Philadelphia, Pa., May 29-30 (by Ben Lachs)--NCAA and AAU mile champion Marty Liquori of Villanova avenged an indoor season loss to Howell Michael, as he defeated his rival from William & Mary in the 94th IC4A Outdoor Championships 3:58.5 to 3:59.0. Liquori's victory was just one in a series which saw Villanova sweep every individual track event from 440 yards to six miles. Naturally Villanova won the team title--its tenth in fourteen years--beating runnerup Maryland (last year's outdoor champs) by a 60-52 count. The Wildcats triumphed despite having scored only four points in the field events.

The two-day meet got off to a rousing start when Pittsburgh junior Robert
Kouvolo unseated the defending javelin champion, Jack Bacon of Maryland. Kouvolo threw
the spear 251 feet 5 inches, 10 feet 7 inches better than Bacon, who was handicapped
by what he termed "tennis elbow." He sustained the injury on May 2 during the
Maryland-Tennessee dual meet. In the four weeks which intervened between that competition and the IC4A, Bacon did not throw at all. Still, Maryland picked up seven points
in the event as Dave Reiss's 236-10 was good enough for third place.

Other Friday action focused upon the weight events. Rich Narcessian of Rhode Island hammered 195-6 to successfully defend his title. Dartmouth's DeWitt Davies and Bill Dineen swept second and third with distances of 192-10 and 189-8 respectively. Tom Sirois of Northeastern (185-4) and Steve Furness of Rhode Island (183-9) were the other point-getters. Maryland got six of its 13 Friday points from discus man Paul Corrigan, who beat Frank Howard of Dartmouth by 29 inches, 173-8 to 171-3. Penn's Ken Dietz (168-8 for third) remained in a slump.

The only other events decided on Friday were the long jump and the six-mile run. Noel Hare of Harvard, the Heptagonal Games champion, won the former with a 24-3 1/2 leap. 1969 winner Walter Jones of Cornell, a conference rival of Hare's, could manage only fourth. Villanova's Dick Buerkle emulated Frank Shorter of Yale in capturing the six-mile, a new event on the IC4A card. Shorter had never run a regular six-mile before he took the NCAA race at Knoxville last year. The same was true of Buerkle, but that didn't stop him from winning in a fancy 28:34.7. Even though he

was 35 yards behind Ron Stonitsch of C. W. Post, the outstanding collegian of the Penn Relays, with but six laps remaining, Buerkle charged past him and Jon Anderson of Cornell on the 22nd lap. The Villanovan won as he pleased with a final mile of 4:36.3 and a last lap of 1:08.7. Stonitsch was second in 28:41.1. Anderson struggled home in 28:43.4, visibly shaken. Art Dulong, Holy Cross distance ace, was the fourth man to slip under 29 minutes in this race, clocking 28:56.0. John Vitale of Connecticut just missed the barrier; he needed 29:01.8 to finish. Pittsburgh's David Chesebrough rounded out the first six finishers in 29:21.5. NGAA fifth-placer Donal Walsh of Villanova could do no better than ninth. Buerkle, a 125-pound senior from Rochester, New York, explained his waiting tactics by saying, "I had to run each mile in 4:50. And I wasn't going to get impatient. A lot of races you can't run on time splits. But the six-mile you can run like a clock."

Friday's qualifying trials were singularly unnoteworthy. Jumbo Elliott, Villanova's coach, pulled usual anchorman Larry James from the mile relay and placed him in the 220. Lamotte Hyman was switched to anchorman and the vacant spot was filled by none other than Marty Liquori. Liquori ran a creditable 49.4 second leg as the Cats easily qualified in 3:16.5. Three other teams ran faster, the best time recorded by Penn--3:14.0. No pre-meet favorite was eliminated in any of the other events. As is usual, qualifying times were uninspired.

The sparse Friday crowd went home thinking that there was no way possible local favorite Villanova could stop the Maryland horde.

But the prophets (Jumbo Elliott among them) were wrong. On the Wednesday before the meet Elliot said: "There is no way we can win it. ... If they [Maryland] come up to form and we do, there's a 22-point spread. So we are going to do the best we can."

The first Saturday track event was the 440 hurdles. No Maryland or Villanova athlete qualified, so the fans settled down a bit and looked for a good performance with no team championship pressure added. The winner turned out to be little-known Rich Weaver of Pennsylvania Military Colleges. Weaver ran the 180 lows for Central High of Philadelphia in prep competition, logging 19.1 in that event. Stepping up to the Aone-laphwides.

the sophomore ran 51.6 after a 52.4 semifinal. Weaver became the only second-year man to win an individual track event at the IC4A 1970 championships. Dick MacDonald of Yale (52.1) was placed second when Chuck Harvey of Penn State, the second man to cross the finish line, was disqualified for dragging his trail leg outside a hurdle.

The 440 relay followed and after the Maryland quartet of Marvin and Marshall Bush, Tyrone Brown, and Ralph Jones held off the Larry James-anchored Villanovans, 41.2 to 41.3, things were looking good for the Terrapins. Yale was third in 41.4.

The mile run turned things around and was the setting for Marty Liquori's best effort to date. The field had every single top miler in the East and the stage was set for a great race. John Baker of Maryland decided to make the pace this year. In *69 he went out slowly and finished the same way, sixth (to Liquori). He passed the quarter post in 58.8 seconds. Chris Mason, another Willanovan, was a comfortable second in 59.3. Liquori, running very relaxed, was fourth after a lap. His conqueror in the NCAA Indoor Championships, William & Mary's Howell Michael, was third in 59.5only three-tenths ahead of Liquori.. Harvard's senior distance ace Keith Colburn, who repeated his IC4A indoor action of passing up sure points in a shorter race to challenge Liquori, ran fourth after 440 yards in 60.2. Baker, a native of Penncrest, Pa., ran the next lap in 63.3, as he hit the 880 in 2:02.1. Just as the field approached the finish line for the second time, Michael moved into second position; he logged 2:02.3. Colburn, Mason, Liquori, and Manhattan's Tom Donahue were strung out behind him in that order. Although 2:02.1 is not exactly a scintillating half-mile pace as championship miles go, the pace got to Baker at the end of the third lap and he dropped from contention. Almost simultaneously Liquori moved up from his spot in fifth to assume the lead. Michael seemed a bit surprised when Liquori passed him, and trailed by six-tenths at the gun. 3:03.8 to 3:03.2. Michael lit out in pursuit but to no avail: Liquori's 55.3 final lap gave him a four-yard win in 3:58.5., theajunior's best mark of the season. The William & Mary star ran a 55.2 closer himself for a 3:59.0. Liquori's teammate Chris Mason picked up important team points with a 3:59.9 third-place. Colburn was timed in 4:00.8, nabbing the fourth place decision from an out-of-shape John Baker (4:02.7). Tom Donahue's sixth place time was 4:03.5.

Villanova's 9 team points in the mile changed the complexion of the meet completely. Baker had been expected by Maryland coach Nick Kovalakides to neutralize Liquori but the Maryland runner collected only one point for his effort.

The roof fell in on the Terps when Villanova's three qualifiers in the flat

440, Larry James, Hardge Dayis, and Lamotte Hyman, all scored points. The 1-4-5 by

the trio virtually assured the meet for Villanova. Maryland could not even get anyone

to the semifinals. James ran an eased-up lap to beat Tom Ulan of Rutgers, 46.2 to 46.3.

It looked close for a moment and James even began to exert himself for a stride or two.

Then in the heat of battle, ten yards from home, Ulan broke stride as James trotted

home for the title. He is one of a select corps of runners who has an ability to jog

the last several yards of a title race which was decided by a mere tenth. Greg

Daugherty of Morgan State was credited with 46.9 for third-place, the same time as

fourth finisher Hardge Davis. Hyman was given 47.1 while Clyde McPherson of Adelphi,

the same man who ran a 45.6 anchor in defeating Larry James at Queens-Iona on April 18,

dogged his quarter in 47.2., good for sixth place.

The 100-yard dash, generally conceded by tracksiders to defending IC4A and two-time Heptagonal champion Don Martin, went instead to West Chester State's Bill Krouse in 9.7. Ken Osbourne of Temple was second, with Martin, a Yale-junior, a close-up third. The hopes of Maryland fans sank a bit further when the Bulova Accutron Phototimer revealed Ralph Jones of Maryland to have finished fifth, Pre-race prognostications had Jones in the top two or three.

Andy O'Reilly of Villanova won the 880 in 1:49.7. Maryland got a third. By now, knowledgeable fans realized that the Maryland strength in the field events could not overcome the big lead which Villanova had amassed.

The 3000 meter steeplechase was an interesting affair, although Penn Relays champion David Pottetti of Harvard was not there to contest the issue. 8 minutes 46.1 seconds after the starter's gun had fired, all sorts of records had fallen at the hands of Des McCormack, another Villanovan. First of all, he set a new record for Ireland.

(McCormack is another of Jumbo Elliott's Irish imports.) Secondly, the senior broke a meet record of 8:46.2 set by Terry Donnelly of William & Mary in the 1968 IC4A

championships. Coincedentally, the 1968 mark of Donnelly's was also set here at the University of Pennsylvania's Franklin Field. And since nobody had broken 8:46.2 in the two years between the 1968 and 1970 IC4A championships, McCormack's mark is also a Franklin Field record. Finishing behind him on the record-setting 'chase were: Ed Walsh (Manhattan), 8:49.9; Jon Anderson (Cornell), 9:00.9; Gregg Rodgers, (Pitts-burgh), 9:02.7; George Lokken (Pennsylvania), 9:06.4; and Joe Lucas (Georgetown), 9:16.7

Finals of the 120 high hurdles followed the steeplechase. Kwaku Ohene-Frempong, a native of Ghana and now a senior at Yale, won his specialty in 14.0 after a 13.9 semifinal race. Both times were legal. In the final, Ohene-Frempong ran in lane 4. His major competition, Tyrone Brown of Maryland, drew the adjacent lane 5. Frempong got off to a flying start, leaving the rest of the field virtually at the post. The African withstood Brown who was gaining ground at the end. Brown was timed in 14.1.

13.7 man Handsome Wearing of Villanova fell attempting to clear the hurdle and did not finish.

Jumbo Elliott's decision to put Larry James in the 220 didn't make much difference because James (in lane 3) saw nothing of Amherst's Jim Reed (in lane 4) except the back of his jersey. Reed was a clear leader by the middle of the turn and won smartly in 21.2. James, who couldn't have been that weary from his 440, failed to save second from Mike Fratkin of William & Mary. James' 21.5 was .1 slower than Fratkin's clocking. Marshall Bush of Maryland also required 21.5 to finish, but was placed fourth. The mile relay put icing on the cake for Villanova. With Maryland eliminated in Friday's preliminaries, Villanova was up against formidable competition, considering the Wildcats were minus the services of Larry James. With Pennsylvania through because of a dropped baton, only four teams were competing against Villanova with three laps to go. Greg Govan gave 'Nova a cushion on Morgan State and Adelphi a 48.2 leadoff. But Adelphi's Bill McPherson, running second, turned in a stellar 46.1

good miler does not a quarter-miler make. After Liquori passed off to Hardge Davis, his team was third. Davis' 46.2 overtook third legs by Clyde McPherson of Adelphi (48.5) and Laverne Rodgers of Morgan State (47.2). Given a five-tenth lead by his teammates, Lamotte Hyman held Morgan State anchorman Greg Daugherty safe in a thrilling stretch drive. Hyman (46.5) led his team to a 3:10.1, a fifth better than Morgan State (Daugherty 46.2). Adelphi came home in 3:11.8, Rutgers in 3:12.5, and Pittsburgh in 3:16.8.

Dick Buerkle completed a two-day double on Saturday with his 13:34.2 three-mile triumph. The checkpoints were reached by Ron Stonitsch in 4:38.2 and 9:15.1. Stonitsch himself finished in 13:38.3, finishing second to Buerkle twice in two days. Greg Fredericks of Penn State was third in 13:40.7. He was followed by Donald Rowe of St. John's, who was timed in 13:44.6, Donal Walsh of Villanova, who was timed in 13:49.7, and Connecticut's John Vitale, who was clocked in 13:52.5. It's the little things that count and Russ Taintor's failure to score in either the three- or six-mile had to hurt Maryland's chances.

But Taintor's troubles were not nearly as surprising as those of 16-8 3/4 pole vaulter James (Buddy) Williamson, also from Maryland. Beaten in the IC4A indoors by Pennsylvania sophomore Tom Blair, Williamson was beaten by the same individual again outdoors. Even that wasn't as shocking as the manner in which the defeat was administered. Blair passed at each height up until 15-8 which he successfully negotiated. Williamson passed at each height up until 16-0 and inexplicably failed thrice. Suddenly Maryland found herself without any points where she could have reasonably expected to get six. Unless your last name is Seagren or Pennel, you don't normally pass all the way up to 16 feet. Williamson tried to and it backfired. Blair cleared 16-0 even to win him the title. He missed three times at 16-4 3/4. Second slot in the vault went to Dan Henneberg of William & Mary at 15-8, which Villanova's Mark Edman cleared for third. Henneberg got the nod for the runnerup with fewer misses.

Mike Neff of Maryland decided the triple jump issue in a hurry. His initial jump of 49 feet 4 inches (wind ok) stood up all afternoon to win him the title.

Long jump champ Noel Hare of Harvard took second in the triple at 48-9 1/4.

Joe David, Maryland high jumper, took his second straight IC4A crown at 6-10. The odd thing is that both years he won at 6-10, and both titles were won on the basis of fewer misses. Eric Howard of Morgan State also cleared 6-10 this year, but did not get over until his third try. David was over on his first attempt at that height. Princeton's Gene Halton was third at 6-8. Fourth at that height was Bryant Salter of Pittsburgh (who was fourth in the triple jump at 47-9 1/4 wind ok). Fifth, also at 6-8, was Fred Maglione of St. Joseph's. Maglione scored his team's only point with that leap.

The shot put decision went to John Hanley of Maryland. He threw 59-7 1/4 to successfully defend his IC4A title in that event. Last year he did 59-8 3/4. Joe Wevurski of C. W. Post finished second at 56-7 1/2, a half-inch longer than Harold Krouse of Boston College could accomplish.

IC4A: Speed Over Maryland Muscle

PHILADELPHIA - (AP) - An eyelash victory in the mile relay, a 3:58.5 triumph in the mile for Marty Liquori, Dick Buerkle's three-mile victory and a 440 decision for Larry James helped Villanova outscore Maryland's muscle men in the 94th annual outdoor IC4A Track and Field Championships yesterday at Franklin Field.

Coach Jumbo Elliott's Villanovans carried off seven running championships, and scored only four field event points as they beat the Terrapins from the Atlantic Coast Conference 60-52. It was Villanova's 10th IC4A outdoor title in the last 13 years and gave the Wildcats permanent possession of a meet cup for the second time. Five victories retire a cup.

Maryland won four field event titles and the 440-yard relay in losing the title it had won in three of the past five years, including last year's one-point triumph over Villanova. John Hanley in the shot put, 59-71/4, Mike Neff in the triple jump, 49-4, Joe David in the high jump, 6-10, and Paul Corrigan in Friday's discus were the Mary-

land field winners. The Terrapins edged Villanova in the 440 relay in 41.3.
