Makeshift Relay Team Saves Win for Trojans

Oregon won nine events, USC won nine events and it all went down to the mile relay.

The Trojans had a 4:14.9 miler and a 1:52.5 half-miler who couldn't even place in their individual events, but Carl Trentadue and Rich Joyce ran like scared rabbits in the relay to team with Monty Turner and Lennox Miller for a meet record 3:11.2 and an 81½-72½ dual meet victory Saturday at the Coliseum.

It was Miller's fourth race and each was a winning one. The Olympic silver medalist glided to 9.6 and 21.0 sprint victories, anchored the 40.1 440 ries, anchored the relay team and ran the fastest mile relay lap, 46.9, to give Trentadue a 20 yard lead for the anchor lap.

Trentadue, who had been unable to prevent an oregon 1-2-3 sweep in the mile, looked more like a quarter-miler as he hurried to a 47.5 to stave off the giant Webfoot, Gary

Knoke.

Split Pair

The 26-year-old Knoke, who stands 6-3, had earlier split a pair of hurdle duels with versatile Herman Franklin, the Trojan transfer from Harbor JC. Franklin took the highs in 14.1, but lost a five-yard lead after clearing final hurdle in the i the mediates. When Franklin twice turned to look for Knoke, the big Australian Olympic veteran stormed ahead inches from the tape. Both were clocked in 51.7.

Franklin also took a surprise second in the triple jump behind team-mate Howard Pratt after finishing third in the long jump and running as replacement for the injured Rich Coulter on the winning sprint relay team.

The most impressive sight at the Coliseum was freshman Edesel Garrison cruising to a Trobabe record of 46.2 in the 440. It broke the 46.6 set by Rupert Hoilett in 1966. Hoilett, incidentally, was in the same race Saturday, nishing third in 49.4, as Oregon's Ron Couser, a Hamilton High product, Hamilton High product, won the official 440 in

"This is what track's all about," said an elated USC coach Vern Wolfe. "They did well, but we came through when we had to.

Oregon coach Bill Bowerman was nearly as pleased as Wolfe.

"We hit our maximum potential," said the veteran coach, "I had expected no more than 70 points and we beat that. But it was tough to come that close and miss."
