College Thinclads Run Wild at Meet

De Anza College's track team proved a poor but happy host as the Dons accumulated 153 1/2 points to win the Camino Norte Conference Meet on Saturday.

Far behind were Contra Costa 106, West Valley 86 1/2, Santa Rosa 53, Marin 46 and Solano 45.

Dons' Coach Jim Linthicum said, "I'm not surprised that we won it but I am extremely pleased by the margin by which we did it. Our mile relay team (John Hanes, Paul Reynoso, Mark Melloway and Jim Petralia) did a heck of a job to tie the school record.

RUN AGAIN

"They clocked 3:22.3 (second place) but the important thing was that the individuals had already run two or three events each."

The Dons won five of the 13 events with Dave Clark tieing his own school record and tieing for first in the pole vault at 14-0, Paul Romanshek high jumping 6-71/2, Melloway clocking 15.3 in the 120 high hurdles, Jim Petralia taking the 440 intermediates at 54.0 and Gordon Currie the two-mile at 9:26.6.

Two lower place finishers accounted for new school records as Manny Mahon placed second in the mile in 4:16.1 (old, Hanes 4:19.4) and Lane Herrmann tossed the discus 148-4 (old, Herrmann 145-11 1/2) for third place.

NEARS RECORD

Romanshek had his second best ever leap in the high jump despite lack of practice due to an infected foot and his brother, Pat, soared his best at 6-4. Art Sherwyn was third at 6-1 3/4 and Rich Mulligan fifth at 6-0 for a dominating event.

De Anza's hurdlers were unstoppable also. In the 120 highs, Melloway won followed by John LaGasse 15.4, Chuck Bean 15.5 and Mulligan 15.7 for the first four places.

DOMINATE

Petralia took the intermediates while Melloway was third at 55.8, Bob Johnson fifth at 58.0 and Bean sixth at 58.5. First six placers in each event go on to the NorCal.

Linthicum will take 10 competitors to the West Coast Relays in Fresno this weekend, two-mile and distance medley relay teams, Petralia in the intermediates, Herrman in the shot put and Paul Romanshek in the high jump.

Schmidt, who has a 7-0 record for two years of JC league baseball play, pitched three-hit ball for seven innings as De Anza beat Santa Rosa, 6-0, to gain a co-championship with the losing team.

Romanshek cleared 6-7 1/2 in his specialty, only a half inch off his own school record, to win the high jump at the Camino Norte Conference Meet.

Shaeffer, a consistent winner, placed highly at the Region swim meet (along with Lynbrook's Ted Carrier) and will vie in the Central Coast Section this weekend.

DON TRACKSTERS SEEK FINAL SPOTS

"I would venture it will take season bests to get into the finals," said De Anza College track Coach Jim Linthicum of his 21 thinclads who were competing in the NorCal Trials in Modesto today.

Finals will start at 11 a.m. in Santa Rosa on Saturday.

Linthicum expects the half mile to be the top event in the trials with 10 runners under 1:55.0 and only eight going on to the finals. John Hanes, who possesses a best of 1:54.2 hopes to be one of them.

The coach believes other Dons capable of being high finishers at

the NorCal are Gordon Currie in the two-mile, Manny Mahon in the mile, Paul Romanshek in the high jump and Lane Herrmann in the weights.
