

Second 60-Yard World Mark In 2 Days Set by Davenport

LOS ANGELES — (AP) — Olympic pole vault champion Bob Seagren of the University of Southern California boosted his own world indoor record by a quarter of an inch last night when he cleared 17 feet 6 inches at the 10th annual Times Indoor Games.

Seagren, who has an outdoor record of 17-9 pending approval, became the only man left in the competition when he cleared 16-6 and then he went over 17-1 before asking that the bar be raised to 17-6.

When he cleared that, it bettered the record of 17-5 $\frac{3}{4}$ he established at Albuquerque last Jan. 25.

Seagren missed three tries attempting to become the first man ever to clear 18 feet but nevertheless was voted the outstanding athlete of the meet.

pion, led all the way to post the second fastest time ever for an indoor 1000-yard run at 2:06.3, surpassed only by New Zealand's Peter Snell, who has run a 2:06.0

Josef Plachy of Czechoslovakia took second in 2:08.0 in the meet at the Forum.

George Young, the 31 year old Casa Grande, Ariz., school teacher, posted his 16th straight indoor victory when he outlegged Australia's Kerry O'Brien in an 8:24.4 two mile. O'Brien took second in 8:43.0.

Seagren was vaulting for the second straight night, having won at the Will Rogers Games Friday night in Ft. Worth at 16-6.

Another Olympic champion, Willie Davenport of the Houston Striders, also posted

back-to-back victories for the same two meets and equalled the world record of 6.8 seconds for the 60-yard hurdles for the second straight time. Gary Powers of Southern California Striders ran his lifetime best of 7.0 for second place.

Other winners before a crowd of 13,736 were Charlie Greene of Nebraska's Cornhusker Track Club who beat San Jose State's Ronnie Ray Smith by a stride in the 60, in 6.0; Lee Evans, who raced 57.0 in the 500 for a victory; Neal Steinhauer, former Oregon star, with a 62-11 shot put, and Ed Caruthers of the Pacific Coast Club, who won with 6-11 in a jump off for the high jump title.

Barbara Ferrell an Olympian from the Los Angeles Mercuresses twice defeated Poland's Irena Szewinska. First she won the 60-yard dash timed in 6.7. Later, Miss Ferrell captured the 300-yard run in 36.2.

Formosa's Che Cheng won the women's 60-yard hurdles in 7.9 seconds as West Germany's Heide Rosendahl finished fourth and last. Jan Glotzer of Phoenix was second in 8.0 with Janene Jatton of the Angel track club from the state of Washington third at 8.2. Miss Rosendahl was timed in 8.4.

West Germany's Jurgen May won the mile run in 4:05.8, followed by Poland's Henryk Szordykowski in 4:06.7. John Lawson of the Pacific Coast Club and early pacesetter Bob Day of the Southern California Striders timed in 4:06.9 and 4:08.9, respectively.
