Philadelphia, Pa., March 1 (from Jim Dunaway)—A career that could have ended ***mark** bitterly for George Young had he quit four months ago, closed triumphantly tonight. George decided after the Olympics that rather than squander his fine form, he'd carry on with racing another has few months, possibly wiping away some of ***tax** diasppointment over a Games race he thought he should have won.

Just as he'd done in his last two-mile race a week ago, Amargander young dropped his characteristic run-just-to-win patience and boldly went for a record. No record tie this time. He blastedx 3.8 seconds off Ron Clarke's still-fresh three-mile mark with 13:09.8 at the AAU championships. In his last race-he insisted it was "unless someone pays me to race again-he got his first outright world record. And he retired with his 17-race hoard of indoor victories intact, two years without a loss.

Undoubtedly, George's splendid last effort proved to be the highlight of the Slst national championships yiew by XXXX 7031 at the hilf-filled Spectrum. Another of the east's series of snowstorms cut the example turnout for the meet that had all the men's and women's events crowded into a single 12-hour day of compatition. For the meet's one-year return to the east coast (it'll be in Salt Lake fity in 1969 1970); and the first meet in the the track was imported.

As much was at stake in this AAU meet as any in the past—notably places on the 30-member US team that will face the USSR and West Germany later this month, plus three other smaller kwax foreign tours. Yet overall the field here was rather small and underrepresented by the nation's top trackmen. The was rather small and underrepresented by the nation's college conference meets (Southeaster, Big Eight and Big Ten) drew away talent. The outdoor season already has begun in the southwest and west, and that combined with the distance factor kept away nearly allx westerners but those with the powerful club teams—winner Pacific Coast, second-place

Etxidex Southern California Striders and fifth-place Houston Striders.
