field, this one was historic for Carlos in that it marked his first engraving of his name on the world list.

Not too long afterward, Johnny put on another terrific show.

He was two yards back of UCL's great Mel Collett on the anchor leg of the 440 relay.

But, with the tremendous power that is contained in his frame, he drove on the Bruin sophomore and passed him up to keep the speed crows in the Spartan trophy case.

The time, 39.7, equalled the relays record set by Stanford in 1965.

The Spartans combined for what was believed to be the second fastest 880 relay ever run when they took that event in 1:22.3, only two tenths off the world mark set by the Tommie Smith anchored quartet here two years ago.

Under the circumstances, some other tremendous performances were shoved into the background.

Olympic gold medalist Willie Davenport equalled the oldest relays record in the books, Dick Attlesey's 13.5 (1950) in the high hurdles, and Arizona State sophomore Mark Murro unleashed a mighty javelin toss of 275 feet.

Seagren Dethroned

Dick Railsback of UCLA ended Bob Seagren's three year reign as the West Coast vaulting champ clearing 17-5, where all others failed and then gave the crowd a few thrills by going after 18 feet.

He didn't have it in him for that height.

Seagren, Fresno's Erkki Mustakari and John Pennel also cleared 17 feet in the competition.

Karl Salb of Kansas won the shot put at a modest 63-1
