Trinity University ran up $74\frac{1}{2}$ points in its Centennial Year Invitational track meet to capture the team title over five other teams.

The Tigers came down to the final event of the day, the javelin, trailing Fort Sam Houston by a point and a half but a first place throw of 157-9½ by Don Fournier captured the needed six points to edge the Army for the title.

Trinity won first places in six events—the 440-yead relay, Brent Schumacher in the 120-yard high hurdles. Dennis Bryant in the 440-yard dash, Rufus Odem in the 100-yard dash, Jerry Johnston in the intermediate hurdles, and Fournier(in the javelin.

The do-or-die situation for Fournier was created when Johnston pulled a leg muscle on the lead-off split in the miley relay and the Tigers failed to finish the race.

Schumacher was the meet's top individual with $16\frac{1}{2}$ points. He ran on the winning sprint relay team, won the high hurdles, placed second in the intermediates, and captured second in the broad jump.

The only double winner of the day was Fort Sam Houston's Scott Taylor who won the one-mile and two-mile events.

Trinity will host the annual Southland Conference Spring Sports

Festival on E. M. Stevens Field in May, but the Tigers' next action will

be April 4 in the Southwestern Louisiana Relays in Lafayette, La.
