

Murphy Wins SPAL Track Decathlon

Marion Murphy of Sequoia High has more than just speed going for him.

Surprising prowess in the weights, jumps and distance running helped give the junior Tribe speedster the SPAL decathlon championship yesterday at Woodside.

Murphy's 4,611 point total topped Menlo-Atherton senior Jim Watts (4,117), though both trackmen bettered the winning mark of 4,113 points in last year's first decathlon.

Murphy, who ran and hurdled well as usual, also tossed the shot 40-6/8 and flipped the discus 111-6, not bad marks for a beginner at those events.

San Carlos' Bruce Veal (4,075), Palo Alto's Doug Peck (3,819), Sequoia's Mark Daniel (3,630) and Woodside's Jim Orr (3,049) trailed in varsity competition.

M-A's Carl Johnk won the fresh-soph decathlon with 3,419 points, followed by teammates Mike Simpson (3,275) and Maurice Galvez (2,876). San Carlos' Ray Nolan (2,749), Sequoia freshman Bob Mills (2,464) and Kelly Lawson of San Carlos (1,800).

Lawson was injured in the pole vault and missed three events, depriving him a chance for a potential fresh-soph second.

Four spikers crack five all-time marks

Records are made to be broken, the saying goes, and four Eastbay athletes accepted the challenge during the high school track and field season.

Led by State half mile champion Dale Scott of El Cerrito, who accounted for a pair, five new all-time Eastbay standards were set during the 1972 campaign which climaxed with the California Interscholastic Federation meet last weekend.

Joining Scott as the area's best-ever prep competitors were Anthony Lawson, the 440 standout from Pittsburg; Washington's sub-nine minute two-miler Bobby Grubbs and triple jumper Tom Cochee of Tech.

Progressing from his 1:52-flat runnerup time in last year's State Meet to an Eastbay record-tying 1:50.9 in the Alameda County Athletic League championships, Scott emerged as the fastest 880 runner ever from the 60-odd local schools with his 1:49.7 in Oroville.

A little over a month earlier, leading off the distance medley at the El Cerrito Relays, he shattered the mile standard with a 4:12.4. Three watches recorded the time, and precautions were taken to make sure he ran the full distance before handing off the baton.

Lawson, whose previous best was 48.2, first recorded a new Eastbay quarter-mile low of 47.4 at the Woodland Invitational in May and then equaled it in the State Meet trials last Friday. He was the first area runner in five years to get under 48 seconds.

Starting in March, Grubbs moved up the two-mile rankings each month. He opened with a 9:09.3 in the Hill Invitational, came back in 9:06.4 at the Sacramento Invitational, got down to nine minutes in the Division One meet and finally to the 8:56.1 capper in the State test.



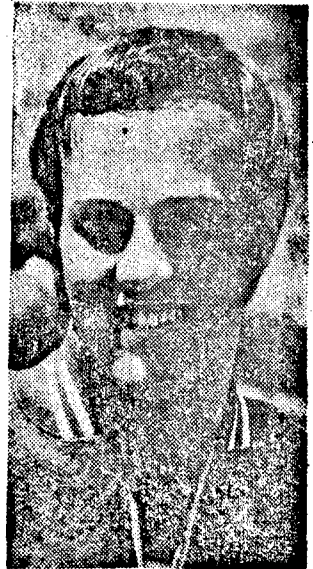

It is unfortunate the triple jump will not be included in the State Meet until next year, because Cochee has been a standout for two seasons. He won the Kennedy High Relays with a windy 49-footer last year, went 48-6 in March this year and then 50-11/4 at the Downey Games in April.

All the record-setters are seniors, as is Concord triple jumper Greg Hay, who also surpassed the former Eastbay mark by going 48-5 1/2.

Expected to return next season and take a crack at Cochee's record in the relatively new event are three juniors who made the top 10.

While Scott's records may eventually fall, no one can ever take away his state championship nor that of 220 winner Mike Shavers of Albany, another 11th-grader who will bear watching in 1973. He ranks third and fourth on the all-time sprint lists.

Other undergraduates who should be back are DeAnza distance runner Tom Burrough, discus thrower Doug Osterstetter of Marina and Pittsburg junior Brian Shaw, who has matched the high jump cutoff mark of 6-3.
