Seaside Rolls To First In MBL Track

A pair of Monterey Bay League records were shattered at the league finals Saturday at Cabrillo College but the new marks were overshadowed by the team performance displayed by the Seaside Spartans.

Seaside High was the odds on favorite coming into the meet on Saturday and the Spartans lived up to their expectations

by scoring 78 points, ahead of 20, Aptos 19, Salinas 14 and Harbor nabbing two points. There just wasn't any substitute for the speed of Seaside that the other nine teams in the league could overcome. For example, speed demon Ronnie Harris captured both sprints plus leaping to a first place in the long jump.

It was also a banner day for the Seaside lightweights as well as the varsity by gaining the team trophy with 60 points. Watsonville was second with 52, Monterey 51, Alisal 32, North Salinas 30, Santa Cruz 23, Soquel

and Green of Harbor battled it out until Thompson was awarded the championship on fewest misses. The old standard was 6-2 set by Steve Johnson of Watsonville in 1968.

Thompson and Green each cleared 6-2½ but both failed at 6-3 on three attempts.

Seaside came fully prepared to tackle the onslaught of the rest of the MBL entries. In Wednesday's meet, the Spartans qualified 23 in the league preliminaries.

Although Harris was the big point getter, the rest of the Spartans ran off with five seconds, three thirds, two fourths and three fifth places to gain the overall team championship.

It seemed, as the meet got underway, that Seaside would have a tough time of it after Monterey won the 440 yard relay with a league tying performance of 43.2. Seaside was second in 43.4.

But, top performances by many of the league qualifiers failed to materialize during the remaining events and Seaside easily won the title.

Salinas' Bob Washington, despite having a sore groin, won both the 180 yard low and 120 yard high hurdles. His injury in the meet Wednesday slowed him down a hair but he finished ahead of the field with times of 19.8 and 15.2.

Harbor's Wayne Fravel was far out of the money in the high hurdles but came back to

establish a new Pirate record in the lows with a 20.1 effort. His time was good for second place.

In the weight events, Lance Russell of Soquel got off a heave of 157-2¼ in the discus for his best of the season to capture first place. Andy Bokariza of Watsonville was third, Santa Cruz' Ron Staub fourth, while Soquel's Tom Bahr was fifth.

Watsonville's reliable Joe Cervantes, with a toss of 52-7½, won the shot put outdistancing Tony Fontes of Soquel. Bahr was third and Russell fifth.

Pole vaulter Steve Ardiarz from Watsonville had no real competition and missed at three attempts with the bar setting at the 13-6 mark. He won handily, clearing 13-0, while Harbor's Gary Ryan went 11-6 along with Soquel's Tom Sutton and Ed Reumann of Watsonville.

Ed Noyes, miler from Soquel, outlegged Juan Garcia and Darrell Fitzgerald in the mile and won easily with a 4:23.5.

Santa Cruz' Eloy Villa and Aptos' Dan Gruber along with Dennis Carruth of Soquel sparked the local lightweight entries. Villa nabbed the 440 in 52.7 and came back later to finish second in the mile with a 4:47.5 clocking.

Gruber, with not much real competition, easily captured the mile in 4:38.2 while Carruth, running his personal best, ran to the two mile championship in 16:17.3.

David Nakamoto of Watsonville was first in the long jump (19-¾) while Lee Rudnick of Soquel won the discus, heaving the platter 129-5. Frank Martinez, with a leap of 44-9½, won the shot put for Watsonville.

Seaside held a slim edge over Monterey and Watsonville with just the triple jump to be completed. Tim McDaniels, winner of the 220, travelled 42-4 for first place to secure the title.

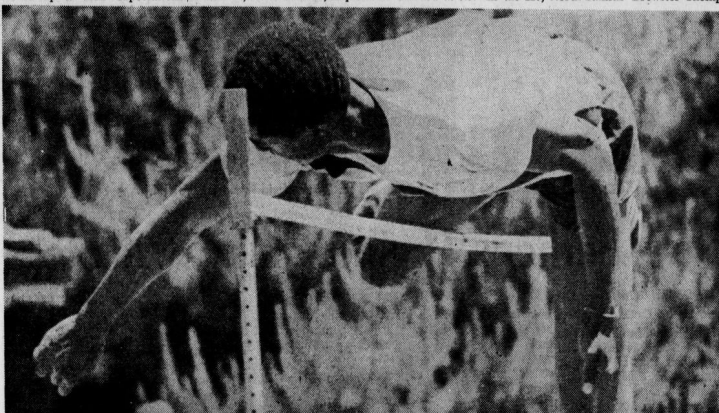
Five of the place winners from each event will now move to the Central Coast Section Region IV finals slated for Saturday, May 22, at 10 a.m. on the Alisal High oval.

From the Region IV finals, the winners will advance to the CCS finals tabbed for San Jose City's all weather track on May 28.

Soquel coaches Mel Fishburn and Ken Thomas had nothing but praise for their runnerup Knights, who Thomas said did all that the coaching staff expected.

"We're not in any where disappointed with the performances," said Thomas.

He indicated that if some other teams' individuals had done better the Knights would have been closer.



Harbor High's Don Green goes over the high jump bar at 6-2½ during Saturday's

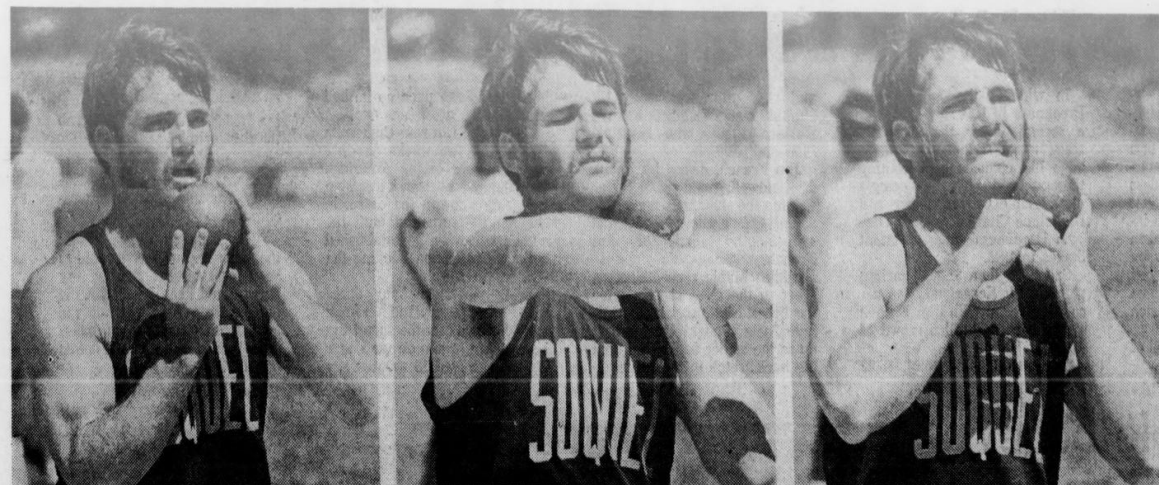
