# Shavers Zips To 9.5, 21.0

# PA Swim Triple for Palstra

# Evans' Big Day Beats DeLaSalle

Mike Shavers of Albany set one 1972 Eastbay record, tied another and was named the outstanding performer for running events at the eighth annual Castro Valley Invitational track and field meet last night.

Shavers sped to a 9.5 in the 100, his third this year, and turned in a 21-flat in the 220. Both times were new meet records and his clocking in the 220 is only a 10th of a second off the all-time Eastbay record held by Jim Hines and Dave Masters.

Castro Valley's Bill Andrews was named the outstanding field performer after winning the pole vault at 14 feet, another meet record. The mark equals Andrews' best this year.

Tom Cochee of Tech was the only other double winner besides Shavers, leaping 22-2/4 in the long jump and coming back with a 46-11/4 triple jump. Cochee's triple jump better the old mark of 45-6 1/2 which he set last year.

Sophomore Lynn Ryan of Irvington and San Lorenzo junior Ted Quintana set Class B records in the 880 and 1 mile of 1:57.5 and 4:25.5.

Stanley Harris, a McClymonds junior, surprised with a 1:56.2 in the 880 while Dave Bush of Campbell tied a meet record with a high jump of 6-8.
