

Larry Highbaugh, Indiana -- Long Jump

"Not having to run a 440 relay race helped out alot today. I had to compete in the 100 and 220 and fortunately was able to get off my best jump before having to run the 220. I wasn't worried when Glenn Dick took the lead at 24-6½ because I feel I can get over 25 feet if I can hit the board at full speed. On the winning jump, I would have been over 25 except I dragged my foot a little on the landing. The worst of my five jumps was 23-10 and that's the most consistent I've been all season."

Rich Fuhs, Indiana -- Discus

"This means more to me than winning the Big Ten Medal of Honor. I'd finished second and third as a sophomore and junior and so a win under those circumstances was even more gratifying. The wind bothered all of us and that's why we didn't get over 170. I was still a little disappointed I didn't throw over 170 since I'd been over that most of the season. Winning is still the most important thing and I'm really happy to finish my career in this way."

DISCUS CHAMPION . . .

RICH FUHS, INDIANA -- 169' 11½" . . . senior from Oshkosh, Wis. (20-6-0 - 22) . . . finished 3rd in 1968 (168' 0") . . . 2nd in 1967 (177' 10½"). His best performance of the season was 176' 7", a non-winning performance in the Big State Meet at Terre Haute on May 6. Recent winner of the Big Ten Medal of Honor (3.833 GPA) for Indiana

Defending champion -- Jim Brubaker of Illinois -- had gone into the meet with the best performance of the season -- 178' 1".

LARRY HIGHBAUGH, INDIANA -- ~~24~~ 24' 7½" . . . sophomore from Indianapolis (Washington) (5-9 - 158 - 19) . . . finished 5th in the 1969 indoor meet (23' 2½") . . .

"I wasn't too pleased with my start today and that's what kept me from running faster. As usual, I run to beat my teammate Mike Goodrich, because if I beat him, I win. We were counting on going one-two in the race, no matter who won, and I was happy we could do that."

Pat Murphy, Wisconsin -- 400 Intermediate Hurdles

"I only had the third fastest time for the season but felt I had a chance to win. I'd had a pulled muscle earlier in the season and once it healed, I started improving each week. I usually try to run so that I can finish strong and I was able to do that today. Our team has good momentum going and that helps."

Jeff McLellan, Illinois -- Shot Put

"Until two weeks ago, I was bothered with a sprained finger and that kept me from having a good outdoor season. I'd had a good indoor season and hurt the finger in the last meet. That was my best throw of the year and made up for an otherwise undistinguished season."

My teammate, Don Vandrey, is in alot better shape than I am and therefore I let him set the pace. I decreased my training after the NCAA indoors and began working hard two weeks ago to peak for this meet and the plan worked out."

Fred Lands, Wisconsin -- 3,000 Steeplechase

"This was a complete surprise to me. I thought maybe I might place fifth but first was totally unexpected. My best time going into the race was only 9:27 and I managed to cut it to 9:00.5. I remember looking around with two laps to go and couldn't believe I was 20 yards ahead. Most of my training has been of the distance nature and I think this helped me keep my pace going and gave me an advantage today over the runners who do more sprint work."

"This was my only event today, and I guess I felt just right. Everything was perfect. I had to be to break the old record by nearly three feet."

DEAN MARTELL, Wisconsin -- Three-Mile Run

"Imagine that," Martell puffed and gasped, "winning this event has to be the top event in my career. There were at least four guys in there who had better times previously than I had. I hadn't been running well all season, had a bad leg, but the last two or three weeks things began to get better. This has to be the best performance for me. My best previous time had been 14:12.2, but what was it today? Someone said 14:07. I can't believe it."

### Larry Highbaugh, Indiana -- 220

"I was real happy with my start in this race. I came out of the blocks with Mike (Goodrich) and anytime I do that it's a good start. He's really fast coming out and does it consistently. Once I got started, I was able to accelerate when I wanted to."

### Tim Heikkila, Minnesota -- High Jump

"I wasn't too happy with the way I was jumping today but was happy to win. It was the second time I've cleared 7-0 this season but I was jumping a lot better the first time I did it. We had real good competition today with five men clearing 6-8. I was a little worried going at 7-0 because Gary Hauptert (Indiana) had fewer misses than I did and I had to get over that to win."

INDIANA -- :40.1 . . . new Big Ten meet record . . . ties all-time Big Ten record, originally set by Illinois in winning the event in the 1964 NCAA Championships.

1. MIKE GOODRICH -- sophomore from East St. Louis, Ill. . . . won the 1969 indoor 300-yard dash championship . . . 5-9, 150, 20.
2. KEN LUNDGREN -- junior from Pembroke, Mass . . . 5-10, 153, 20.
3. JIM RICKS -- sophomore from Brooklyn, N.Y. . . . 6-2, 163, 19.
4. LARRY HEMBROUGH -- sophomore from Indianapolis (Washington) . . . won the long jump championship Friday . . . in the indoor meet last March was 5th in the 60-yard dash and 3rd in the 300.

This is the third year this event has been held. Indiana won the first 440-yard relay title in 1967, setting the record of :41.1.

3000-METER STEEPLECHASE CHAMPION --

FRED LANDS, WISCONSIN -- sophomore from Elkhart, Ind. . . . was Indiana state 2-mile championship and set the state record. Placed second in the National Junior Chamber of Commerce mile in 1967. Broke Don Gehrman's Wisconsin freshman two mile record (9:05.0).

(Defending champion in the event was Mike Fischer of Ohio State.)

The second place finisher, Rollie Kitt of Iowa, won the event in 1967, the first year it was on the Big Ten championship program. He established the initial record of 9:09.9.

660-YARD RUN CHAMPION --

MARK WINZENRIED, WISCONSIN -- sophomore from Monroe, Wis. . . . Big Ten record and all-time Big Ten record. Old all-time mark was 1:16.7 by John Spain of Michigan State in the 1967 Big Ten championships.

Was ranked No.1 in the World after the 1968 indoor track season in the 880 (1:50.1) was in the national USTF 880 title. Was Wisconsin state 880 and 440 champion, setting records in both events.

SHOT PUT CHAMPION --

JEFF McCLELLAN, ILLINOIS -- 3rd individual Big Ten title,  
first outdoors . . . won the 1968 and 1969 indoor shot  
put championships.

A senior from St. Louis, Mo. . . . 6-2, 233, 21 . . .  
place second in the shot put last season after suffering  
a wrist injury two weeks prior to the meet. The injury  
still bothers him.

Defending champion, Jim Arbuckle of Indiana, finished  
second.

220-YARD DASH CHAMPION --

LARRY HIGHBUGH, INDIANA -- 3rd title of the meet . . . Jesse  
Owens of Ohio State was the last to get more than two  
individual titles in a meet, he had four in 1935 --  
100, 220, 220 lows and broad jump, plus anchoring the  
mile relay team.

880-YARD RUN CHAMPION --

RAY ARRINGTON, WISCONSIN -- wins his 8th Big Ten individual
