Cal State Long Beach's participation in the California Collegiate Athletic Association will officially come to a close this weekend.

A charter member in the new Pacific Coast Athletic Association, Long Beach's last official act as a CCAA school will come in its track and field championships Friday and Saturday.

Competition is scheduled for 5 p.m. both days at Cal State Los Angeles.

It will be the second conference championship meet in as many weeks for Jack Rose's 49ers, who finished in a tie for fourth in the PCAA meet last weekend.

San Jose State captured the title with 185 points, followed by San Diego State with 138, Fresno State with 84, Cal State Long Beach and the University of the Pacific with 61, UC Santa Barbara with 37 and Cal State Los Angeles with 12.

Top Long Beach performance was turned in by Al Carlson, who chased Lee Evans of San Jose State in the 440. The Olympic gold medal winner won the race in 45.8 as Carlson clocked a life-time best of 47.8.

Also over the weekend Cal State Long Beach's Mark Long captured the Southern Pacific Association AAU decathlon championship with 6617 points.

He posted marks of 11.5 for 100 meters, 21-2 long jump, 40-8 shot put, 5-10 $\frac{1}{2}$ high jump and 51.9 400 meters to total 3400 points after the first day. Long then came back to record a 17.1 110-meter high hurdles, 132-0 discus, 13-0 pole vault, 175-0 javelin and a 4:54.0 1500-meter run.

Dear Dick,

Enclosed are results from the PCAA championships. The crowd was surprisingly small, under 1000, especially when you consider that San Jose has, perhaps, more top attractions than any other school and that Long Beach figured to be in the thick of the fight for second place.

After watching Sam Davis pull up in the 220 heats, and with John Carlos suffering from a mild asthma attack, coach Bud Winter scratched the 440 relay team, leaving only Lee Evans from the "Speed City" sprint stable to run the finals. As it turned out, San Jose hardly missed the 30 or so points lost as it comfortably won the title 185 to 138 over runner-up San Diego State.

Evans was unquestionable the star of the meet, as well as a workhorse, running five races, winning them all.
