LAST WEEK: Stanford 90, Occidental 62, Fresno State 29 (March 8 at Stanford)

Dual Scoring: Stanford 86, Occidental 58

Stanford 108, Fresno 40

Coach Payton Jordan's Stanford trackmen came out of the starting blocks in fine fashion Saturday, as the Indians streaked to an impressive win over Occidental and Freeno State in the season opener. A band of talented sophomores came through with the kind of top-notch performances which may turn the Tribe into a track power in 1969. Leading the way was Pete Fairchild's 1:51.7 in the 880, a lifetime best for Pete and an outstanding time for this early in the year. Right on Fairchild's heels was Duncan Macdonald, who checked in with 1:52.5, tying his lifetime high-water mark.

Macdonald brought home a first for Stanford in the mile, finishing a hair in front of senior Allen Sanford and Bob Anchondo. All three milers were clocked in 4:20.3.

Two sophomore hurdlers with limitless potential were instrumental in the Tribe win. Randy White, school record-holder in the 440 Intermediates, took first in his specialty with 53.4, setting a Stanford-Oxy meet record. White also finished second in the 440 yard dash in 49.2. Rick Tipton, who owns the Indian frosh 120 high record of 14.3, duplicated that effort Saturday to leave his competition far behind.

Tipton also ran first leg on both the 440 and mile relay quartets, in which Stanford took first and second, respectively. Tipton teamed with sophomores Chuck Francis and Kevin McNair, and plus junior enchormen Fred Storek, to cover the quarter mile in 41.3, setting another Stanford-Oxy record.

Seniors Tom Colby and Tom Massey took firsts for Stanford in the javelin and high jump. Colby, who holds the school record of 258-4, set meet marks with a heave of 246-7, an excellent effort for this time of the season. Massey won the high jump with a leap of 6-6, as injury wracked Peter Boyce was forced out at 6-4. Massey also took second in the triple jump with a 45-8 effort. Steve Davis, a junior JC transfer, grabbed Stanford's other first place, winning the discus with a 159 foot heave.


Three two-milers ran well for Stanford, but none of them could top Freeno's mark)

David Cords, who erased the miles oldest mark in his school's record book by churning the eight laps in 9:02.6. Tribe record-holder Greg Brock couldn't quite overtack Cords, although his 9:03.0 set a new Stanford-Oxy meet records standard. Brook Thomas ran third in 9:03.8, while Chuck Menz was fourth in 9:05.6, both good times at this point in the season.

Two Stanford football players, Bubba Brown and George Buehler, got their first taste of varsity track mannetations competition, and both took seconds in their events. Brown leaped 22-9 to claim second in the long jump, while Buehler hurled the shot 49-94 for the mannetate second behind Occidental's Wilkef.

The Tribe frosh team won a triangular meet with Laney and Santa Ana JC's, but in dual scoring lost to Santa Ana 74-71 while topping Laney 76-60. Robert Coe claimed two firsts for Stanfor, winning the 880 in 1:54.9 and taking the mile in 4:19 flat. Bob Dews, a forward on the Tribe frosh basketball team, won the high jump with a fine leap of 6-8.

There were apparent thin spots, but, overall, Stanford's track and field performers got a nod of approval from Coach Payton Jordan in a successful opener to the new season in the Indians' sundrenched campus arena yesterday.

Scoring big in the mile, hurdles, high jump and javelin, the young Injuns were handy winners over Occidental's Tigers and Fresno State's Bulldogs, both in two and three-way figuring.

In the triangular it was Stanford 90, Oxy 62 and Fresno 29.

Head and head, it went the Indians 86, Occidental 58; and Stanford 108, Fresno State 40.

In a meet run concurrently, the Papooses emulated their varsity counterparts by whipping Laney and Santa Ana jaycees.

Considering the rain and all that had limited preparations, Jordan couldn't help but wind up pleased at the day's happenings.

He mentioned "toughness", too, and here he had to place an unheralded Indian freshman from faraway Seabrook, Texas, one Robert Coe, high on the list.

Finally, there was junior Greg Brock knocking off Harry McCalla's Stanford-Oxy two mile figure of 9:06.6 with his 9:03.0.

But the charge wasn't enough to bring Brock home in front.

That was because Fresno's unyielding David Cords, who hadn't ever done better than 9:15.1 in an eight lapper, suddenly became a tiger and hit the tape in 9:02.6 to wipe out the oldest record in the Bulldog books, Art Cazares, 27year-old 9:05.2.

Two foreign Olympians, Fresno vaulter Erkki Mustakari of Finland and Stanford high jumper Peter Boyce from Australia, didn't come close to their best. Both were forced out of action early with recurring injuries.
