

Head Breaks 10-Flat In CCS Regional Meet

PACIFIC GROVE — Santa Cruz High's Willie Head, improving by the meet, flashed to the win in the varsity 100 yard dash Saturday in the Regional track meet at Pacific Grove High.

Head, winner in the Monterey Bay League race last week, covered the century in 9.9 to become the first local sprinter to break 10 seconds this year.

Harbor High's Don Green gave the Santa Cruz area a one, two finish in the race when he nosed out Sam Perkins of

Robert Louis Stevenson and Pearly Pearson of Seaside for second place. All three runners had 10.1 clockings.

The top three finishers in all events in both varsity and frosh soph competition advance to the Central Coast Section meet at Foothill College Saturday. The state meet is the following week at the University of California Berkeley track.

Head also qualified for the 220 with a third place, running the half-lap race in 22.3.

Ron Staub, another Santa

Cruz High performer, won the frosh soph discus with a heave of 145 feet, five inches. Bob Burns of Holy Cross was third in the event, throwing the platter 132-2½.

Soquel's Mark McConnell made it a little closer this week, but still fell in the varsity two mile event to Ed Silva of Watsonville. McConnell finished two and eight-tenths of a second behind Silva with a time of 9:44.8. John Kinsella, Soquel's frosh-soph two miler also had a second in 10:08.8.

Roy Hooten leaped to a second place in the varsity high jump for Harbor, clearing the bar at an even six feet. Pirate frosh-soph pole vaulter Gary Ryan took a second at 10-6.

Wayne Fravel moves to the sectional after his third place in the low hurdles race for Harbor. The lanky junior covered the 180 yards worth of obstacles in 20.4.

Carl Magagnose continued to give Soquel strength in the distance events with a third in the varsity mile at 4:41.6. Eloy Villa

had a third in the frosh-soph mile for the Cardinals while Jack Reime was fourth for Holy Cross.

Alisal nosed out Carmel, 40-37, for the varsity title while Salinas High's powerful frosh-soph team romped with 33 points. Watsonville was a distant second with 37.

Soquel's Tony Fontes took a third in the varsity shot put with a toss of 50 feet, eight inches. Mac McCreedy won the event, missing 55 feet by only a half an inch.
