TEXAS RELAYS:

Austin, Tex., April 11-12 (by Jack Shepard)--Thunderstorms which dumped nearly 4 inches of rain into Texas' Memorial Stadium could not slow the athletes here for the 42nd Texas Relays. Heavy rains Friday morning delayed preliminaries 4 hours and more rain Friday night and Saturday morning held up the finals just one hour, thanks to the superb field crew. The meet concluded with a rainbow--both ends within the stadium.

Kansas' Jim Ryun competed in two races, the sprint medley and two-mile relays, which were the highlights of this depth rich meet. In the sprint medley, Kansas was returning to the scene of its 1967 world best of 3:15.2, but it was Kansas State which won in 3:15.6, third best ever, and four teams were under 3:17.0, the collegiate record just four years ago. Stan Whitley of Kansas and El Paso's Mike Fray each led one of the 220 legs, but Terry Holbrook (45.7) flew to a three yard lead over Rice soph, Chip Grandjean (46.7). Ken Swenson anchored for State, soph Steve Straub for Rice, and ~~Jim~~ Ryun started eleven yards back for Kansas, just ahead of Texas' David Matina. Down the final backstretch, Ryun passed all but Straub, who held Jim off into the turn before visibly fading to fourth; and at the top of the straight Swenson powered by everyone to win going away with a 1:47.1 leg. A revived Straub moved past the struggling Ryun to give Rice a 3:16.6 to 3:16.7 win over Kansas. and Texas was right there at 3:16.9. Straub, just a 1:53.0 man prior to this season, had run a 1:47.6, Matina a 1:47.2, but fastest of all was Ryun's 1:46.9.

The two-mile relay was just as exciting. El Paso's Mike Perry took the lead (1:50.5) as four teams--Texas, Drake, Lamar Tech, and Arkansas--fell in a heap on the first lap. El Paso with Greg Jones (1:51.1) and Dan Tague (1:50.1) still led at the final handoff though K State's Bob Barratti was only a stride back with a 1:48.4 carry. Swenson again went for State, frosh Chris Fisher for El Paso and again ~~Jim~~ Ryun got the baton, 15 yards back, in Jim closed to five yards down the final back stretch, but that was his high water mark as Swenson needed the entire final straight to get his chest in front of Fisher as both teams clocked 7:20.8. Swenson ran 1:48.2, Fisher 1:48.4 and Kansas in third (7:21.8) had another fine race from Ryun, a 1:47.4. All three times are the nation's fastest.

Another national best came in the mile relay. Rice jumped to the early lead off Grandjean's 48.0 and Bill Askey's 46.1 answered Matina's 46.1 for Texas. ACC and Texas both closed on Rice during the third leg, and at the final handoff found Bale Bernauer with a stride over ACC frosh Roger Colglazier and another stride on Dave Morton. The three hung this way to the final turn where Bernauer charged away for a 3:07.1 win with a 45.8 carry. Colglazier's 46.1 carried him past Morton, who got an elbow on the final turn as ACC ran 3:08.3 to 3:08.7 for Texas. Far back Texas A&M's Curtis Mills sped a 45.9.

El Paso with a strong, young team ran ^{US} national bests in winning the distance medley (9:41.6) and four-mile relay (16:39.4). It took ~~two~~ ^{two} tries to get 21 teams away from a fall-line start in the medley event. In the first go Baylor's Ronnie Garner was trampled upon on the first curve and the second start saw Houston lose the baton at the start and drop out. A battered and muddy Garner still ran 1:50.0 to keep close to Texas (Mike Mosley in 1:49.8) which held the lead until Kansas State's Barratti impressed again with a 2:55.6 1320 and a 15 yard lead on a pack with El Paso another 15 back. The anchor miles were all catchup on State's Jerome Howe and El Paso's Fisher did it best with a swift 4:03.3 and a blistering last lap of 55.8. Doug Smith's 4:06.7 brought Kansas a 9:42.2 and a tired Howe (4:09.6) put State third in 9:43.8. Colorado, way back in seventh, had a 4:08.4 from Craig Runyan.

The University short relays were the best in years. All but one of the

line workhorse

440 relay finalists qualified in 41.0 or better, and Rice won the final in 40.3 to equal its prelim time after Kansas dropped the first pass and K State the second. Kansas, with a 1:23.9 qualifying, easily won the 880 relay in 1:23.4 though ~~Rice~~ Bernauer, ~~the SW workhorse~~, closed to 1:23.7, and Baylor's Ronnie Allen, as he did in the 440 relay, closed fastest of all.

Chuck Breen, an El Paso frosh, suprised everyone by topping teammate Kerry Pearce, ~~13:44.0~~ to 13:47.6, with a Missouri duo of Glenn Ogden(13:48.0) and ~~K~~ Kerry Hogan(13:48.2) right behind. All 8 under 14 minutes had personal bests but Pearce and Ogden.

X Southern Oliver Ford won the 100 over Missouri's Mel Gray, 9.6 to 9.7 against a stiff headwind after Gray and Texas Southern's Robert Taylor had 9.4's in the prelims. Kansas' George Byers was the hurdle star as he ran 14.0 and 13.9 before winning the windy final in 14.0 over teammate Ron Jessie, also at 14.0. Richmond Flowers, looking ragged with 14.2 and 14.3 prelim wins, did not return from an overnight flight to Dallas presumably to visit the Dallas Cowboys who drafted ~~him~~ Tennessee star as a flanker.

The spills, dropped batons, and disqualifications were most noticeable in the already weak college division. In the sprint medley, Prairie View *FEM* had no competition after Grambling's second 220 man dropped the baton, so Thurman Boggess(46.8) and Felix Johnson(1:49.7) just strode through for a 3:18.7 clocking. In the mile relay, Prairie View, using a makeshift team to qualify, had their third man disqualified for cutting in, and in the two-mile relay, Felix again never got the baton as leadoff man Al Dotson fell on the first leg, pulling a muscle. Southern won the 440 and 880 relays in 40.2 and a nation leading 1:23.0, but a passing zone disqualification gave Texas Southern the short race in 40.4 after a 40.3 heat. In the college distance medley, Ft. Hays State had a 30 yard lead at the mile handoff but Texas A&I's little Robert Gonzales ran 4:06.1 to give the Javelinas *for* a 9:50.8 win over Ft. Hays(9:51.2) and Howard Payne(9:51.8). *at 58'11 3/4*

On the field, the Kansas weight trio dominated. Steve Wilhelm upset Karl Salb in the shot, 62'5" to 60'8" with Knop third while the order was reversed in the discus. Salb hit 188'8" in the prelims to top Al Oerter's 1958 school record of 188'2" and then improved to 189'0" in the finals, only to lose to Knop(189'8") and Florida's John Morton(189'4"). Adding to the Kansas' total of five ^{track} wins, Bob Steinhoff cleared 16'6" in the vault before missing at a meet record try of 16'10". ACC's new 16'7" man Gene Riley was injured and did not compete.
