Watts Wins Record M-A Decathlon

Jim Watts, Menlo-Atherton High's finest all-around athlete at 6-6, also proved he was the top all-around trackman in recent Bear history yesterday when Watts won the eighth annual M-A decathlon with a record 5,191 points.

Watts' total surpassed John Swinford's 5,158, and Watts didn't even participate in the

mile run.

It was Watts' fourth school record in track. He had already set marks for the high hurdles (14.7), triple jump (45-1) and dual meet points (108).

Watts' top individual effort was a 21-10½ long jump, an event he hardly participated in as M-A's top hurdler-high jumper during the regular season.

Sophomore Mike Simpson was second with 4,072 points, followed by senior John Stone (3,960), senior Jim Hudson (3,480) and freshman Maurice Galvez (3,169) in a 17-man field. Simpson and Galvez set class records.
