a 3:16.4 in the mile — the last
running event of the night.

Milburn, the nation's top high
school hurdler last season,
clicked off a 6.9 time in the
60-yard high hurdles. He erased
the seven-flat standard set by
Arkansas State's Thomas Hill in
the preliminaries Saturday aft-
ernoon.

Two marks were tied — the
880-yard run and the 60-yard
dash. Oklahoma's Cline John-
son tied the half-mile record of
1:54.4 and Grambling's Jack
Phillips sprinted to a six-flat
timing in the short race.

The 440 duel fans had hopes
for — Curtis Mills vs. Al Coffe-
e — did not come through.
Mills said, "I'm 'scared' of
the boards (the track). . . I
haven't ran as much this year
as I did last year." Last year,
at just about the same time,
Mills doubled up, running hot
the 440 and a leg on the mile re-
lay.

Coffee finished third in the
open quarter but couldn't get
but within about 50 yards of
Mills on the baton event.

The record - setting team was
made up of Curtis' brother Mar-
vin, Willie Blackmon, Tony
Munson and Curtis. The splits
in the relay, in order, were 49.3,
49.5, 49.4 and 48.2. The old mark
was 3:17.2 by Oklahoma in 1967.

For 46 As LSU Wins

NEW ORLEANS (AP) — Pis-
tol Pete Maravich punched 46
points past Tulane's sticky de-
fense as Louisiana State rang
up its fourth basketball victory
of the season Saturday night,
beating Tulane 97-91.

The triumph was by far the
toughest test thus far for the
Tigers. Tulane dropped its third
against one victory.

LSU held the lead throughout
with one exception, and that
only when Tulane squeezed to
the front 24-23 halfway in the
first half. But Maravich and
Danny Hester quickly got the
Tigers back in front. They led
by as much as seven points
shortly before the half.

The Tigers had a 51-47 lead
opening the second half and
Maravich hit for six quick
points as LSU maintained its
margin.

With Maravich again hitting
for a trio of baskets, LSU built
up a 10 point lead. It dwindled
to one as Tulane rallied near
the end, but the Tigers quashed
the threat.

Maravich, the national colle-
giate scoring champion for the
past two years, went past the
40 point mark for the fourth
time this season.

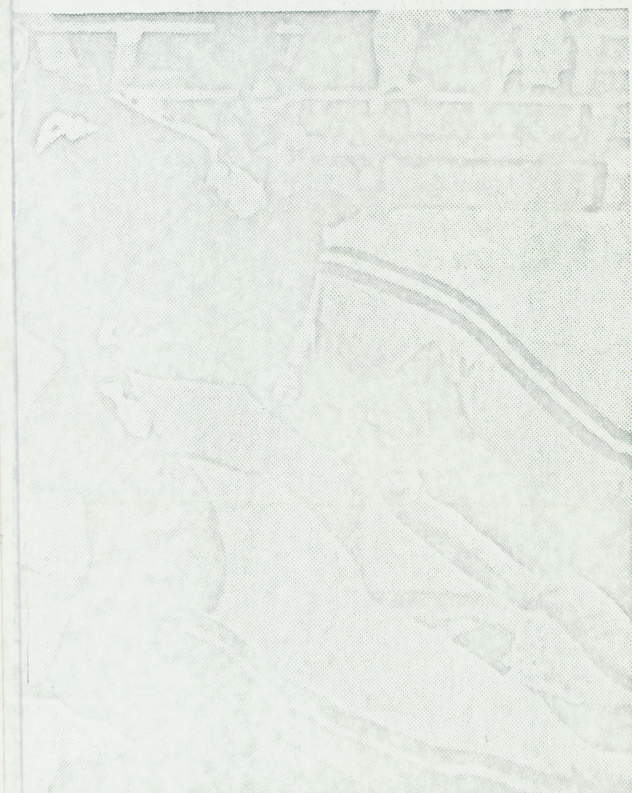
