A real surprise was San Francisco State's Pettus who finished fifth in the 220 with a 21.0 clocking. In the three mile, Stanford's Don Kardong ran a heat-winning 13:39.0 in the trials on Thursday, but went unplaced in 13:48.8 in the finals (eighth). Two San Jose State pole vaulters did exceptionally well. Bob Richards Jr. went 16-6 for fourth, as did Vic Dias in fifth. George Carty of San Jose State got up for third in the highs with a good 13.8. UCLA came through with big points in the pole vault and mile relay to overcome USC's lead and win by a good margin, 52-41. Oregon was third with 38 and BYU had 35.
