SEATTLE, Jan. 25--When Neal Steinhauer wants to throw his weight around, you had better look out.

Well, the former University of Oregon shot put phenom decided he wanted to do it at the fifth annual Seattle Invitational Indoor track meet.

And when he was done, Steinhauer, representing the ~~U.S.~~ Army's San Francisco Presidio, ~~owned~~ owned a new meet record of 64-9½ and ~~had been~~ was selected as the outstanding performer in the show, which lured a sellout crowd of 10,788.

The victory was nothing new for Steinhauer, who has managed to get in athletic training in addition to the Army type ~~work~~ while serving his country.

The victory was his fourth in a row on the indoor campaign. He previously triumphed in the All-American Games in San Francisco, the Los Angeles Invitational and the Athens Invitational in Oakland.

Steinhauer came up with the biggest heave of the season at Oakland, ^{the night before,} registering a 67-1 3/4 toss, ~~which is~~ which is 8¼ inches shy of his world indoor standard.

His winning series was 63-8, 62-11½, 64-9½, 63-0, ~~foul and foul.~~ ^{and two fouls.}
"I guess I just couldn't come up with ^A ~~the~~ 'big' toss two nights in a row," he said. "I'm rounding into pretty good shape but I've got a ways to go yet."

Two others ~~with~~, Jon Vaughn and Lee Evans, also received votes for the top performer award.

Vaughn, making his first outing since injuring a hamstring muscle last summer, looked impressive, particularly considering his long layoff from competition.

He soared over the opening height of 15-6 with plenty of room to spare. He ascended 16-0 on his initial attempt and was over 16-7 on his second try. Three others, Oregon State's Dennis Phillips, Fresno State's Erkki Mustakari and the Southern California Striders' John Pennel, ~~who~~ were eliminated at 16-7, giving Vaughn the victory.

The UCLA star asked that bar be raised to 17-5, three-quarters of an inch over Bob Seagren's world indoor standard. ^{The UCLA} Vaughn went over the bar.

at a world record 17'5"

on his first try, but nicked it on the way down. He was not close on two ensuing attempts.

Evans, the 400-meter gold medalist at the Mexico City Olympics, ran away and left the five-man field in the 500 dash. But he tightened up slightly on the closing lap, recording a creditable 1:56.3. He finished about six ~~more~~ yards in front of runner-up Edesel Garrison of ~~USA~~ So Cal.

"This was my first serious competition of the indoor season," Evans said. "I had set an objective of :56.5 and I'm reasonably happy with my time. I liked the new track here but the turns were a little slick. They'll improve as soon as there's more competition on them."

The sponsoring Carroll Club of Seattle ~~had~~ had rented the track used by the University of Oregon Alumni Association for the Oregon ~~Invitational~~ Invitational meet in previous years. However, the Seattle organization had its own track built this year.

Only four meet records fell. Steinhauer and Vaughn established two of them. Gary Powers of the Southern California Striders skimmed the 60-yard high hurdles in 7.2 seconds, breaking the record of 7.3 owned by five athletes.

~~Brayshaw~~
Randy James of Spokane's Ferris High School sped to a two-mile clocking of 9:09.7, eclipsing the meet mark of 9:11.9. Another creditable high prep effort was turned in by Brian Mittelstaedt of Tacoma's Mount Tahoma High. He clocked a 4:13.5, surpassing his previous best ~~mark~~ of 4:15.0, which was run outdoors.

The mile turned out to be a torrid duel between John Lawson of the ~~Pacific Coast Club~~ and Bob Day of the ~~Southern California Striders~~. Day nabbed the lead in the early going and had leading splits of :60.0, 2:01 and 3:04. Lawson was dogging him all of that time and finally charged ~~to~~ ^{Ahead} the ~~lead~~ with 1½ laps remaining. It was never a contest ~~he~~ after that. ~~Lawson moved to the fore of the~~. The Californian sprinted home an easy winner in 4:04.0 while Day took second in 4:07.7.

John Lilly of Oregon State won his second 1,000-yard race in two nights, clocking 2:09.9, ~~a mere one-tenth of a second off the meet record~~. He ~~then~~ triumphed at Oakland the previous night in 2:11.0.

Black-clad John Carlos, representing the Spartan Spike Club, took the 60 dash in 6.2. John Rambo of the Pacific Coast Club won the high jump

over a classy field with a seven-foot leap. Olympic gold medalist Dick Fosbury cleared 6-6 on his third try and was eliminated at 6-8.

The two mile, always a highlight here, was won by Australia's Kerry O'Brien in 8:40.4. Second place went to Ludvik Petr of Czechoslovakia in 8:44.2. Gerry Lindgren of Washington State was entered but was forced to withdraw ~~several days~~ several days before the meet because of an injury.
