state meet.

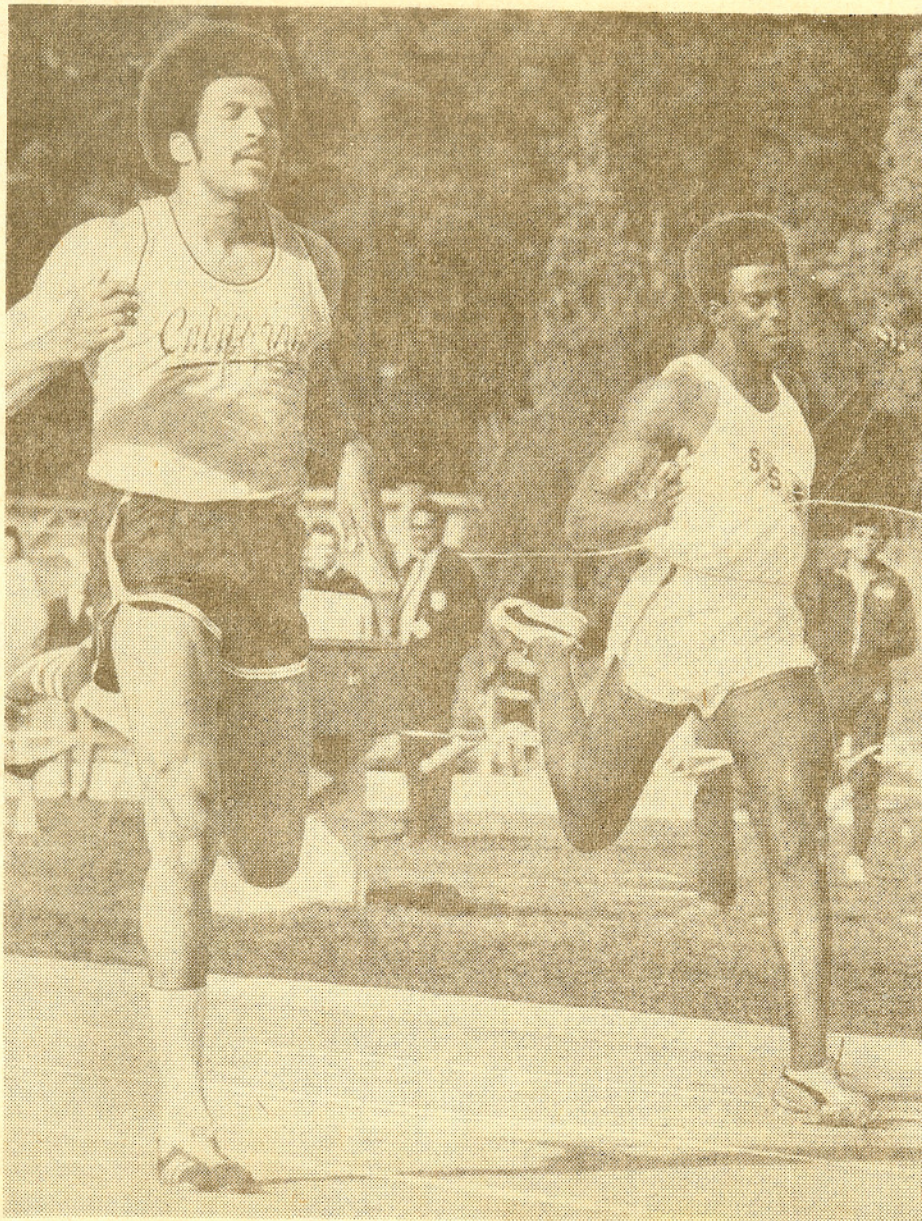

OUTDOOR SEASON BEGINS, BEARS HOST ATHENS & SACRAMENTO STATE THIS SATURDAY

THE MEET: California's one-time defending national collegiate championship track and field team, will host the strong Athens Track Club and Sacramento State's defending Far West Conference champions in a triangular meet this Saturday in Edwards Stadium.

Field events will start at 1:15 pm, and the first running event will begin at 2 pm.

THE BEARS: Bear coach Dave Maggard expects to have an improved team this year as the Bears return virtually all the men who scored in both the Pacific-8 and NCAA championship meets. Most notable non-returnees are high jumper Clarence Johnson, hurdler Bob McLennan, sprinter Don Couser, and distance runner Bob Waldon.

Cal's strength again will be in the sprints where the trio of Eddie Hart (9.2, 20.5), Isaac Curtis (9.3, 20.8) and Dave Masters (9.5, 20.6) make for great strength. Jim Fraser (25- $\frac{1}{2}$) and Steve Rogaway (24-9 $\frac{3}{4}$) in the long jump, and Fraser (51-1 $\frac{3}{4}$) and Rich Dunn (50-11 $\frac{1}{4}$) in the triple jump are solid. UC record holders Bruce Kennedy (249-10) in the javelin, and Jim Penrose (184-8) in the discus, miler Cliff West (4:04.4), half-miler John Drew (1:49.5), hurdlers Roddy Lee (14.2, 52.3) and Kerry Hampton (14.2), quartermilers Ed Bonner (47.6) and Vince Ansley (47.7) also are all solid competitors with proven successes.

Newcomers will add considerably to this team. Foremost is three time state prep champion Rick Brown (440-880-mile relay), and his Los Altos teammates, Chris Adams, two-time state prep discus champion and the national prep record holder, and quartermile Jim Andrew.

Three new men will handle Cal's high jumping, and this could turn into a strength event for the Bears. Australian freshman Mal MacFarlane, a 19-year old, has a 6-9 prep best. He is joined by freshman Greg Redmond (6-8 $\frac{1}{2}$) and JC transfer Dave Fishbaugh (6-8).

Also, among the newcomers will be hurdler Boss Brosius (14.3, 53.4) from Antelope Valley Junior College, long jumper Julian Lucas, a freshman from Palo Alto, and J.D. Smith, a sprinter from Taft JC by way of Lake Charles, La., who will lead-off the 440 relay team.

ATHENS: Two Cal record holders and a near Bear record holder lead this team. High jumper Clarence Johnson (7-3 $\frac{1}{2}$), and pole vaulter Greg Miguel (16-6 $\frac{1}{2}$) are the Cal record holders, and Stan Royster in the long jump is the second longest Bear jumper in history. Royster recently placed second in the National AAU championships with a 25-9 jump.

Also on the Athens roster are such stars as: 60-foot shot putters Lahcen Samsam, the Moroccan from Oregon State, and former San Jose State star Rich Marks; former NCAA discus record holder Dave Weill (Stanford) and past NCAA discus champion Larry Kennedy (New Mexico), and 200-foot discus thrower John Powell; 26-foot long jumper Marion Anderson (San Jose State), former Oregon javelin star John Burns, past Kansas sprint ace Mickey Mathews (9.3, 20.8), and hurdlers Larry Livers (13.7, Villanova) and Tom Bonin (13.8, BYU).

RECORDS: Few meet records appear safe. All are in jeopardy except Bob Price's 9:09.1 steeplechase, and perhaps his 8:52.6 two mile, and Bruce Wilhelm's 62- $\frac{1}{4}$ shot put mark.

INELIGIBLES: For the first two meets shot putter Rolin Luka and hurdler Kerry Hampton will be participating unattached. Both are ineligible until the start of the next quarter due to incomplete units.

MATCH-UPS: Good competition should occur in the sprints: Hart-Curtis-Masters-Ligons-Mathews; in the long jump: Royster-Anderson-Fraser-Rogaway; in the triple jump: Fraser-Dunn-Silvester Johnson (49-plus) and Lincoln Jackson (51-8); in the discus: Penrose-Adams-Kennedy-Powell-Weill; hurdles: Livers-Bonin-Lee-Hampton-Brosius-McCormick-Ellis; javelin: Burns-Kennedy;
