated as state champion in 1916 with a vault of 11' 9". Mr. Hall presently resides in Santa Paula.

Mr. Millard Webster, also competing for Santa Paula High School, won the first high jump competition with a jump of 5' 9½". Mr. Webster presently resides in Santa Ana and is the proud

father of two-time Olympic champion, Bob Webster (platform diving—Rome and Tokyo).

It is not often that we are able to honor such fine men. These men established a tradition that still exists and makes the California State Meet the greatest of its kind in the world.

May you all join with us in honoring these men in their past accomplishments and in the realization that they were an instrumental part of setting worthwhile goals for every young man who has put on a pair of spikes and stepped into the wonderful world of track and field.

# Some Observations

California Interscholastic Federation Track and Field Championships are famed for their tremendous team and individual battles. There is no reason to suspect it will be any different in this 50th annual event in Berkeley's Edwards Stadium.

This Golden Anniversary affair is wide open. Fact is, there probably has been no year when so many teams were in contention for the championship won last year by Muir of Pasadena and its triple winner, Jerry Proctor. There should be no triple winner this time and a number of schools have a chance to claim the championship.

Compton fielded one of the finest dual meet teams in prep history, but the Tarbabes are just one of a number in the running for team laurels. At least a dozen schools, widely scattered throughout the state, are entertaining championship ideas.

Individual headliners are many. The high jump figures as the feature attraction, but it is just one event boasting outstanding talent. Two of the high jumpers have registered the best leaps in high school history at the time this was written, and there was another threatening the 7-foot mark. Otis Hailey (Wasco) leaped 7'1¼" just a week after defending champion Reynaldo Brown (Compton) had done 7'0½". Brown later did 7'0¾" and he's known as a tough competitor despite the fact he's only a junior. He won last year at 6'9¼", best-ever jump by a sophomore. Pat Bradford, Brown's teammate at Compton, had scaled 6'11¾" and 6'11" in successive weeks and loomed as another possibility for the 7-foot club.

Hailey is one of at least three national leaders in the field, and one of two national record holders in the competition. The others are juniors Heulon Hewett, who is a National Federation record holder in the long jump, and Isaac Curtis, a low hurdler from Santa Ana. Hewett has long jumped 25'10¾" and Curtis has skipped over the 180 lows in 18.6

Curtis also runs the 120 high barriers in 14.0 and is one of the favorites in this event.

There is no clear-cut favorite in the sprints, but there are plenty in the 9.5 and 9.6 bracket who promise to give the place judges their share of problems.

Edesel Garrison (Centennial of Compton) renews his 440 battle with Andy Young (Long Beach Jordan) where each has run 47.6 and astounding 46.6 anchor legs of relay teams.

Greg Jones (Long Beach Poly) would appear to be the class of the field off his 1:50.6 in the 880, but races from the half-mile on up often produce upsets.

Tom Davidson (El Cajon) looms as the choice in the mile, with his qualifying time of 4:09.1, while any number of outstanding runners could win the two-mile.

Although the high jump rates as the feature, other field events should produce more than just good competition. The weights, for instance, feature Jim Penrose (Carlmont) in the discus and Pete Shmock (San Dieguito of Encinitas) in the shot put, but neither is a cinch with a number of strong-armed athletes looking for gold.

If the name Bob Richards sounds familiar to pole vault fans, it should. Bob represents Bonita High of La Verne and he's the son of the former Olympic champion with the same name. The younger Bob has nearly matched his famed father's all-time best with a 15-2 effort this year. But that might not be good enough, because there are many competitors at 14-6 or better, any of whom could win on a hot day.

The team crown could very well hinge on the newest items in the state meet—440 and mile relays instead of the 880. The 440 baton event will get the meet off to a blazing start and the mile relay will climax what should be the greatest of all the 50 State cinderfests. Centennial of Compton looms strong in both (41.3 and 3:18.2), and so does Lincoln of San Diego (41.6 and 3:17.4).
