## M-A, alums tie in track meet

Menlo-Atherton High School and an alumni team battled to a 68-68 tie in a track meet at M-A Friday afternoon.

John Stone of M-A was the only double winner in the meet. He took the shot put with a throw of 42-7 and the discus at 144-4.

Top performers for the alums were Gary Dilley with a six-foot-high jump and Rick Diederichsen at 12-6 in the pole vault.

## M-A Coach Beats Pupil

Rick Diederichsen, current Menlo-Atherton High pole vault coach and the school record holder for that event, leaped 12-6 on his last effort Friday to beat his star pupil and give the Bear track alumni a 68-68 tie with the current varsity at M-A.

Diederichsen's effort beat Jeff Jennings, who went 12-0, but Jennings will have the opportunity for revenge if he can beat Diederichsen's 13-0½ school record mark sometime this season. Diederichsen, a 1969 M-A graduate, will be coaching Jennings this year.

In other meet highlights, Bear coach Plato Yanicks found a sprinter when he put Jennings in the 100 against three members of the Bear track Hall of Fame — Ken Murphy, Lawrence Kirkman and Conrad Everhardt — and Jennings beat them all with a 10.5 clocking.

M-A alumni Mike Rountree and current varsity runner John Barbour tied in the two-mile, while John Stone of the varsity was the only double winner, taking the shot and discus.

# Cats, Scots Bears Win In Track

Woodside, Carlmont and Menlo-Atherton high schools all began their track seasons with typically slow nonleague meets yesterday — but each team recorded a hope-inducing victory.

Though most times weren't outstanding in any of the meets, several good performers were uncovered as all three squads showed much more depth than their opposition.

Woodside, one of this year's top contenders after taking the crown last season, walloped St. Francis 89-47 on the strength of Rich Jones' quadruple victory (both hurdles, long jump and 440 relay) and Paul Mullett's double win in the sprints.

Carlmont's Steve Miller, only a sophomore, turned in a fine 4:25.1 mile and Mike Hall notched a promising 45-4 triple jump in the Scots' 85-50 victory over San Mateo.

And M-A discovered a potential star, in experienced Jeff Jennings, who scored 17 points with a 10.3 clocking in the 100, victory in the pole vault, third place in a first-ever attempt at the low hurdles, and anchor leg on the winning 440 relay team as the Bears (72) outpointed El Camino (58) and Serra (41).

# Scot, Wildcat Tracksters Fall

Defending state high school track champion Los Altos may not have the many stars of last year's season, but is still had enough to down Carlmont 77-54 in a nonleague meet on the Scots' oval yesterday.

And one of Northern California's biggest prep stars this season, Crestmoor's Chuck Bommarito, paced his team to an 82-54 victory over host Woodside by accounting for 20 points alone.

The losses evened the Scots' and Wildcats' nonleague records at 1-1.

Bommarito turned in a 10.0 and 22.8 clockings in the 100 and 220, won the discus, and anchored the winning 440 relay team for Crestmoor against Woodside, which received a double win from Rich Jones in the hurdles and a 51.9 in the 440 by Dave Legg.

Carlmont's top marks were in the 100 (Greg Fobbs' 10.2, fastest at Carlmont since 1966), the mile (Steve Miller's 4:32.9) and two-mile (Hans Templeman's 9:38.0), but the Scots won only six of 16 events.

For want of an extra two-miler or pole vaulter Sequoia High had to settle for a tie, while San Carlos used its depth to win big in nonleague track and field openers yesterday afternoon.

The Cherokees netted a 67-67 tie with host Burlingame led by quadruple winner Cezar Oravillo, and the Dons whipped St. Francis 95-41 paced by double victors Tom Douglas and Matt Langley.

Oravillo posted the local season's best hurdles clockings with 15.2 in the 120 highs and 19.9 in the 180 lows, leaped a promising 6-2 in the high jump and also anchored Sequoia's victorious 440 relay team.

Cherokee Mike Hughes also came through with a solid first meet showing with a 22-1 long jump and 47-17/8 triple jump.

However, Sequoia and Burlingame entered only one man each in both the pole vault and the 6-mile, costing both a chance at the victory.

Douglas, who finished the wrestling season for San Carlos with a third in the Northern California Invitational only Saturday, won the shot and discus with throws of 49-5/4 and 146-9, respectively.

Don coach Jim Luttrell also was happy with Langley's 15.5 high hurdles clocking, miler Dave Trine, Jim Scherba's life 880 best, soph Jeff Vetrovec's life best 48-0 shot put and Jeff McNesby, who won four events in the freshman competition.

Gunn High impressed more than just San Carlos with its 73-63 victory over the Dons Thursday in the second round of the SPAL track and field dual meet season.
