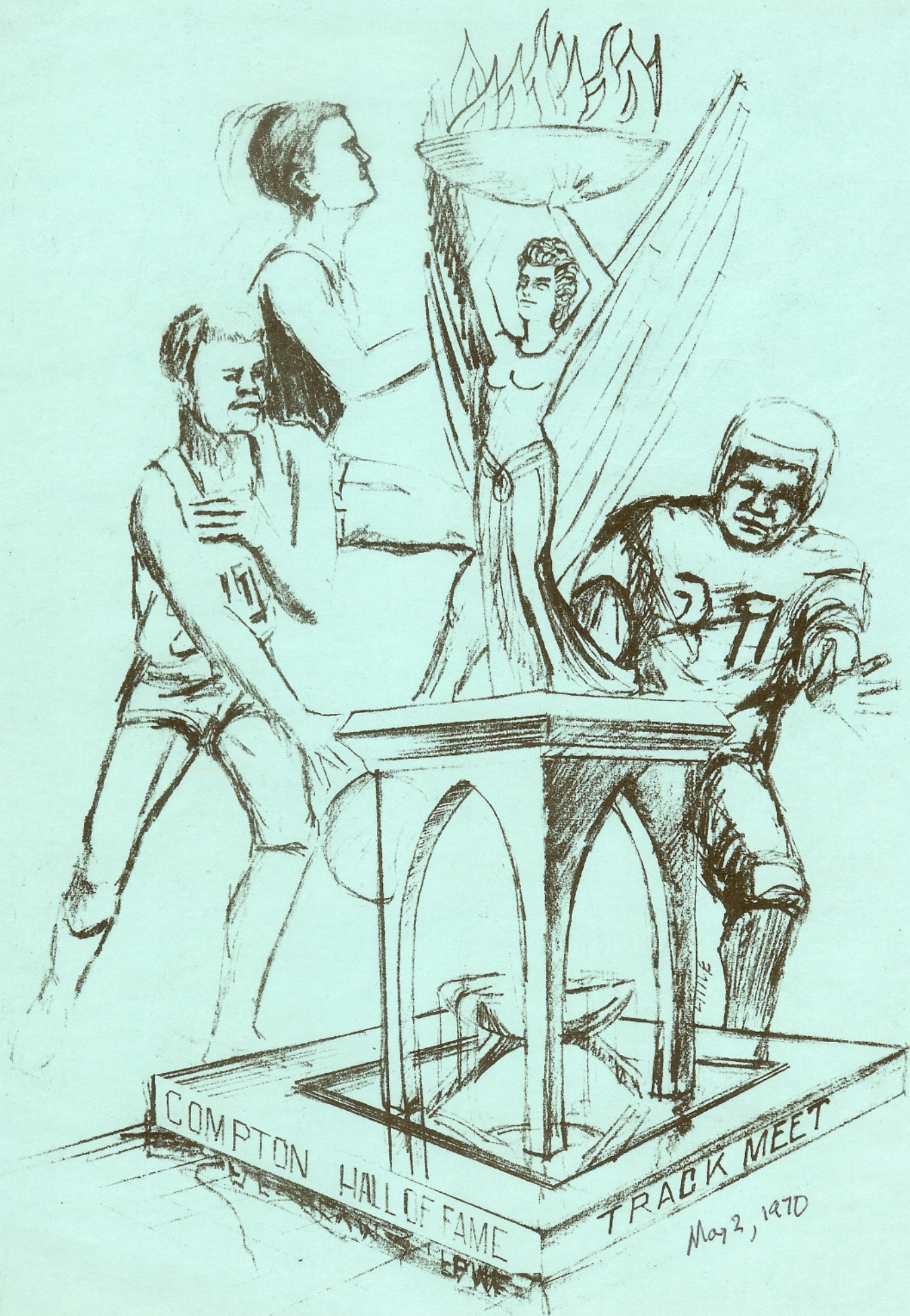

Today, one of the long-awaited head-on collisions of this, or any other, season takes place at historic Ramsaur Stadium when the national champion Southern California Striders face the challenging Pacific Coast Club in the First Annual Compton Hall of Fame Track and Field Meet.

Not only will the Striders, winners of the National A.A.U. outdoor team title 12 of the last 13 years (annually since 1963) and recently N.A.A.U. indoor titlists as well, and Pacific Coast Club, runner-up outdoors the past two years and twice indoor monarchs until being relegated to second this winter, coming on full strength, but the stellar army group from Fort MacArthur and California Track & Field Club, too.

The spotlight, however, will be on the Striders-P.C.C. struggle, their first real opportunity to lock horns since 1966. They are again rated the nation's two finest club teams and loaded with world class performers.

Proceeds from the meet go to the Compton Youth Sports Academic Foundation (C.Y.S.A.F.), an active organization of citizens who perform many worthwhile projects in South Los Angeles. The group is led by president Jackie Smith, a soft drink advertising executive, vice-president Jessie Arnold, and treasurer Herb Reed, all of whom have worked remarkable hours to make this meet a reality.

This will be the first big-time track meet held at Ramsaur Stadium since the Compton Invitational left there three years ago for the Los Angeles Coliseum. The Compton Invitational had been held in the Hub City since its inception in 1936 as the brainchild of Herschel Smith, then highly-successful track coach at Compton College.

Meet director Jesse Robinson, business management consultant and prominent member of the Southern Pacific A.A.U. executive committee, says, "We have gone on record as saying that Compton needs-and deserves-a big track meet to be held locally and we

feel this meet is a 'natural' in every way. With the calibre of athletes competing, we should fill the stadium."

Striders athletic director John Bork released a star-studded entry list which includes pole vaulters John Pennel, pending world recordholder at 17-10½, Bob Seagren, Olympic champion and defending National A.A.U. champ who holds the accepted record at 17-9, plus Dick Railsback, 17-8 ¾; Fred Kuller, 9.3 sprinter; Henry Hines, national JC long jump recordholder at 26-1 ¾; Otis Burrell, National A.A.U. high jump champion with a career best of 7-2½; high hurdlers Tommy White, 13.4w, and Gary Power, 13.5w; quartermilers Len Van Hofwegen, 45.5 (400 meters), Jay Elbel, 46.4, and Jim Ward, 46.5m.

The striders also boast new shot put standout Doug Lane, 62-9 ¾; javelin throwers Larry Stuart, with a lifetime best of 274-5, Ben Laville, and Bill Floeke; triple jumper Doug Ford, 50-8½; national prep vault recordholder Bob Pullard, ex-Los Angeles High, 16-7, and Bob Steinhoff, 16-6; long jumpers Phil Shinnick, 26-9½ in '68, and Craig Vaughan, 25-0; and discus thrower Ed Kohler, 194-7 all time best. Harold Connolly, one of the world's best hammer throwers, will also compete for the Striders.

Pacific Coast Club manager-coach Tom Jennings also ticks off some familiar names-- sprinter Jerry Bright, 9.3; sprinter-high hurdler Walt Butler, 9.5 and 13.8; middle distancemen Dave and John Perry plus Tom Von Ruden, all under 1:48 at their peak; milers John Mason, Sam Bair, and John Lawson, all sub-4 minutes; high jumper-long jumper Bill Elliott, 7-1½ and 26-3; triple jumper Dave Smith, 53-3½; American javelin recordholder Frank Covelli, 284-6 lifetime best; and National A.A.U. discus champ Jon Cole, 208-10 last year.

P.C.C. also plans to have 7-plus high jumpers John Rambo and John Dobroth, long jumper Gayle Hopkins, 26-9½ all-time best, vaulter Mike Markham, 16-6, discus men Gary Ordway, Miles Lister, and Don Tollefson (all over 190), and javelin throwers Ed Redd and John FitzSimons (both in the 270 range).

Veteran coach Ralph Higgins at Fort MacArthur has lined up some 40 athletes, including Olympic gold medalist Charlie Greene, co-holder of the world 100-yard dash record at 9.1, plus intermediate hurdlers Geoff Vanderstock (holder of the American 400-meter record at 48.8), and Dave Adkins, sprinters Greene, Mel Pender, Ben Vaughn and Jimmy White, all under 9.41, distance runner Kent Moore, quarter-milers Bob Frey, 46.2, Elbert Stinson, 45.2, Robert Johnson, 45.8, and half-milers Jere Van Dyk, 1:48.1, and hurdlers Dave Adkins, 50.5 intermediates, and Dale Fredericks, 13.7 highs.

The Army is deep in vaulters and javelin throwers and will also feature Ronald Coleman, Jim Blaisdell, and Don Lindsay in the long jump and high jump.

California T&F Club coach Fred Jones provides Olympian Reynaldo Brown, three-time state prep champion and recordholder at Compton High who has done 7-2½ this season and is enrolled at Cal Poly (SLO); Pat Bradford, 6-11½ high jumper and Brown's high school sidekick; Rueben Smith, 9.5 sprinter and NCAA college division 100 champion at Cal Poly; Don Parish, 13.7 high hurdler from Oregon State; and Charles Howard, 9.5 sprinter and 25-5 long jumper.

Olympic champion and world 400-meter recordholder (43.8) Lee Evans will be down from San Jose to compete unattached. Lee, who plans to turn pro May 23, ran a 46.7 flat quarter and 50.4 intermediates last weekend at the Mt. San Antonio Relays and was "Track Athlete of the Meet".

Special women's races in the 100 and 440 and an age-group boys' 100 will be held and interest will focus on Charles Piggee, Davis Junior High speedster, who reportedly has run a 9.8 100-yard dash.
