Divine Dead Last in Mile

KNOXVILLE, Tenn. (Special) — Roscoe Divine was frank about it after finishing a surprising dead last in the mile run trials here Thursday on the opening day of the 1969 NCAA meet.

"No, I didn't want to come on the trip," Oregon's No. 1 miler said,

Divine, a sub-four-minute runner with a best clocking of 4:01.3, this year had just finished running as if he hadn't wanted to be on the track.

He was last at the start of the race and finished far behind everyone. "I just died with 660 left," he said. Officially he was given a "no time," but he was clocked unofficially at 4:15.

Summing up the disappointing climax to a sub-par season Divine said, "I'm pretty sure that Bowerman (coach Bill) wanted to humiliate me so I'd get tough next year. I just didn't have it all year."

Divine, who planned to leave Knoxville Thursday night for six weeks of ROTC summer camp at Fort Lewis, Wash., said he got "screwed up in my desire" over the past nine months.

Explaining why he didn't want to compete in the NCAA meet Divine said, "It's no damn fun to get in races against people like that when you know you're not in shape."

Divine — who has another year of eligibility remaining said he intends to return to Eugene immediately after summer camp and begin hard training again so he will become "tough" again next year.

CARLOS, SJS WIN NCAA SPIKE TITLE

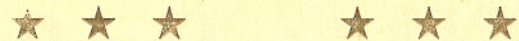

KNOXVILLE, Tenn. — Kansas gambled and lost — San Jose State played it cool and won.



That sums up the Spartans' greatest athletic achievement as they won the NCAA track and field championship on a day which saw their brilliant captain, Lee Evans, upset by a world record performance in the greatest 440 - yard run in the history of the sport.

Kansas attempted to dou-

ble fabulous Jim Ryun and the strategy backfired as he was upset by Martin Liquori of Villanova in the mile and then dropped out of the three - mile 70 minutes later during the running of the fifth lap.

Coach Bud Winter's Spartans had 48 points on the board, and the Jayhawks had 45 and needed at least a fourth place finish by Ryun in the three - mile to claim the championship.

Going into the meet, Winter had refused to bow to

Capt. Evans' request that he be allowed to double in the 220 in an attempt to capture the team title he dreamed of winning.



Kansas started the day with 30 points, while the Spartans had only 16, but John Carlos delivered the 30 points he promised by adding the 220 diadem to the 100 - yard crown he won Friday and anchoring the 440 - yard relay team to victory in 39.1 as the event was held during a driving rain storm.
