HEAD COACH DAVE MAGGARD

In his second season as Cal's fourth head track coach, Maggard has given himself a difficult act to follow.

His team won the NCAA championship in his rookie year as head coach. An Olympic shot putter in 1968, and still the UC shot record holder, Maggard served one season (1969) as assistant coach to Sam Bell after three outstanding years at Los Altos High School (1966-68) and one year at Sunset HS (1965).

Maggard received his AB in PE from Cal in 1962, after coming to Berkeley from Modesto JC and Turlock HS. He earned one football letter as well as three track awards at Cal.

Personable, direct and intelligent, Maggard appears to have many of the great qualities of his Californis coach, the late Brutus Hamilton. Born 1-12-40 Maggard and his wife, the former Carolyn Johnson, have two sons, David, Jr., 7, and Darin, 4.

ASSISTANT COACH CHARLIE CRAIG

One of America's greatest triple jumpers, this Fresno State graduate is in his third season as Cal's assistant coach. He came to Cal from Fowler HS where his teams won three straight league championships.

Craig won the 1964 NCAA and 1967 NAAU triple jump crowns. He has a lifetime best of 53-9. With a degree in Education, Craig is an enthusiastic and dedicated coach who also takes a direct and intelligent approach to his teaching. Now 28, Craig is married to the former Mary Norman and has a two year old daughter Renee.

AL RAGAN will again serve in an assistant capacity, marking the 41st year he has aided the Cal track program.

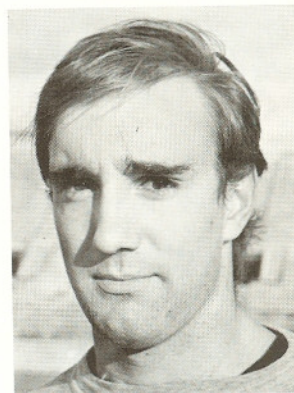

CHRIS ADAMS, weights-decathlon, freshman ... national high school discus record holder (201-3), two time California state prep champion and Golden West champ in this event for Los Altos HS...has done 169-0 with international weight discus, 4th best ever by a prep, and 51-1 with 16# shot...has practice throws beyond 200' with the javelin and has a 9.8 100 to his credit...Civil Engineering major..born 1-26-52 in Palo Alto.



EUGENIO AMAYA, mile - two mile, sophomore...injured much of last year...second in state mile and fifth in Golden West as a Burlingame HS senior...lifetime bests of 4:11.1 and 9:11.0...born (2-26-51) and raised in Santiago, Chile ... placed third against Southern Cal and San Jose State last year ... Psychology major with a 2.4 gpa.



JIM ANDREW, 440, freshman ... placed fourth in state prep championships and ran on title winning mile relay team for Los Altos HS ...47.8 best last year and a 21.8 in the 220 ... born 12-30-51 in Seattle, Wash...undecided as to major, 2.9 gpa for the Fall quarter.

VINCE ANSLEY, 440, senior... fifth in the PAC-8 championships last year, and anchored the Cal mile relay team to fifth place... best of 47.7 open and 46.9 relay ...anchored mile relay team to victory against SC, Oregon, UCLA and Stanford...scored 30¾ dual meet points and improved nearly one and one-half seconds last year...football team candidate...Biological Science major with a 3.2 gpa...plans on Med School after graduation ... born 11-1-49 in San Francisco.

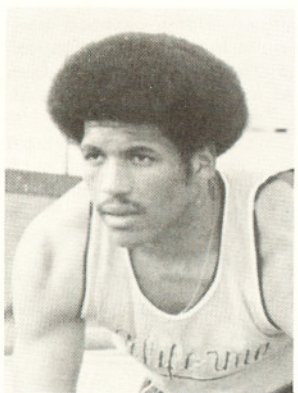


ED BONNER, 440, sophomore...best of 47.6 last year as a freshman after placing fourth in the state prep title meet in 1969...won against Stanford last year, and placed second against San Jose State, SC, Oregon and UCLA...fourth leading dual meet scorer with 46 $\frac{3}{4}$ points...ran sixth in the PAC-8 championships...nicknamed the "Bald Eagle"...twice North Section CIF prep champion...has a 21.4 220 best...Criminology major with a 2.7 gpa...born 6-5-51 in Nevada City.

RICK BROWN, 440-880, freshman...first man to ever win the 440 and 880 in a single California state high school championship meet...he made this all the more astounding by anchoring coach Leo Long's Los Altos mile relay team to victory as well...prep "Track Athlete of 1970" by T&FN...in the state title meet he ran and won four quartermile races and two half-mile races...his best of 47.1 (24 minutes after a 1:50.7), 1:50.6 and 46.5 relay all came when he was "tripling"...participated in the Olympic Development train-



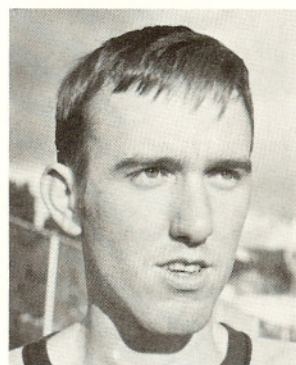
times (twice to teammate Hart) in nine races...rushed for over 400 yards in football...former state prep meet hurdler for Santa Ana HS where he was the southern CIF 180 LH champion as a junior...near 3.0 gpa, undecided as to major...born 10-20-50 in Santa Ana.

ISAAC CURTIS, 100-220, sophomore...placed second in both the Pacific-8 and NCAA 100 yard dashes, fourth in the NCAA 220 and ran second leg on Cal's championship quartermile relay team in both title meets...a four event All-American this past year...America's 7th ranked 100 man according to T&FN...tied the UC and broke the Edwards Stadium 100 record in his very first race this past year...his 9.3 and 20.8 are tied for 1st and 3rd on Cal's all-time lists...never ran worst than second in any 100 race, losing only three

JOHN DREW, 880-mile, junior...sophomore class record holder via his 1:49.6 last year in placing 5th in the PAC-8 meet...won duals vs. SC, Oregon and UCLA...scored 32 dual meet points in 880...ran 3rd in his heat in the NCAA meet, but was disqualified...national high school freshman 880 record holder (1:56.5) and world 15 year old mile record holder (4:15.7)...Texas state mile champion in 1967 and state 880 champion in 1968 for Spring Branch Memorial...Golden West champion in 1968 in 1:49.5...Philosophy major...born 12-7-49 in Houston, Texas.

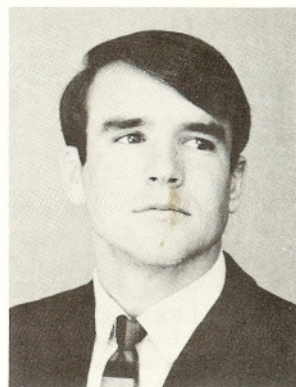

EDWARDS STADIUM

Finished in 1932, and at the time the only purely "Track" Stadium in the World, Edwards Stadium has been the site of seven National Collegiate Championship Meets, one National AAU Championship Meet, All-American Invitational in 1966, and the 1932 IC4A Meet, the only time this meet had been held away from the East.

This Stadium is named after Col. George C. Edwards, as is the field adjoining it to the East.

In 1957 the oval itself was dedicated in the name of Walter Christie, California's first track coach, 1900-32, and in the early sixties "the friends of California track," raised funds to build the Walter Christie bench which stands just outside the running track on the West side of the infield.

With funds that remained after the bench was built the electric clock that stands atop the scoreboard to the North was purchased.

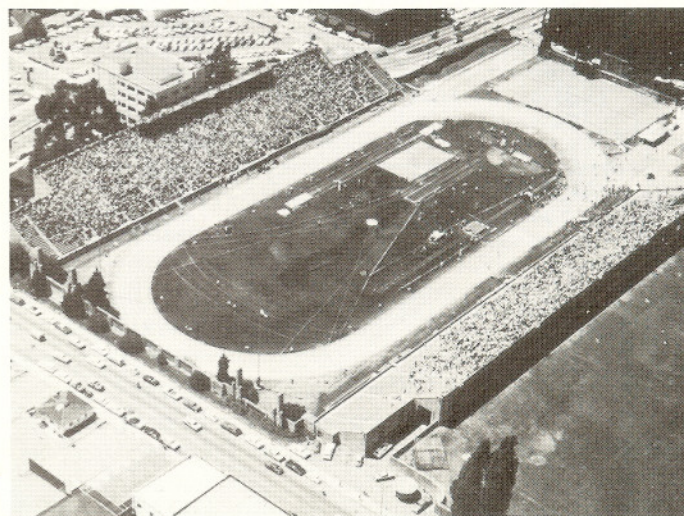
The track in the 22,000 seat Stadium was completely redone in 1965 and is a composite of Fresno clay and cinders and is reddish in color.

Nine world records have been set in this Stadium, including Cornelius Warmerdam's historic first 15-foot vault, April 13, 1940.

The last world record set in this Stadium was Jim Ryun's fabulous 3:51.3 mile in 1966.
