Scots Host Top NorCal Spikers

"Rain or shine, the meet will go on," promised Scot coach Loren Lansberry with an eye to weather possibilities for tomorrow's ninth annual Carlmont High Track and Field Invitational

Lansberry has gathered six of the better prep spike teams in the Bay Area, including his host Scots, for the all-relays classic which will be held at College of San Mateo's allweather track because of the

Field event relays will begin at 9 a.m. and running events an hour later in the invitational, which should finish around noon.

Defending state champion Los Altos, Cupertino, Pittsburg, El Cerrito and Berkeley will join the Scots in an impressive display of Northern California team talent.

Fourteen events, including all six field events, will be

contested by teams of four men from each school.

"It looks like a real close

race for the team title," said Lansberry. "Cupertino's strong, but it's bard to tell this vear.

As usual, the Scots will be strongest in the distance relays and possibly favored in the eight-mile relay led by senior Hans Templeman and sophomore Steve Miller.

Carlmont also has a good shot at the pole vault relay championship with Chris Willett and Paul Dempster leading the way.

Only other SPAL spike squad in action Saturday will be Gunn at the Buchser Relays in Santa Clara, while Menlo School hosts a six-way dual meet.

Carlmont Cindermen Win Four at CSM

Carlmont High won the most events, but didn't have enough depth to bid for the title and settled for fourth place in the ninth annual Carlmont Track and Field Invitational Saturday at College of San Mateo.

El Cerrito couldn't match Carlmont's four victories, but had more of the important seconds and thirds in the 14event, all-relay meet to take its fifth team title with 591/2 points.

Defending champ Berkeley, which has won three Carlmont crowns, was second with 521/2 points, defending state champ Los Altos third with 51, while Carlmont (42), Cupertino (34) and Pittsburg (24) trailed. In contrast to last year's meet, when Los Altos' Chris

Adams set a state discus record and there were numerous other top individual efforts, this year's competition was highlighted by the closeness of team competition.

Splits of 1:58.0 in the 880 by Hans Templeman, 4:19 in the mile by sophomore Steve Miller and 9:58 in the two-mile by Russ Black paced Carlmont triumphs in the two, four and eight-mile relays, respective-

Miller's effort he!ped the Scots set the only meet record with a 18:07.8 four-mile clocking. El Cerrito tied another mark with a 42.4 clocking in the 440 relay.

Soph Jack Lennen had a life best 13-0 and teammates Chris Willett and Paul Dempster matched that mark to lift the Scots to victory in the pole vault relay.
