MERRITT HOPES TO BECOME FOURTH TWO-TIME CALIFORNIA CHAMPION

Oakland's Merritt College is favored to become the fourth school to win two consecutive California State junior college track and field championships. 1970 meet will be held Saturday at Modesto in conjunction with the California Relays.

Field events get underway at noon with the exhibition JC javelin and running events start at 3 p.m. with the open mile walk. (JC 440 relay is at 4:10.)

Northern California runner-up Fresno CC, who chased Merritt to points in the NorCal meet, plus Southern California champ Bakersfield are the only teams with enough qualifiers to seriously challenge Merritt's repeat attempts.

A team to watch, however, is Southern Cal runner-up Los Angeles CC, who has but five finals spots--but all by Sou/Cal meet winners. Cub sprinter Willie Deckard and hurdler Lance Babb both doubled in the Sou/Cal and paced the Cubs to a 40.8 quartermile relay victory. In order to repeat that achievement in the state meet, they'll have to cut into Merritt's stranglehold on the sprints--an accomplishment that would likely mean a state title for LA.

Merritt leads the field with a dozen qualifying spots, led by national record holding 9.3 sprinter Warren Edmonson and quartermiler-jumper Henry Stuckey in four events each, plus hurdler-quartermiler Larry Glenn in three. Glenn is only in three events because he's no longer a member of the Thurderbird 440 relay quartet which last year started off the state meet with a national JC record 40.4 clocking! Now running with Edmonson and Stuckey on the team which clocked 40.8 last week are 9.4 sprinter Royce Ford and 9.5w man Ron Villiams.

Edmonson is the national JC leader in the 100 with his record tying 9.3 and in the 440 at 47.0. He ranks a tenth behind 220 leader Dave Gilliard (20.7) of East Los Angeles (as does LACC's Deckard).

The national record of 20.6 for the furlong is certainly in danger too on Modesto's swift track as Edmonson will challenge the southern pair in the 220 but not go in the 440. He will run a leg on Merritt's mile relay team, which last year set national JC and freshmen records of 3:08.2 with a quartet of Stuckey (48.0), Glenn (47.5), Edmonson (45.9), and Lamont Jackson (46.8). (Glenn clocked 46.5 and Stuckey 45.9 on a later 3:09.6 effort.)

While Merritt has its qualifiers bunched in eight events, Fresno has 11 men in nine different events and Bakersfield has all of its ten qualifiers in different events. None of the Bakersfield lads won Southern California titles, although Renegade distance ace Rick Hitchcock is defending state two mile champion with a best of 8:59.6 (8:59.8 this year).

Fresno has the only other defending champion in the state field, 16-0 pole vaulter Steve Hardison. But he too failed to repeat as a section champ when College of San Mateo freshman Jim Lydon edged him on fewer misses at 15-3 last week. A pulled hamstring muscle had kept Hardison out of action for a month prior to the Nor/Cal meet. California's other 16 foot JC vaulter this year, '69 state runnerup Bob Richards, Jr., of Mt. San Antonio, failed to place in the Sou/Cal meet.

JC POLE VAULT KICKS OFF CHAMPIONSHIPS AT 12:45 P.M. SATURDAY

The pole wault will kick-off the 1970 California-State junior college championships at 12:45 p.m., instead of at 1:15 p.m. as originally scheduled, according to meet director Tom Moore. But the first event is still the exhibition JC javelin at noon.

The pole vault was moved up a half hour because 16 men (instead of the normal eight) qualified for the state finals due to others achieving the fourth place height in the north and south section meets.

State meet veterans have had a tough time of it lately. Edmonson and City College of San Francisc's 6-8 high jumper Clyde Sadler were both sidelined with injuries in April. Glenn has also been hampered by a muscle strain and Sequoias intermediate hurdler Bud. Stanton failed to get a second chance in the state meet after taking a spill in the Nor/Cal finals.

* * *

JC TRACK & FIELD's dope sheet, which has only once failed to predict the state meet winner, sees Merritt joining LACC (1951-52), Santa Ana (1964-65), and Allan Hancock (1966-67) as a two-time champion by totaling 72 points to 48 for Fresno CC. The runner-up battle is tight with Bakersfield doping to 45 points and LACC 44.

Hancock's state meet scoring record of 100 points set in 1967 appears safe, however.

Fresno's unbeaten high hurdler Jerry ilson (14.2w), last year's state high school champion in both highs and lows, will duel LACC's returning state meet entrant Babb--who clocked 14.0 to win the Sou/Cal meet. Babb ranked second in the nation last year at 14.1 but was seventh in the eight man state finals field after coming in unbeaten.

Fresno has two other Nor/Cal champs in 6-10 high jumper Rick Fletcher and quarter-miler John Banks (48.0). And frosh Ram sprinter Lorenzo Johnson (9.6, 9.4w) has lost only to Edmonson this year.

High jump favorite, however, is seven-foot jumper Larry Hollins of MiraCosta, the Sou/Cal champion. Fletcher and Pasadena CC's Wayne Bradley $(6-10\frac{1}{2})$ are the chief contenders.

Banks posted one of the surprises of the Nor/Cals with his 440 victory, proving to be a good hot weather runner. He'll have trouble with Stuckey and Glenn Saturday, however, plus the close Sou/Cal field led by champ Ben Rico (47.6) of Mt. San Antonio. Chasing Rico to the tape in the Sou/Cals were Ron Gaddis (47.7) of L.A. Pierce and Jim Kirby (47.7) of Long Beach CC. JC TRACK & FIELD sees Rico as a slight choice over Stuckey Saturday.

Moorpark's Ricco Sanchez, after concentrating on the 440 most of the season, took right over in the halfmile last week with a 1:52.8 for the state JC leadership in the Sou/Cal prelims. He then ran 1:50.5 in the finals for the US community college lead. Manuel Green of L.A. Valley (1:50.9 behind Sanchez) and Nor/Cal champ Clay Lowrey (1:52.5) of American River should make the state race interesting.

State cross country champ Hitchcock, who oloed in the two mile for the state title last May, is finding a mile-two mile double in '70 more difficult. He should be able to win the mile over Grossmont's Sou/Cal champ Armando Valencia (4:07.4) if he goes all out. But he'll have trouble coming back in the two mile against Sou/Cal champ Ruben Chappins (9:05.0) of Cerritos and arch-rival Mark Covert (9:04.6) of L.A. Valley. Hitchcock has run 4:08.1n and 8:59.8 this year.

In the shot put, state leader Ernie Cathcart (56-3) of Chaffey will try to come back after being upset by Lamar Anderson (54- $2\frac{1}{2}$) of L.A. Southwest last week. And American River's Greg Born (54-11 3/4) will have his say too.

Two outstanding athletes who expect to take well to Modesto's great field facilities are long jumper Mike Hill (25-6) of Mt. San Antonio and discus thrower Sylvester Marshall (171-11) of West Hills. Modesto's winds could hinder and help them.

In the triple jump, San Jose CC's Harry Freeman will duel James Butts $(50-3\frac{1}{2})$ of East Los Angeles. Freeman has marks of $50-11\frac{1}{2}$ wind-aided and $49-6\frac{1}{2}$ (legit).

RECORDS COMMITTEE TO REVIEW MARKS

The National Junior College Joint Records Committee will meet Saturday at Modesto to review applications for national marks set since last year's meeting. California charman Dave Kamanski of Cerritos College will convene the 10 a.m. conclave at the Sun Dial Lodge.

Applications have been received for Mark Covert's 29:32.4 six mile for Los Angeles Valley on May 30, 1969 and for Mt. San Antonio's 59.7 shuttle high hurdles relay team, both as new events. No applications have been submitted as yet for the 8:52.4 two mile by Phil Burkwist of Spokane (Jash) on April 18 (or for Burkwist's 31:58.0 in the 10,000 meters Dec. 20). No national records were broken in the relays this season, with the California JCs unable to compete in the Jest Coast Relays.
