RUSTON --- Louisiana Tech sprinter Don King and jumper Bill Ebarb would be happy if these last two weeks of the track and field season are as fruitful as the past one.

In two meets, King tied the school 100-yard dash record and helped break the 440-yard relay record, won four races and anchored two winning relays and scored 28 points to take over the team scoring lead again.

Ebarb, a freshman from Shreveport, placed in six events and tallied 24 points.

The Bulldogs run in the Northeast Invitational at Monroe this Saturday before the big one Saturday, May 10--the Gulf States Conference championships at the Ruston High School track.

Coach Jim Mize's crew finished second twice last week in near-successes, losing to Northeast by three points in a triangular Wednesday and to McNeese State by one-half point in a five-team meet at Natchitoches Saturday night.

King, a junior co-captain from Overton, Tex., tied Pat Garrett's 1959 record in the 100 with a 9.5 clocking in the triangular, then did even better with a 9.3 in Natchitoches, but it was wind-aided and will not count as a school mark.

He also ran his best 220-yard dash of the season with a 21.3 and helped Robbie Albright, Jerome Vascocu and Claude Williams to a school record 41.0 in the 440-yard relay.

King now has 69 1/4 points this season, easily best on the

squad despite the fact he missed three meets. He has scored 203 1/4 points for Tech in his career.

His 100 and 220 times are the best in the GSC this year and Tech's 440 relay shares that honor with Southeastern Louisiana.

Hurdler Ken Rorie, a junior from Shreveport, trails King with 61 points. He has the GSC's fastest time in the 440-yard intermediate hurdles with a 53.5.

Ebarb's speciality is the high jump and he has cleared 6-6 or better three straight meets with a best of 6-8. But he set the school triple jump record last week with a 46-9½ leap and got a career best of 23-4½ in the long jump.

Sophomore Dale Williams, with two first places in the pole vault, has 39 points. He won by clearing 14-6 both times, but missed at 15-feet in an attempt to break his school record of 14-10.

School record-setting javelin thrower Mike Guzman has scored 37 points and junior hurdler Wayne Mollere has 36 and ranks right behind Rorie in the intermediate hurdles with a 54.0.

Spindly junior Tommy Turner took a first place in the triple jump Saturday with a 46-6 effort. It was his first win of the year in the jumps, although he had finished second in five events.

It was also a good week for freshman hurdler Phil O'Bryant, who had his best of 14.4 in winning the high hurdles Saturday, and sprinter Robbie Albright, whose track season was interrupted by a four-week stint in spring football. Still rounding into shape, he had a wind-aided 9.5 in the 100 Saturday and finished second to King in the 220.
