

Landes Captures State J.C. Discus

MODESTO — Winston Landes, Foothill College's burly sophomore transfer from the Air Force Academy, captured the State junior college discus title Saturday with a lifetime best of 171-11.

Landes, who won the Northern California crown last week, turned the tables on Compton College's Gary O'Sullivan, who whipped the Owl ace two weeks ago at the West Coast Relays in Fresno.

"I would have liked to have done better, but . . ." smiled Landes, a former Palo Alto high prep ace.

O'Sullivan, who previously led the State with a throw of 168-0, finished in eighth place at 150-8.

Most disappointed area athlete was West Valley College's rich Dunn, who was edged out for the triple jump championship by one quarter of an inch. Bakersfield's Robert Reader sailed 49-3/4 to the Viking jump-

Reader, who has recorded a mark better than 51 feet this year, posted his State winning leap early in the competition, and Dunn had several chances to match or better it.

University of California-bound Dunn recorded is 49-3/4 effort on his last jump, and he thought he had the event won until the leap was measured. "The jump felt real good," said Dunn, "I really thought I had him."

javelin throwers, nipped Tennessee's Bill Skinner on his last throw of 270-11. Skinner, a 29-year old collegian, posted a lifetime best of 268-11.

Neal Steinhauer, the one-time Super Duck from Oregon, erased Randy Matson's name from the meet records with a 66-5 1/2 put, and Otis Burrell of the Pacific Coast Club high jumped 7-1 3/4 for the other meet mark.

Several fine 880 relay legs were posted by Prairie View's Felix Johnson (1:45.7) and Wisconsin's Mark Winzenreid (1:46.7). Johnson's effort enabled

Prairie View to win the sprint medley in 3:16.3, while Winzenreid brought the Badgers home for a 7:17.8 win in the heralded two-mile relay.

Villanova, which had been clamoring all season for competition to press the world record of 7:14.6, finished third behind Wisconsin and surprising Washington State.

Johnson also came back to win the 880 in 1:48.6, staving off the soldier-Olympian, Tom Von Ruden. Other fine individual running victories were Evans' 45.8 over USC freshman Edsel Garrison (4.5) and Prairie View's

Fred Newhouse (46.6) in the 440 and a 4:00.5 mile by John Mason, ex-Ft. Hayes State star who is now an insurance adjuster in Los Angeles.

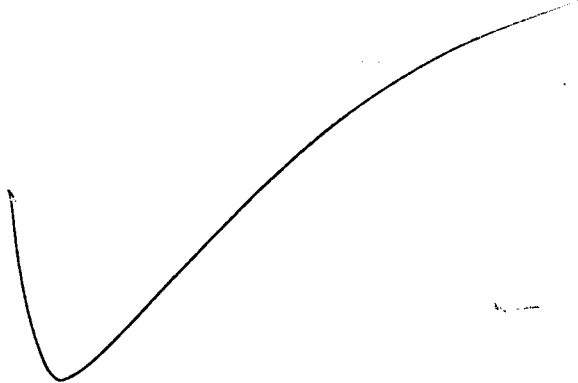
