# Conquerors Of Weeks

## Stars Blister Sheppard

### Nine Thinclads Qualify For AAU

The first-night crowd of 3,500 saw 10 Sheppard track records shattered and nine men qualify for the National AAU Meet, June 28-29 in Miami, Fla., as the 1969 Interservice Track and Field Championships got off to a flying start.

Qualifying for the National AAU were Stan McDonald, U.S. Army, with a discus toss of 191-9½; David Atkins and Jeoff Vanderstock of the Army and Valgene Scherling of the Navy in the 440 yard hurdles; James Kemp of the Army with a 46.1 time in the 440 yard dash; William Crawford of the Air Force and Johnny Gilder of the Army in the high jump; and Tracy Smith and Doug Wiebe of the Army in the 3 mile run.

McDonald's discus win got things off to a fast start, and barely had the crowd settled in their seats than Atkins ran a record-shattering 440 yard hurdles in 50.6, joined by Vanderstock and Schetling in AAU qualifying time.

Robert Green, Air Force 120 high hurdle champ, coasted to a win in his heat, and will be joined by Gregory McGee, Navy; Tom Gillette, Army; Albert Rockwell, Air Force; Dale Frederick, Army and Valgene Scherling, Navy in the finals Wednesday night.

William Crawford, who was nosed out of the AF high jump title this year, regained his form to win the high jump at 6-11, and barely missed the seven foot mark. His win was good enough to qualify for the AAU. Johnny Gilder of the Army, also registered a leap of 6-11, while qualifying.

James Kemp of the Army shattered still another Sheppard track record while qualifying for the 440 yard dash with a time of 46.1.

Army made it a family affair in the 3 mile run, with Tracy Smith and Doug Wiebe placing one and two, both finishing in qualifying AAU times.

While not eligible to run as a team in the AAU, the Army 440 relay team of LeBlanc, Frey, Means and Pender, broke the Sheppard track record, blazing to a 40.4 win, followed by Air Force at 41.3.

Action Wednesday night will include the much heralded battle of champions in the 100 yard dash. Running for the title will be Dalton LeBlanc, Mel Pender and Jim Means of the Army; Eli Smith of the Marines; John Green and Lester Sutton of the Navy and Jon Young of the Air Force. All the entires have covered the distance in under 9.5 this year.

Another top race is expected in the 220 yard dash finals featuring Robert Frey and David Atkins of the Army; George Wilhite and Tyrone Cunningham of the Air Force; and Eli Smith and Calvin Armstrong of the Marines.

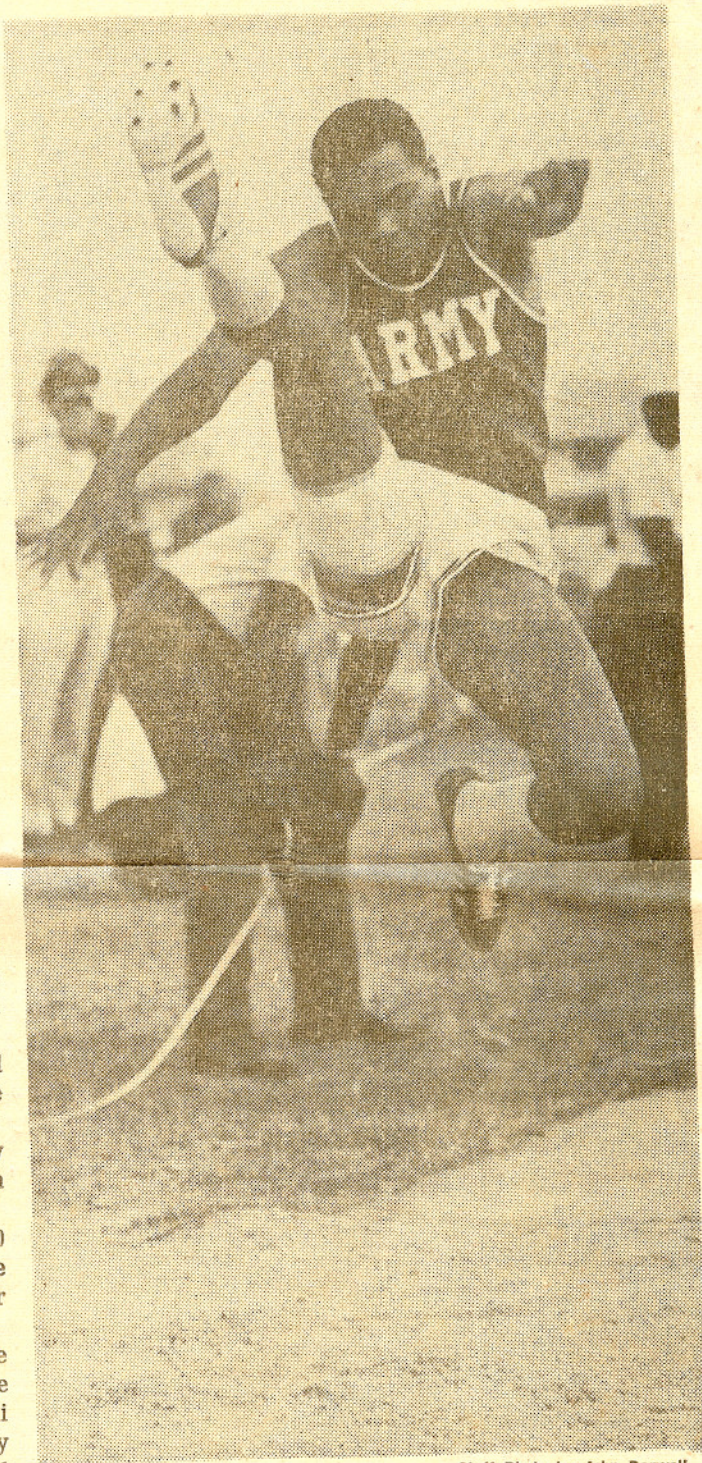
While no official team totals are kept in Interservice track competition, since all men are competing for individual honors, Army has steamrolled their way to an unofficial team total of 68 Tuesday night, followed by Air Force with 21; the Marines with 16 and the Navy with six.

The second night action starts at 5 p.m. with the hammer throw followed at 7 p.m. by the shot put and triple jump. The pole vault will start at 8 p.m.

Field events include the 100 yard dash at 8 p.m., to be followed by the 1 mile run, the 120 yard hurdles finals, the 3,000 meter steeplechase, the 200 yard dash finals, the 3,000 meter steeplechase, the 200 yard dash finals, the six mile run and the one mile relay.

The Air Force track and field committee, headed by Lt. Col. William M. Tooke, deserves much credit for the manner in which the interservice championships are being conducted.

Area track fans coming to Sheppard for the final night of action are urged to utilize the Sheppard Main Gate to reach the track, which is located immediately behind the new gym.

Although team point standings were not kept, Army cindermen completely dominated the annual affair, winning 16 of the 20 events.

Air Force won two events while the Marines and Navy copped one event apiece.
