OWCZARZAK WINS THIRD STRAIGHT MVAAU 15 KILO RUN HICKMAN TRACK JULY LT:

Carl Owczarzak has had, for the last 3 years, things well under control in all of our MVAAU distance runs, most of which have been held in summ heat and humidity. This race was no exception. The 30 year old KC Kans. school-teacher won, only 36 secs. off the record he set last year a cooler day. But he probably got his strongest challenge to date—this time from Kerry Hogan, M.U.'s excellent distance-runner. The top 6 runners were pretty much together for the first mile, but in lap 5 some shaking out œurred, with Hogan taking over the pace-setting. Hogan gradually built pa a lead up to 13 secs. over Owczarzak during the middle two laps of the third mile. Carl began cutting the margin, finally catching Hogan at the end of mile 4. The two ran together for laps, Hogan leading. In lap 22 Kerry ran into trouble with his stomach (the heat) and had to stop for 20 secs. or so. He started running again but had to stop once more in the next lap, this time for some 80 secs. During this stop Elzy Miller slipped by so that when Hogan got going again he was running third—I don't think it was realized that Miller was now in second, therefore, Hogan didn't really go after him—he might have caught the Ozark runner had he known all this for he did run strong ly over the last two miles—but, then, so did Mr. Miller.
